VICE CHANCELLOR'S Clobal Vision



Emeritus Professor Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim

en Institut Teknologi MARA (now UiTM) was conferred university status in 1999, it was expected to conduct world-class research and engage internationally with foreign universities. As a newly appointed Vice-Chancellor of UiTM in 2019, I have set my sights on providing the largest university in Malaysia with a vibrant global outlook. The term "Global Outlook" is strongly linked to the idea of a highly interconnected global community. Students in the 21st Century need to develop these global skills of leadership, teamwork, networking, and communication, among others, in order to stay ahead of the game. To achieve this, universities must help their students to develop the knowledge, skills and values that will enhance their global outlook. It is the objective of UiTM to do this with their students.

Having pursued my bachelors and post-graduate education in the United Kingdom, it is my view that Malaysians who studied abroad have two positive qualities — resourcefulness and the ability to adapt. In order to give the UiTM community an international experience and outlook, I, together with the Academic Department, have initiated the student and staff mobility programmes. For the students, this is carried out under the "one student, one passport" initiative. For the staff, it is through securing internship and attachment opportunities abroad.

In the first 100 days of my tenure as the VC of UiTM, the university has approved 54 MoUs and 13 MoAs with several educational institutions and industries, local and abroad. Among its partners are University of Texas, USA, Nottingham Trent University, UK, University Grants Commission, Bangladesh, and Universitas Lambung Mangkurat, Indonesia. UiTM became the first public university to partner with Al Jazeera Media Network to improve its education in journalism, communications and media when we signed a Letter of Intent (LoI) on July 9, 2019 in Doha, Qatar.

This collaboration is subsequent to the visit of the Minister of Education, Dr Maszlee Malik, to Al Jazeera in April 2019. On July 12, 2019, UiTM also signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Herbert Smith Freehills, a leading global law firm with 27 offices internationally to provide the students of the Faculty of Law some exposure in international and cross-border legal practice. UiTM signed a strategic partnership with Islamic Relief Malaysia on July, 19 2019 for students' enhancement. Other industries such as Petronas, BSN, Malaysia Automotive, Robotic and IoT Institute (MARii) have also become partners of UiTM.

It is my view that the number of UiTM graduates currently working abroad is too low, less than one percent of the 50,000 graduates UiTM produces annually (Bernama, 2019). UiTM has set a target of five percent of its graduates getting jobs in ASEAN countries through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) inked June, 22 2019 with the ASEAN Chamber of Commerce. I am hopeful that the number of UiTM graduates working overseas will increase with this initiative. To further illustrate the initiative, two well-known entrepreneurs have been appointed as members of the UiTM Board of Directors. They are Datin Vivy Yusof, the founder of FashionValet, and Datuk Kamarudin Meranun, the Chairman of Air Asia and CEO of the Tune Group. These two appointments were made to inspire UiTM students and graduates to emulate these entrepreneurial individuals and explore new business opportunities globally.

My ambition is to transform UiTM into an internationally renowned university, and one of the best in Asia. Currently, we are at 137 in the 2019 edition of the QS University Rankings: Asia. Within the next three years, I would like to see UiTM breaking into the top 100. To transform UiTM into a high-performing university requires high-performing leaders, staff and students. I have, and will be meeting with lecturers, administrative staff, and students to convey this mission and vision.

I would also like to highlight that the four attributes of a highly successful academician that resonates with the theme of "contributing to society" include teaching excellence, strong research track record with impactful outcomes, international collaboration with industry and government agencies, and most importantly, strong leadership skills. The mission and vision to transform UiTM academicians must merge with administrative staffs' development, in which all are expected to be professional and work with integrity to provide efficient and high-quality services. Hence, the conferment of an honorary doctorate to His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah, in recognition of his leadership contribution to the Islamic World, should be looked upon by the UiTM community as a prime example of great leadership.

The leadership style that I have adopted and adapted focuses on EATMI - engage, align, teamwork, motivate, and inspire. It focuses on elements of training, coaching, and grooming. Hence, in the Varsity's Blueprint for 2019 and beyond, to be unveiled in December 2019, I wish to stress on these fundamental dimensions. The main areas that the new blueprint will center on raising UiTM's global profile through impactful contributions to society; increasing partnerships with industries, local authorities, state agencies, and top international universities; having more engagement with alumni; and adopting new ways of teaching. I strongly feel that UiTM needs new approaches in the digital age. No more just "chalk and talk." Beginning in April 2019, UiTM lecturers were up-skilled to adopt problem-solving and peer learning approaches.

When it comes to the students, with English as the global lingua franca, I believe that graduates from UiTM rate high on the employability scale because of their strong command of the language. The confidence embedded within the graduates have enabled them to find jobs quite successfully, even in the private sector. It is not just the good command of the language that is crucial, but it is also how you present yourself, your confidence, and ability to highlight your strengths. To this end, it is my aspiration to continue to insist that English remains the language of instruction and communication amongst the UiTM populace. This will, indeed, give our students an edge over other graduates. We are trying to strengthen these aspects by scaling up our students' mobility through programmes by exposing them to areas that are in demand by industry, namely, their organisational, leadership, and management skills.

In the recent Reader's Digest Trusted Brand 2019, UiTM was awarded the Gold Award in the Public University category which reflects the trust of the consumers to the university and the recognition of its graduates. As for global visibility, I hope UiTM can expand abroad. I wish UiTM can be an exporter of transnational education such as forming branch campuses overseas, franchising our niche programmes, and conducting twinning programmes with our partners.

Lastly, on a personal note, I would like to thank the Minister of Education for having the faith and confidence in me to lead this illustrious institution.

