The Faculty of Pharmacy, UiTM Cawangan Pulau Pinang, Kampus Bertam, successfully organised *Eksplorasi Dunia Farmasi 2025* at Sekolah Rendah Islam Tahfiz Sains & Teknologi Pulau Pinang (SRITSAT). This outreach programme was designed to introduce students to the exciting world of pharmacy and to cultivate early interest in science and health, particularly in medication-related knowledge.

The programme featured a series of engaging and educational activities tailored for SRITSAT students. Among the highlights were the STEM booth exhibitions, which showcased simple yet impactful scientific concepts from anatomy, chemistry, and pharmaceuticals.



Another key session was the pharmacy talk delivered by Madam Nursyuhada Azzman, followed by group activities and a jigsaw puzzle session. Students also had the opportunity to observe how medications are prepared through capsule compounding demonstrations. These hands-on activities were conducted in an interactive manner, allowing students to explore freely and deepen their understanding of the pharmacy field.
