When planning a visit to Tanah Lot Temple, aim for a sunset viewing for an unforgettable experience

Tanah Lot, also called Pura Tanah Lot Temple, is one of Bali's most well-known and revered Hindu temples. It is one of the most famous and most photographed temples in Bali which is perched atop a sizable rock in the middle of the ocean. One of Bali's seven sea temples known as Pura Segara, Tanah Lot Temple is perched on a rock approximately 300 metres off the coast. Being a popular tourist destination, Bali welcomes a large number of adventure seekers and enthusiasts each year who make it a point to visit this location. Tanah Lot Temple is a group of three temples situated on a large offshore rock on the beach. The main Tanah Lot temple is closed during high tide, rendering it inaccessible, and the other two are thought of as a spiritual stand-in. The three temples are roughly 100 meters apart.

It is said that each temple can be seen from the others, creating a chain of protection that surrounds the island. The sea serpents that lurk beneath the surface are said to protect the sea temple, which dates back to the 16th century and is devoted to the guardian spirits of the sea. The sanctuary can be approached at sunset, but it is not feasible to enter the temple's interior, which is reached by a staircase carved out of the rock. Pura Tanah Lot is one of the most significant and highly revered sea temples among the Balinese. Similar to Pura Luhur Ulu Watu, located near the southernmost point of the Bukit Peninsula, and Pura Rambut Siwi, situated to the west, it has a strong connection to the Majapahit priest Nirartha.

When planning a visit to Tanah Lot Temple, aim for a sunset viewing for an unforgettable experience. It is best to arrive early to avoid the crowds, as the panoramic sunset view is a popular attraction. Remember to respect local customs by dressing conservatively, long clothing like jeans or floor-length dresses is recommended to cover your legs. Safety is important, so heed any warning signs around the temple, especially concerning hazardous waves. During high tide, the temple is often closed. The cost of entry tickets and parking includes insurance coverage. While tourists are not permitted on the main temple grounds and stairs, there is plenty of beauty to enjoy and photograph from the beach. However, exercise caution when taking pictures of the rocks, as they can be slippery due to moss and algae.