Tuanku Chancellor's Proclamation Ceremony

is Majesty the Yang di-Pertuan Agong Al-Sultan Abdullah Ri'ayatuddin Al-Mustafa Billah Shah Ibni Sultan Haji Ahmad Shah Al-Musta'in Billah, the 16th Yang di-Pertuan Agong of Malaysia, was proclaimed Tuanku Canselor of UiTM in a glorious ceremony at the Dewan Agung Tuanku Canselor, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) Shah Alam on March 19, 2019.

The proclamation ceremony was performed by YB Dr. Maszlee Malik, the Minister of Education, Malaysia. The Minister, while reading the letter of appointment, informs the audience that Section 19A (2) of the Universiti Teknologi MARA Act 1976 (Act 173) stipulated that the Chancellor of the institution is the Yang di-Pertuan Agong. In accordance with the provisions of Section 19A (1) of the Act, the Yang di-Pertuan Agong shall preside over the university convocation. The 90th UiTM Convocation Ceremony commenced on Saturday March 23, 2019.





He said this was to ensure that the Malays and Bumiputeras always remain competitive. "In the days of the greatness of Islam, Caliph Umar Al-Khattab suggested that knowledge useful to children is knowledge of the future. This education can change the stigma and build the spirit and self-esteem of the Malays and Bumiputeras which has enabled them to compete in the world," he said.

Al-Sultan Abdullah also believes that if a nation wants to change and overcome the challenges ahead it must have knowledge accompanied by superior spiritual and moral stance. Hence, he said that UiTM also has a great responsibility to ensure integrity amongst its high quality graduates. "The integrity must also be embedded in the leadership of an organization because ethical and credible leadership will ensure the excellence of the organization, " said his majesty.

At the same time, Al-Sultan Abdullah called on the people of this country to avoid any behavior or speech that could lead to division and dispute, and defamation and envy. "All of this will only invite the destruction of the nation's peace and harmony that has long been achieved," he asserted.

Brunei Sultan Conferred Honorary Doctorate by UiTM

he 90th convocation ceremony of Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) on March 23rd saw His Majesty the Sultan of Brunei Darussalam, Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah, being conferred an honorary doctorate in recognition of his leadership and contribution to the Islamic world.

The Yang di-Pertuan Agong Al-Sultan Abdullah Ri'ayatuddin Al-Mustafa Billah Shah presented the scroll to him. The Sultan was conferred the honorary doctorate during the first session of the convocation ceremony together with 109 UiTM graduates. Also present were the Raja Permaisuri Agong Tunku Azizah Aminah Maimunah Iskandariah and Minister of Education, Dr. Maszlee Malik.

The Sultan thanked UiTM, especially the Yang di-Pertuan Agong, who is UiTM Chancellor, for the doctorate. He said it was a great honour for him and the people of Brunei to receive the award which serves as a catalyst to promote bilateral ties.

"I understand that UiTM is working with the Islamic University of Sultan Sharif Ali, Brunei, to organise an international halal conference," he said, adding that he hoped the good relationship would continue through collaborative efforts in research and student exchange programmes between the two institutions of higher learning.



UiTM Vice Chancellor Emeritus Professor Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim said the award was in recognition of the Brunei Sultan's Islamic approach in ruling his country. This has contributed to the rapid rise in education and socio-economic development of the Muslim community.

In addition to strengthening Muslim brotherhood, he said the award was intended to promote strong collaboration in both academic and non-academic fields between the two sovereign nations. "I am pleased that relations between the two nations have always been strengthened through cooperation between Bruneian and Malaysian universities, including UiTM"

Women in Islamic Business & Finance 2019

rofessor Dr. Normah Omar, the Director of the Accounting Research Institute, Universiti Teknologi MARA, has been recognised as one of the most influential women in Islamic finance by Cambridge International Financial Advisory, a UK-based financial services organization that provides strategic advice to governments, financial institutions and multilateral organisations in the development of financial markets.

The announcement was made during the 2nd WOMANi Gala Dinner and Awards Ceremony at the JW Marriott Marquis Hotel Dubai on 17th June, 2019. Professor Dr. Normah was ranked second on the list, only after Datuk Noripah Kamso, Chairman of Bank Rakyat. The award recognises Professor Dr. Normah Omar's passion for advancing knowledge in Islamic financial criminology.

Professor Dr. Normah is a pioneer researcher in Islamic Financial Criminology, and her passion for research in the area has contributed significantly in realising national aspirations to make Malaysia an Islamic financial hub.

Under her leadership, the Accounting Research Institute was awarded the status of Higher Institution Centre of Excellence by the Ministry of Higher Education Malaysia in 2010, and the centre continues to prioritise Islamic Finance in its high priority research agenda. In 2017, Professor Dr. Normah became the first woman elected by the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission to sit on the "Anti Corruption Certification Programme". In addition to holding various positions at the national level, she has also pursued her passion in elevating the status of women entrepreneurs through the development of new Islamic finance products. She continues to mentor dozens of academics, and her advice is highly sought by influential thought leaders.

Professor Dr. Normah is no stranger to awards. In 2016, she was named Game Changer of the Year by ACQ London; in 2017, she was recipient of both the Global Good Governance award for Excellence in Higher Education in Dubai and the Advocacy of Islamic Financial Criminology award in Kazakhstan. Professor Dr Normah Omar is indeed a shining example for women and has



he Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) choir team participated in the seventh Copernicus International Choir Competition and Festival in Torun, Poland on July 3, 2019 and won three gold awards in all categories. The three categories won were the Mixed Choir and Folklore (folk or cultural song) by UiTM Chamber Choir (UCC) and the Women Choir category by UiTM Women's Chorale team.

The UCC also received two special awards, namely the Special Audience Prize and the Grand Prix of All Volunteers awards. The competition, from June 29 to July 3, involved participation from 52 choir groups, but only 12 groups qualified for the finals. Among the countries in the final round were Poland, Latvia, Lithuania, Taiwan, the Philippines, Indonesia and South Africa. The UCC performed three songs during the Friendship Concert session and 11 local and international songs for the entire competition.

