

# UiTM i-CLaS 2021

UiTM International Conference on Law & Society 2021

1-2 November 2021 | Shah Alam, SELANGOR, Malaysia



On the 1st and 2nd of November 2021 the Faculty of Law, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) in collaboration with the Universitas Gadjah Mada (UGM), Indonesia, Universitas Airlangga (UNAIR), Indonesia, Thomson Reuters, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM), the College of Law of the University of Cincinnati, Ohio (UC Law) and Perpustakaan Tun Abdul Razak, UiTM, successfully organised the UiTM International Conference on Law & Society 2021 (UiTM i-CLaS 2021). The conference provided an international forum for all to share experiences, knowledge, and research findings in the area of public and private law. The conference promoted the flourishing of intellectual development and provided opportunities for networking and collaboration in a multi-disciplinary as well as cross-national nature. This event also inspired the enriching of opportunities that transcended the new needs, demands and legal implications of the last century to face our complex and challenging technology-impacted world. This aspiration was entrenched in the conference theme - **"The Imperative Legal Changes in the Transformed Lifestyle"**. This conference focused on interactive and adaptive research across all domains with the law as its embryo.

The conference was held virtually in support of the effort to contain the spread of COVID-19. Assembly of presenters and participants from seven continents of the world namely Malaysia, Indonesia, Australia, United States of America, Maldives, Bangladesh, and India, the conference successfully synchronised the presentation of 107 papers that were based on 17 distinct law nomenclatures including Cyberlaw, Family law, Islamic law, international law, Commercial law, Marine and law of the sea, Conflict of Law, Competition Law and Alternative Dispute Resolution.

The conference was privileged to have two distinguished personalities on two occasions. First, the Malaysian Minister of Higher Education, YB Datuk Seri Dr. Noraini Binti Ahmad officiated its opening and secondly, the President of Malaysian Bar, YBhg. Mr. A G Kalidas delivered the Keynote Speech.
