CULTURAL TRIP | MAY 6, 2024

May 6, 2024, is a marked date when I was first meeting them. We will start our journey on this trip by going to Kapas Island. They were very excited and I could see from their reactions that they would enjoy this trip. Dhiyanesh, one of the male students, said to me that this was his first time going to the island. He also claims that his hometown is far away from any island and does not have suitable time for his family to go there. The journey to Kapas Island starts with a box of Nasi Goreng Ikan for each one of us, it is so delicious. During the journey to Marang Jetty, my hearing was served by Tamil songs, and I enjoyed the songs. Mukesh Kumaar, the one who asks the driver to connect his phone to the radio, and he also the one who chooses plenty of Tamil songs. The journey to Marang Jetty only takes only one hour. Once we arrived at the jetty, the boat was already waiting for us. We were very excited because the weather on that day was really calm.

After an hour, we finally arrived at Kapas Island. Before we go for the main activity which is snorkeling, we decide to play around the beach first. It was exciting because they looked so excited and cheerful. Daniial claims that it was her first time going to a beach that has beautiful scenery as Kapas Island. He also said that in Tamilnadu, he lives in the mountainside. When we were happily playing in the water, suddenly I was shocked by Mukesh Kumar's voice. He shouted for help because Punith was stepping on the sea urchins. He is not able to walk properly because of the thorn still stuck in his foot. Luckily the safeguard there was very alert and responsive about our situation quickly. The safeguard or I called him "Abang Pantai" said, the thorn just needs to be crushed to be able to walk properly. There is nothing serious because the thorn will come out itself after three to four days.

After a nice day trip to Kapas Island, all of them requested to eat Indian food. The first thing that came to mind was "mamak". Luckily, we have that kind of restaurant in Terengganu. I ask the driver to drop us at Mydin Bukit Besar for dinner. There was a restaurant called Nasi Kandar Al Mubin Maju, this "mamak" already existed in 2018 and until now their business is still running well. At "mamak", they explained to me that all the foods there met the taste of Indian. They love tosai very well. Punith asked me to try his Tosai and it turned out delicious. As for me, I only tried Nasi Kandar whenever I was going to "mamak". Dhiyanesh, the one who loves tea very much, asks for Indian tea but it is not available there. So, ask him to order "teh tarik". After Dhiyanesh tried our "teh tarik" he was excited because the taste was quite the same compared to Indian tea. After that, all of them start ordering the same menu, which is "teh tarik". When we were done with the dinner, all of them came to my table and said they wanted to have breakfast, lunch, and also dinner at this "mamak" because they had been missing their lovely Indian foods for 2 weeks already. They also thanked me for introducing them to this restaurant.



Kampung Budaya Terengganu, located in Terengganu State Museum was our second destination. The student from KAHE University was introduced to Terengganu Culture. In terms of traditional buildings, costumes, foods, and also traditional games. After 3 hours of spending time learning about Terengganu Culture, we stop by Pasar Payang. They do not love Pasar Payang because of the smell of dried fish. This is because they are not a fan of processed fish. On our last day of the trip, we went to Keropok making at Perusahaan Keropok Hamdan, Tok Jembal, NACC Batik Pavilion at Chendering, and FRI Rantau Abang. It's a fun experience for them to visit and see the turtle physically because they did not manage to see the turtle during the Kapas Island trip. They also learned a lot during the FRI Rantau Abang visit, they got to know about turtle species and also the cycle of turtles. Besides turtles, there were also other marine life such as whales, dolphins, and corals. It was exciting and full of knowledge.