The Special Audience Prize was received when a group photo from LiTM gerraged over 7,500 likes via

online polls on social media site Facebook, while the Grand Prix of All Volunteers special award is a result of the volunteers' poll who handled the entire programme.

The UCC also joined another international choir competition, the "Johannes Brahms Choir Festival and Competition" in Wernigerode, Germany, from July 3-7, 2019. Wernigerode is a city with a special flair, as it is not only a gem of medieval architecture but also beautifully located at the edge of the Harz, a low mountain range in Germany. Hardly any other German city has so many gorgeous timber-framed buildings that compete for the visitor's' attention: the ideal setting for the parade and the opening ceremony as well as further open air events. After spectacular contests and great performances on the stages in and around Wernigerode, the best nine choirs of the Johannes Brahms Choir Competition met on the last day of the event for the choral showdown.

All in all, ten (10) Category Winners embraced each other when the results were announced and each of them took a Golden Diploma back to their home countries in recognition of their elaborate rehearsal work. UCC won in both the Mixed Choirs and Folklore category led by conductor Masashi Kishimoto. Additionally the UiTM Women's Chorale was awarded a Special Prize for the outstanding stage show "lkimilikiliklik"

MOU Signing with The University Grants Commission, Bangladesh

HAH ALAM - The University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh and Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) agreed to develop academic cooperation by signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on July 31 at UiTM, Shah Alam. The MoU was signed by Vice Chancellor, Emeritus Professor Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim and a member of UGC, Professor Dr. M. Shah Nowaz Ali.

The MoU demonstrates a commitment to promote cooperation and the advancement of academic, administrative and educational exchanges between the two institutions. UGC is a grant commission which regulates and supervises higher education institutions in Bangladesh. The development of a systematic and

effective governance of higher education institutions is their main focus. And UiTM, with its expertise and experience in managing multi-campuses, is well-suited to the task.

The MoU focussed specifically on academic and administrative visits for research, lectures and consultation; research and academic collaborations; exchange of expertise in research commercialization, interdisciplinary research, innovation and technology transfer; participation in joint international conferences, seminars, workshops; exchange of academic staff and students; and other related educational activities in accordance with the requirements of UGC and the spirit of this MoU.






UiTM Continues to Drive Global Partnership

HAH ALAM – Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the University of Texas at Arlington, USA on the 23rd of May 2019 at the Vice Chancellor's Office in Shah Alam. The MoU was signed by the Vice Chancellor of UiTM, Emeritus Professor Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim and Professor Teik C. Lim, the Provost of the University of Texas at Arlington (UTA), USA. In attendance were Professor TPr. Dr. Jamalunlaili Abdullah (Dean, Faculty of Architecture, Planning and Surveying, UITM), Professor Datin Sr. Dr. Hamimah Adnan (Deputy Dean, Research and Industrial Linkages), Dr. Hajah Zainab Mohd Noor (Director of OIA) and Sr. Dr. Siti Aekbal Salleh (Coordinator, ICTD OIA).

Prior to the MoU signing ceremony, a series of events had already been initiated by both institutions. It began with the first visit by Mr. Howard Chang from ASIA UTA to the Arshad Ayub Graduate Business School (AAGBS) in August 2018 to discuss potential collaborations between UiTM and UTA.

This was followed by a second visit from the UTA by Ms. Lin Larson and Mr. Sebastian Fuentes in November 2018 to meet representatives from the Engineering faculties of UiTM to discuss students' and staff exchange programme and joint research activities. The third visit was in January 2019 by Dr. Curtis Andressen, Vice Provost, International Affairs, UTA to discuss the MoU which outlined more specific activities between the two institutions. Among the areas identified to be part of the MoU are Architecture and Built Environment, Engineering, Music, and Rusineer Management.

It is hoped that the collaboration will open up opportunities for UiTM academic staff and students to be exposed to Al Jazeera's work culture and expertise via industrial attachments, student internships, joint training, and exchange of expertise.

The delegates also visited the Malaysian Embassy to discuss possibilities of potential partners in Qatar which UiTM could engage with and to acknowledge the embassy officials for their assistance during the visit.

The Qatar Foundation was the next highlight of the Middle East trip where the delegates toured the Education City. The flagship initiative is a campus of more than 12 square kilometers that hosts branch campuses of some of the world's leading educational institutes, a homegrown university, and other research, scholastic, and community centers. Together, these institutes make Education City a unique model of academic enterprise and research excellence, pioneering a new approach to multidisciplinary, global education and enabling breakthroughs that benefit Qatar and the rest of the world.

They next visited the Qatar National Library and Qatar University to discuss possible partnerships and collaborations in research and exchange of staff and students. The meeting with representatives at each venue provided great insights and possibilities of expanding UiTM to the Middle East.

The trip is rewarding and fulfilling for the delegates, because engagements with new partners were established. This visit aligned with the Vice Chancellor's vision on globalization which is part of UiTM's strategic planning agenda. The collaboration reflects UiTM's continued support for Malaysia's vision of providing world-class education to its 21st Century students.

Dr. Mohammad Kamal Harun, headed the delegation accompanied by the Director of InED, Prof. Dr. Azizul Halim Yahya, Director of OIA, Dr. Zainab Mohd Noor, and Sr. Dr. Aekbal Salleh, Coordinator at OIA for both visits.






The 12th CAECW, co-hosted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Education, and Guizhou Provincial People's Government, has been held annually in Guizhou since 2008. This year, CAECW attracted more than 18,000 attendees, including political dignitaries, diplomatic officers, educational officials, university presidents, scholars and youth representatives from universities, colleges and educational institutions in China, ASEAN countries and special guest countries such as Switzerland, Russia, Kazakhstan. Almost 1,490 cooperation agreements or MOUs were signed among governments, universities and enterprises.

