These speakers shared their knowledge on Insolvency Law practices in their jurisdictions in my classes. Students engaged in the lectures by comparing Malaysian law and law in the the speakers' jurisdictions.

At the end of the classes, students gave feedbacks on what they have learnt from the sessions. These sessions do not involve a change in the course syllabus, but act as a tool or an aid for the students to understand the laws from national and international perspectives.
