Playing with prerecorded tracks, and involvement with other studio recording techniques. Emphasis will be given to stylistic integrity, as well as melodic, harmonic, and rhythmic accuracy. Instrumentation: voice, synthesizer, piano, two guitars, bass, drums, and percussion (vibes, conga).