The main purpose of the programme was to promote practical educational cooperation and people-to-people exchanges between China and ASEAN, enhancing mutual understanding and friendship, supporting the construction of the Belt and Road Initiative, and making contribution to China-ASEAN community of shared future. Thus, the programme centered on China-ASEAN people-to-people exchanges, which include education, science and technology, culture, health, sports, youth, and media. 2019 is ASEAN-China Year of Media Exchanges, so CAECW focused on supporting the programmes of media exchanges.



During the conference, UiTM managed to engage with nine (9) institutions, which showed great interest in collaborating with UiTM through the signing of Letters of Intent (Lol). The universities were Guizhou University, Guizhou Minzu University, GuiZhou University of Finance and Economics, Guizhou Medical University, Guiyang Preschool Education College, Guizhou Equipment Manufacturing Vocational College (GZEMVC), Zunyi Medical University, Guizhou Polytechnic of Construction and Guizhou Light Industry Technical College. These nine institutions trusted UiTM and as part of the strategic partnership mission, the delegates also visited the Hong Kong University (HKU), School of Professional and Continuing Education (SPACE) to benchmark best practices at the institution. The two institutions also discussed benchmarking practices and quality governance. The discussion with officials at HKU SPACE namely Prof. William Lee, the Director, and Dr John Cribbin, the Deputy Director of Academic Affairs was successful in getting HKU SPACE to support the development of SPACE at UiTM.

The outcomes of the visits will be to help UiTM be globally visible and be ranked at par with international institutions on various aspects. It should also result in the strengthening of academic exchanges and linkages between UiTM and China.

The 2nd Summit of the **University International Alliance**

HANGHAI, CHINA – The four consortium members of Better Futures, Shanghai Normal University (SHNU), Liverpool John Moore University (LJMU), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) and Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU) held the second meeting of the summit of

During the meetings, the participants exchanged opinions on the work experience of the alliance over the past year, the vision and cooperation modes of alliance development, the projects undertaken by the alliance universities, and the expansion of alliance members. All parties placed great importance to the important role of the alliance in cultivating international talents. The emphasis is to create a closer partnership and make a special contribution to talent-cultivation and sustainable development of the universities in the alliance.

At the summit, the principals of the four universities discussed the vision of alliance cooperation and reiterated their full support for the alliance. Zhu Ziqiang, in his speech, emphasized that the "International Alliance of Modern Local Universities" is committed to cultivating young talents with international competitiveness, which is also highly consistent with the mission of Shanghai Normal University. The advantages of internationalisation must be incorporated into the whole process of running a modern university, and provide new paradigms and experiences for the global development of local universities.

The Vice Chancellor of UiTM, Emeritus Professor Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim, re-emphasized the mission and goals of the alliance: to promote global social responsibility and serve society through the creation of multilateral educational exchanges and student international volunteer programmes, to face the challenges of sustainable development in the 21st century, to solve the problems of globalization through applied research, and to continuously improve the national and international influence of the Alliance University. UiTM pilot project under the consortium

HAH ALAM – UiTM hosted the first Better Futures Global Volunteering Programme with the theme 'Conserving their Home and our Home' from July 1 to 14, 2019. 44 volunteers from the Better Futures member institutions, 11 from Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), 13 from Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU), USA, 10 from Liverpool John Moores University (LJMU), UK, and 10 from Shanghai Normal University (SHNU), China participated in the programme.





This year, the consortium entrusted UiTM to lead the first Global Volunteering Programme 2019. UiTM provided the youth volunteers activities in conservation and sustainable development. They participated in conservation activities such as planting trees, teaching English to primary and pre-school pupils of the Orang Asli villages, and helped clean and feed the orangutans at the Orang Utan Sanctuary. These activities helped to create better awareness and understanding amongst them on the significance of conserving the indigenous culture of the Orang Asli and saving the endangered orangutans in Malaysia.

The Office of International Affairs (OIA) organized a closing ceremony on July 12 to recognize the global volunteers for their participation. Present at the ceremony were the Vice Chancellor, Deputy Vice Chancellor, Assistant Vice Chancellor InQkA, CEO and representatives from EMKAY, the organizing committee and the volunteers. BEYOND BOUNDARIES LAW

FACULTY OF LAW UNIVERSITI TEKNOLOGI MARA

t is encouraging to note that UNESCO has recognised Malaysia as one of the top 10 destinations for international students to pursue higher education (Bernama News, 2016). Hence, the Ministry of Education has encouraged local universities to become international reference points to make Malaysia an international education hub.

In line with the Ministry's vision of Internationalisation, academic collaborations with universities abroad became the main agenda in UiTM. Various internationalisation programmes were identified to enhance the university's global visibility, competitiveness, and as a source of

global reference. University-wide mobility programmes were designed to spearhead the goals of *Tahun Pengantarabangsaan UiTM*. For 2019, UiTM's internationalis3ation activities focussed on lecturers and students getting involved in impactful national and international collaborations. It is hoped that the global minds will meet the challenges of the 21st Century head-on

UiTMLaw strives to achieve the above missions to enhance the faculty's global visibility by initiating several programmes.

BBL PROGRAMME

In 2017, the Beyond Boundaries Law (BBL) programme was introduced and launched by UiTMLaw's current dean Assoc. Prof. Dr Hartini Saripan. The BBL is a strategic approach adopted by UiTMLaw for the staff's and students' development on an international scale. They are encouraged to be involved in activities involving the international partners.

