Stone and Petrick (2013) in their studies stated that learning outcomes have been found from the travel portion of the study experience, and it was that out-of-class experiences were the most impactful portion of study abroad, whereby personal growth, increase in life skills, and knowledge also result from independent international travel, as well as "objectiveless" travel.



There are lots of positive impacts of cultural immersion and tourism. Firstly, in terms of cultural immersion and language development. According to Hall-Lew & Lew, 2014; Basala & Klenosky, 2001, language affects intercultural communication and travel decisions. It creates communication barriers but serves as a functional tool to overcome these barriers. Based on Hall-Lew & Lew 2014, language also plays a role in the representation of cultural and other identities in tourism destinations. What interesting point about language learning is about the main travel motivations. It is the importance of language in tourism that is perhaps the most visible in the phenomenon of language travel.

Second is enhanced learning and global perspective. Stated by Agbai et.al (2024) in their study explored the influence of cultural exchange on global understanding and intercultural communication. It delves into the multifaceted dimensions of cultural exchange, cultural integration, and cultural continuity in fostering tolerance, empathy, and mutual respect among diverse communities worldwide.



Next is in the aspect of tourism opportunities and enrichment. From the notes of Educational Tourism, it offers unique opportunities for people to travel and learn by combining the joys of visiting new places with acquiring knowledge. This type of tourism includes various experiences such as study abroad programs, exchange student experiences, and school trips to historical sites or natural wonders. The primary goal is to enrich the learning experience, enhance cultural understanding, and nurture personal development. As globalization continues to make the world more interconnected,





educational tourism has become increasingly popular. People of all ages are eager to broaden their horizons while discovering new environments and cultures. Educational tourists also play a significant role in supporting local economies, fostering cultural exchanges, and contributing to global understanding.
