

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ABSTRACT

This report is on proposed new interior design of youth centre for Kelab Rakan Muda at Lot 2395, Seksyen 41, Jalan Sultan Ismail, 50350 Kuala Lumpur, Wilayah Persekutuan. The suggested location is strategic enough to achieve the objective for this project which is to create a new interior design of youth centre for Kelab Rakan Muda that reflects the new image of Kelab Rakan Muda itself. At the same time, this centre is proposed as an activity centre for members of Kelab Rakan Muda.

Informations gathering such as site analysis, interviews and datas through books, newspaper clippings and internet are done to fulfill the requirements of a succesful youth centre. Based from the findings in case studies, it can be concluded that youth centre in Malaysia lack of certain attraction that could interest youth. Therefore, for this project, the concept chosen is "Vibrant".

Since Kelab Rakan Muda has entered the new phase of its image, the mission is to make the new youth centre more lively and energetic in order to attract youth to participate in the club's activities. This is parallel with the definition of vibrant itself which means bright or lively. 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CHAPTER 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Rakan Muda was launched for the first time on 29 October 1994 by the former Prime Minister, YAB Dato Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad. It is a large-scaled, innovative Youth Focal Point - the first and biggest of its kind in Malaysia - created to effectively capture the imagination of youth, to make them purposeful and active contributors in nation building and also to make them dynamic partners in Malaysia's development goals and strategies of Vision 2020.

Recently, Rakan Muda is planning to set up more Rakan Muda clubs nationwide to accommodate the growing numbers of club members. At the same time, many youths have nowhere to hang out and most do not belong to clubs. Hence, the Youth and Sports Ministry has allocated RM30,000 to set up clubs as part of the programme's second phase and to promote participation from this younger generation.