The strength of this programme was reflected by the efforts put forth by both the faculty and staff. Programmes of this nature require strong financial support to succeed. In the current financial climate, institutional support was not enough to run these programmes. The faculty managed to collect funds from the academic and administrative staff and this proves to be the ultimate commitment to ensure the global visibility of UiTMLaw. This programme succeeded in offering opportunities to the staff to promote their expertise globally whilst at the same time promoting UiTMLaw. Consequently, networks and partnerships were established via this programme.







BBL ACTIVITIES

UiTMLaw enhanced its global experience to increase and strengthen global partnerships. Indonesia was chosen as the first country for the BBL mission in 2017. The programme resulted in the signing of MoUs with Universitas Padjadjaran (Bandung) and Universitas Airlangga (Surabaya). Through the MoUs, *Staff and Students' Exchange Agreement* of staff and student mobility were executed.

The BBL programme was extended to Australia and MoUs were signed with five universities in New South Wales: the University of Technology Sydney (UTS), the Macquarie University, the University of Newcastle, the Western Sydney University and the University of New England. With this signing, the academic links and activities between UiTM and these institutions were expanded.

This effort continued with the signing of MoA for the students' and staff's exchange programmes with the Universiti Islam Sultan Sharif Ali, Brunei. This is followed by the visiting fellowship programme with University Chulalongkorn, Thailand and the Student Mobility Programme at Thammassat University, Bangkok. MoUs were signed with Universitas Warmadewa in Bali, Universitas Lambung Mangkurat in

Kalimantan, and Universitas Pelita Harapan in Jakarta. And MoAs were also signed with Universitas Trisakti, Universitas Indonesia, and Universitas Gadja Madah, Yogjakarta.

The BBL programme was also extended to South Asia where MoUs were with Delhi University and Jindal O.P University. Following this, another MoU was signed with the Islamic University of Maldives followed by Tehran University and Shahid Bahesti University of the Western Asian region of Iran.

In July 2019, an MoU was signed with Herbert Smith Freehills, a leading global law firm with 27 offices internationally, including in Kuala Lumpur. The objective of the MoU is to enhance mutual relations between UiTMLaw and Herbert Smith Freehills to give UiTMLaw students exposure to international and cross-border legal practice. The MOU provides opportunities, facilities, and most importantly, industrial exposure to the students of UiTMLaw via guest lectures and internships focusing on international legal transactions. Herbert Smith Freehills provided, and will continue to provide, several guest lectures, covering technical legal issues and soft skills, at UiTMLaw 2018 and 2019. Additionally, Herbert Smith Freehills has agreed informally to offer one internship position to students from UiTMLaw to join the firm's annual internship programme.



BBL OUTCOMES

The collaborations accord UiTMLaw the opportunity to go beyond local boundaries to forge ties in education. Prior to 2017, organizing international programmes was a challenge due to the very limited number of international partners. BBL has successfully made UiTMLaw embrace flexibility in its curriculum through the student exchange programmes with its international partners. Other activities includes joint conferences, publications, and supervisory and academic appointments.

Ten lecturers from UiTMLaw were invited as Visiting Fellows at Universitas Padjadjaran, Bandung, Indonesia in 2017. This illustrated the success of the BBL programme. The lecturers were Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hartini Saripan, Dr. Rafizah, Dr. Normawati, Dr. Sheela, Dr. Irini, Dr. Azni, Dr. Siti Hafsyah, Puan Mariam and Puan Mimi Sintia. They presented lectures, talks and materials in their areas of expertise.

From October 27 to November 4 2018, six lecturers, Dr. Siti Hafsyah, Dr. Sheela, Dr. Norazlina, Dr. Shahrizal, Puan Mazlina and Cik Mazlifah were appointed Visiting Fellows at Airlangga Universitas. They gave lectures and engaged in research activities.

Some faculty members also received invitations to the Faculty of Law, University of Indonesia (UI), Jakarta, on 31 October 2018, where our former dean, Prof. Dato' Dr. Rahmat delivered a public lecture on *International Law*. The collaboration was sealed with the signing of an MoA. Arrangements were also made to enhance students' relationship between the two universities through discussions regarding the direction "student empowerment in legal matters" should take.



Prof Christoph Antons from the University of Newcastle, Australia was appointed a Visiting Professor of UiTMLaw



Professor Steven Freeland from the Western Sydney University was appointed an External Examiner to UiTMLaw The success of the programme resumed when Dr. Normawati Hashim was appointed a visiting lecturer in Administrative Law at Warmadewa University (UNWAR), Bali in April 2019. Cik Mazlifah Mansoor was appointed a Visiting Fellow to Airlangga Universitas (UNAIR) from 22 April to 3 May 2019. This was her second visit to the university following a successful visit in 2018. It was a recognition of her expertise in Criminal Justice. Pn Habibah Omar and Dr. Noraiza Abdul Rahman were appointed Visiting Fellows at the same university from 28 April - 3 May 2019. These appointments illustrated the strength of the networking made by the faculty members. They presented lectures and seminars, and conducted research with the partners.

Collaboration was also carried out with others. Cik Mazlifah did a one-week internship at the Anti-Corruption Court, Surabaya during her fellowship. Dr. Normawati appeared on the Bali prime news discussing matters related to Administrative Law. These indeed increased the visibility of UiTMLaw academics internationally.

From 8 -10 March 2019, En. Mohd Nazim was invited as a panelist at the *Colloquium Internasional Himpunan Ahli Hukum Tata Negara dan Hukum Administrasi* at University Lambung Mangkurat, Banjarmasin, Kalimantan. He was later invited to Universitas Airlangga, Surabaya from 14-17 May 2019. These invitations were a nod to

his expertise in Constitutional Law.

