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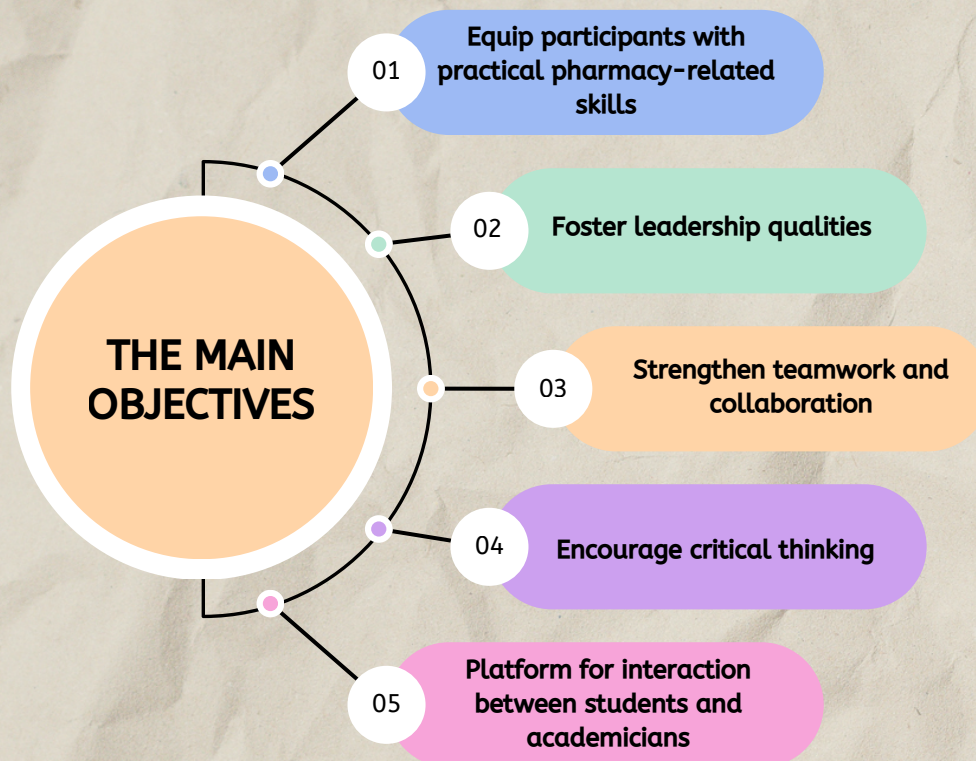
PA, QC, CC CHALLENGES

The Piala Aishah Compounding Challenge (PA), Pharmacy Quiz Challenge (QC), and Clinical Pharmacy Challenge (CC) were competitions held under the 6th MyPSA National Pharmacy Challenge, hosted by Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) from 3 to 5 April 2026. The competition was participated in by students from 21 universities across Malaysia, with a maximum of two teams allowed to represent each university. For the PA, QC and CC competitions, each team consisted of two, four, and three students, respectively. UiTM sent two teams for all three competitions, involving a total of 18 students.



THE OBJECTIVES

The main objective of these competitions was to equip participants with practical skills while fostering leadership, critical thinking, and teamwork among pharmacy students. The 6th MyPSA NPC 2026 also created a platform that brought together students, academicians, and professionals in the pharmaceutical field. By uniting the pharmacy community across Malaysia, the event aimed to strengthen academic growth, professional development, and future collaborations in pharmacy education and practice.



STRENGTH THROUGH CHALLENGES

In the PA Compounding Challenge, the competition combined both theory and practical assessments, beginning with Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs), followed by two rounds of extemporaneous compounding. The QC, on the other hand, tested students' pharmacy knowledge through MCQs and two rounds of Oral Short Answer Questions (SAQs). Meanwhile, the CC assessed students' ability to apply clinical knowledge in practical settings.

MEANINGFUL EXPERIENCE

These competitions provided students with valuable insights and practical experience. Participating students were able to apply their pharmaceutical knowledge in real-time situations while developing a competitive spirit that fostered a growth mindset, balancing ambition with collaboration while engaging with students from other institutions. Looking ahead, it is hoped that more UiTM pharmacy students will participate in such programmes to expand their knowledge, foster professional growth, and better prepare themselves for future challenges in the pharmacy field, particularly in preparation for their internship (PRP) and long-term career development.
