

From 29 to 30 January 2018, the meeting in Paro, Bhutan hosted by Paro College of Education was for leaders of partner institutions to meet and evaluate the mid-term progress of the project. This three-year ERAMUS+ project under KA2 programme - Cooperation for innovation and the exchange of good practices - Capacity Building in the field of Higher Education (No: 574130-EPP-1-2016-1-FR-EPPKA2-CBHE-JP) is supported by EACEA-Erasmus+ project under building in the field of higher education category. This transnational cooperation sets the goal to address the challenges facing institutions and higher education systems.