UiTM Joins Hands with Kangwon National University, South Korea

iTM, through the Faculty of Business and Management, and Kangwon National University (KNU) in Korea had officially signed an MoU in 2014 and since then have executed many successful collaborations together. The collaborations have been in the form of student exchange programmes, academic visits, and professorial lectures. These activities have brought the institutions closer and the bond between them has strengthened considerably.

KNU, in collaboration with FBM and the Association of Korean Economic Studies (AKES), hosted ABEIC 2019. The conference was held at the Global Business Building, Kangwon National University (KNU), Chuncheon, from 25 – 27 April 2019. The theme of the conference was 'Asian Business and Economic Collaboration in the 4th Industrial Revolution Era'. A total of 108 academicians from Brunei, Indonesia, Thailand, Vietnam, South Korea, Pakistan, Poland, Morocco, Germany, Malaysia, UAE, Uzbekistan, Venezuela and Nigeria participated in this conference to highlight on the implications for the digitization of revenues, profits and opportunities.



Internationalisation Initiatives with China

he proverb "Seek knowledge even to China," famously attributed to the Prophet Muhammad PBUH and the Malay proverb Jauh Perjalanan Luas Pemandangan are related. The further you travel, the greater the knowledge and experience you gain. Akademi Pengajian Bahasa (APB) follows this maxim faithfully.

In the 2019-2020 strategic planning, APB outlined various strategies supporting key principles of UiTM's internationalisation agenda. To realise these, APB eyed China as a partner for internationalisation. Several academic visits were planned for this purpose. The initiative opened up a new chapter for bilateral collaboration between APB and China.

The first bilateral relationship APB accomplished was the academic missions to Beijing Foreign Studies University (BFSU), Communication University of China (CUC), and University of International Business and Economics (UIBE) in Beijing. Dean of APB, Associate Professor Dr. Ahmad Mazli Muhammad, accompanied by several heads of departments, led the visit.

The talks between APB and BFSU led to several areas of cooperation including staff and student mobility, and joint-research activities. BFSU offered to host a 4-week Summer School, embedded with edu-tourism. Interestingly, the summer school is conducted entirely in three different languages: English, German and French. The cooperation is further strengthened when APB and BFSU agreed to sign an MoU where tuition waivers are awarded to strategic university partners.

In July, 20 APB students left for Beijing Summer Camp 2019 at BFSU fully sponsored by Hanban China. To add to the excitement, two students from APB left for another International Summer Session at the same university and received funding from BFSU. An English lecturer and a Bahasa Melayu lecturer also left for The Belt and Road Senior Training Programme 2019. They were fortunate to have received scholarships from the Shanghai Government and were at Shanghai University from 14 July ~ 4 August, 2019.

Another international collaboration was also accomplished when the Dean of APB, along with six Deans of language faculties from five Malaysian public universities, were

invited to join an academic mission to universities in Shanghai and Beijing, courtesy of the Kong Zi Institute of China. During the visits, APB signed three academic collaborations with three renowned universities: Shanghai International Studies University (SISU), Shanghai Normal University (SHNU) and Peking University (PKU).

After SHNU, Dr Mazli visited Shanghai International Studies University (SISU) in Shanghai. Both agreed to enhance student mobility and experiential learning in the areas of language studies for English, Malay and Arabic languages, create platforms for visiting professors, invite colleagues as external examiners for curriculum reviews and PhD evaluation, and design hybrid degree programmes. APB also invited SISU academics to be reviewers and international committee members for APB's journal, IJMAL (International Journal of Modern Languages and Applied Linguistics) and share their expertise.

After a successful academic mission with Shanghai universities, the academic entourage visited Peking University (PKU) which is ranked number one in China. Once again, Dr Mazli carried out several discussions with the representatives of the Faculty of Foreign Languages at Peking University which resulted in four outcomes: the signing of MOU, co-authoring for journal writing, external reviewing for curriculum and thesis, and student and faculty mobility.

The outcomes of the academic missions which resulted in many promising intellectual collaborations with the universities in Beijing and Shanghai, are extremely encouraging for the faculty. APB is confident that with a well-coordinated effort, relationships with its Chinese partners can be strengthened. Encouraged by the success of the China incursion, APB is exploring academic excursions to Japan and Korea.

They were Mr Qiu Mingming, Vice Dean for the School of International Education, Associate Professor Dr Hu Xia from the School of International Pharmaceutical Business, and Admissions Officer Mr Zhang Hongyuan. Rector Professor Dato Jamil Hj Hamali and other senior officers were present to welcome them.

China Pharmaceutical University (CPU) is a university in Nanjing that specializes in the pharmaceutical sciences. CPU consists of six schools (School of Pharmacy, School of Traditional Chinese Pharmacy, School of Life Science and Technology, School of International Pharmaceutical Business, School of

Continuing Education, and School of Higher Vocational Education), four independent departments (Basic Sciences, Foreign Languages, Social Sciences, and Physical Education) and five key labs and centers at state or provincial levels. CPU offers 20 bachelor's degree programmes, 29 master's programmes, 24 doctoral programmes and 6 post-doctoral fellowship programmes.

Both universities explored some "immediate wins" strategies such as collaborative research, focussing on herbal and natural products and halal-related research. Opportunities for bi-lateral staff and student mobility were also discussed.

arlier this year I applied to be a part of the Better Futures 2019 programme hosted by UiTM in Malaysia. I didn't think I would be successful. All I really knew about the trip is we were going to a rainforest, and an orangutan sanctuary island so I was 100% sold on the trip before it had even begun. Studying Zoology, I'm absolutely mad about animals so being given the chance to get up close to orangutans, and learn about their behaviours and physiology was something that just seemed like a dream. We were lucky to arrive a few days prior to the programme, giving us a chance to get to know each other, acclimatize to the weather, and also adjust to the time difference.

Belum rainforest enchanted me for the entirety of my time there. I've never been anywhere so far from home, but I fell in love there. Falling asleep to the sounds of crickets and rustling of the trees, monkeys scattering about freely, going on boat rides to unknown locations and trekking through the jungle at night species-spotting was just incredible. I can't express how Belum made me feel, as clichéd as it may sound; but being there allowed me to find myself and see exactly what I want out of my life. As my roommates slept, I stargazed and socialized, basking in the sounds of the trees snapping and crackling from the critters running



through them. The next day, opening my eyes to the greenery of the trees and the soft light streaming in made me jump out of bed. Taking a few minutes to reflect, I stood on the balcony feeling so grateful and blessed for this opportunity. Breakfast was like Christmas! Toast, baked beans and eggs; I was in my element and the day only got better.

Another memorable experiencet at Belum was a visit to the Temiar tribe village. I didn't expect such a clean village, free from litter, something we westerners could learn from. We contributed to the village's already beautiful landscape by adding a therapy garden, further helping them and us to respect their environment. With the garden finished, hunger beckoned and the group sat devouring the sandwiches enjoying each other's company. The Orang Asli chief also allowed us the privilege to try fresh durian, dubbed the "king of fruits" by the locals, as it grows in abundance around their village. Bellies (mostly) full and the garden finished we were invited to their local i-toy library to watch the children perform the cutest rendition of "Rain, rain go away" in three different languages as well as my new favourite song, "Walking in the jungle". We continued with games, interacting with the children to improve their English-speaking abilities. I later chatted with Mrs Zainon Kasim, the EMKAY Foundation CEO, hearing about the stories the villagers and teachers face but still push on to improve and better the futures of the children. Later on, a night trek around the rainforest speciesspotting, with the night ending stargazing.

Next trip was to Bukit Merah. Here relationships between the universities developed further and new friendships solidified. We visited the orangutan island twice during our stay here, the first to take part in some conservation work and improvements, and the second to partake in a few fun challenges and potentially feed some of the orangutans. I spent the first day in the infant care unit. Learning about the medical procedures and genetic similarities between us and them was so interesting. Many people don't know that orangutans are a keystone species. If orangutans cease to exist, it signals a dire change for the ecosystem around it; many other plants and animals would no longer exist so by saving orangutans, we are saving many other delicate species in the rainforest. So let's help to save the orangutans in whatever way we can. The next day was time for a few fun challenges in teams to win prizes. One of the challenges was blowing darts at balloons which, I won't lie was so much fun. The best part of the second visit for me was holding hands and receiving kisses from an absolutely beautiful 3-year-old orangutan called Jidin. The way his hands felt so similar to ours, the warmth of his fingers and the gentleness behind each kiss was unbelievable. I will never, ever forget those moments.

n 11th March 2019, the Faculty of Music welcomed me, the first exchange student from the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre. I was a postgraduate percussion student and was accepted to do a semester in UiTM as part of UiTM mobility exchange programme and MoA agreement with Estonian Academy. I studied percussion under the tutelage of Mr. Kamrul Hussin (Malay drumming) and Mr. Maximillian Riefer (percussion studies), while taking a postgraduate course in research studies with Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ghaziah Ghazali. My research interest includes contemporary drumming in Malay traditional music and percussion pedagogy.

My time in Malaysia was filled with many performing opportunities with my lecturers, Mr. Maximillian Riefer and Mr. Kamrul Hussin, which accelerated my learning phase and provided direct exposure to traditional Malay drumming. Furthermore, my time in Malaysia coincided with the holy month of Ramadan and Hari Raya Aidil Fitri, something that I experienced for the first time in my life. Apart from enjoying the cultural and religious festivities, the Raya season also gave me plenty of opportunities to perform with the UiTM Traditional Percussion Group. We were invited by Subang Parade to do a weekly performance during the month of Ramadan.

Some of my learning opportunities came from meeting stalwarts of the Malaysian music industry. The most memorable time was at the RTM production of 'Konsert Minggu Ini', Mr. Kamrul Hussin who was one of the musicians there introduced me as his protégé to Dato' Ramli Sarip. Dato' Ramli was performing his 'Blues di Aidilfitri' concert at Auditorium Perdana, Angkasapuri.

On 21st June 2019, I performed in concert with other percussion students at RAW Art Space in Kuala Lumpur. As part of my final assessment for my Performing Group module, my tutor, Mr. Max Riefer, and I organized 'Connecting Beats Malaysia Vol.6'. It featured music by various contemporary composers and some new percussion pieces. It was also an opportunity for other percussion students to perform material that they have worked on for the semester. The second half of the concert featured me, UiTM lecturers Mr. Max Riefer and Ms. Yeoh Pei Ann and other professional musicians played an improvised set of music.

I was proud to be at the Faculty of Music. The exchange programme at the faculty facilitated an exciting and meaningful learning experience for me in the last four months. This was further enriched by other activities that the Office of International Affairs (OIA) organized for exchange students at UiTM. As part of the MOA with the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre, UiTM's Faculty of Music should send a music degree student for an exchange. This first exchange programme galvanized the Faculty of Music to develop new opportunities to collaborate with the academic staff at the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre and bring about new research and creative possibilities.

n 24th April 2019, I arrived in Shanghai, China, to attend the Better Futures Consortium Annual Meeting. The meeting which took place from the 24th until 27th April 2019 was held at the Shanghai Pullman Hotel and the Shanghai Normal University (SHNU). I learned a lot of things from the programme which opened my eyes to new experiences.

One of the most memorable experiences was to learn to "take charge"; here students' empowerment was strongly emphasized. I also had the valuable opportunity to learn the system and structure of a consortium. Whilst there, I also met with Chris Arnold, the Founder of World Merit, a charity institution whose objective is to empower youths and make the world better through Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). We discussed ways to further expand World Merit worldwide, and I accepted his offer to make me President of World Merit Malaysia. It is a new initiative to further expose students to current issues and become agents of change and increase UiTM's student mobility efforts. The meeting lasted nearly two hours and many inputs were contributed to the discussion. One of the suggestions I had was to create more overseas Industrial Training opportunities for deserving students whose projects impact SDGs. The proposal was well received by all those present. Key requests were tabulated for further discussion.

Meeting and developing relationships with people of different ranks, backgrounds, religions, nationalities and ethnicity was an invaluable experience for me. It was quite a challenge to get acquainted with people from different linguistic backgrounds and cultures. I learned how intonation, manner of conversation and structure, and usage of sentences affect understanding and communication.

As part of the cultural experience, the participants were taken on a brief tour of Shanghai. We visited Yu Garden, one of the oldest parks in China. The design of buildings and houses there was unique. We had dinner on Bund Ship at Huang Pu River. As we cruised along the river, I could witness the rapid development along the shore.

Shandong Xiehie University, China Linguistic and Artistic Summer Programme

he Faculty of Education, UiTM Puncak Alam in collaboration with OIA hosted 23 students and 2 staff from Shandong Xiehie University, China for a two-week linguistic and artistic summer programme. The programme was conducted from 23 June to 7 July 2019 at UiTM Puncak Alam campus.

he 7th ASEAN Future Leaders Summit 2019 or AFLES 2019 was held from 14 – 22 July 2019. In conjunction with this year's theme "Building Leadership for a Sustainable Tomorrow", the two-week programme was jointly organized by Universiti Teknologi MARA Shah Alam (UiTM) and Universiti Sains Malaysia, Penang (USM). 119 student leaders from universities in the ASEAN region attended the programme with participating countries from Cambodia, Philippines, Indonesia, Myanmar, Thailand, Vietnam and Malaysia.

The programme provided a platform for networking, sharing of ideas, and cross-cultural exchanges. Activities in the programme were designed to provide the transformation needed to build future leaders. The participants spent the first week at UiTM with a welcoming dinner and opening ceremony officiated by UiTM's Vice Chancellor, Emeritus Prof. Ir. Dr. Mohd. Azraai Kassim. The programme at USM concluded with a gala performance in which participants from each country showcased their skills and talents through lively performances. It is hoped that through activities at AFLES 2019, the participants would have obtained invaluable experience that will last a lifetime and promote Malaysia as a destination for higher education among the ASEAN communities.

HANGHAI, CHINA – Ten students from Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) were in Shanghai, China for a 12-day Summer Camp under the Better Futures Consortium. The students were from various UiTM faculties including Akademi Pengajian Bahasa (APB) and Faculty of Music from Shah Alam campus, ACCA in INTEC, and the UiTM Center of Foundation Studies in Dengkil. The students came together to represent UiTM, joining students from Liverpool John Moores University (LJMU) and Shanghai Normal University (SHNU).

The Better Futures Summer Camp commenced from 1-12 July. The 7th day was a rest day where we were given the time to explore the city of Shanghai at our own leisure. The actual programme consists of intensive classes and activities. In addition to that, there were multiple visits to historical sites, tourist attractions, and local markets for us to be exposed to and have hands-on experience of the Chinese culture, tradition, and history.

The first week was devoted to an introduction to Chinese language classes where we were taught basic Mandarin for everyday use. We were taught the proper pronunciation, enunciation, and rhythm of the language. We were also taught the usage of numbers and the skill to use the local currency, the Chinese Yuan or Renminbi. The instructors from SHNU also managed to teach us to write our names using Chinese characters.

After Mandarin classes, we were introduced to the culture of China. This include Chinese architecture, Chinese history, Chinese calligraphy, and Chinese Business Law. These short introductions provide a initial idea on how China was built and how China got to where they are today. They are informative and provided a preview of what was to come. In the evening, we were given a hands-on activity on Chinese calligraphy. It was done at a nearby calligraphy center, which is run by one of the alumni of SHNU. We were provided with tools and materials to produce our own Chinese calligraphy as a memento of our visit.

The day ended with a cruise along the Huangpu River, which provided an excellent view of the city. Whilst enjoying the view of tall skyscrapers and modern architecture, we also feasted on Chinese Muslim cuisines for lunch and dinner. Collaboration between UiTM & Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT)

Launched in 2011 as a joint initiative between Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) and Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), the Malaysia Institute for Supply Chain Innovation (MISI) offers Masters and PhD programes in supply chain management and logistics. As a subsidiary of UITM and with programmes and academic staff that are vetted by MIT, UITM retains close ties with MISI as a member of MISI's Board of Directors, as well as through several lecture invitations and study abroad opportunities for students.

UITM is proud of MISI's no.1 ranking in Eduniversal Ranking Best Masters in the World for three consecutive years since 2015 for its Master in Supply Chain Management programme. To date, 128 students have graduated from the programme. MISI's role in the international alliance of MIT Global SCALE (Supply Chain and Logistics Excellence) Network ensures that a world-class education is available for students here in Malaysia as it seeks to create a talent pool in the field of supply chain management in the country and the region.

Collaboration between UiTM & University of Sheffield

Through a series of visits by the Minister of Education, YBM Dr Maszlee Malik and UiTM to University of Sheffield Advanced Manufacturing Research Centre (AMRC), UiTM is strategically positioned to advance and strengthen aerospace manufacturing research to support the efforts of the aviation industries in Malaysia to become Asia's Aviation Hub.

AMRC is a unique cluster of industry-focused manufacturing R&D centres and supporting facilities as part of a collaboration between the University of Sheffield and aerospace giant, Boeing. Besides research collaboration and knowledge sharing of AMRC's success story, UiTM will also be setting up the Smart Manufacturing Research Institute that will be led by the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering.




