

STUDENTS SHOWCASE CREATIVITY THROUGH GMO MODEL PROJECT USING RECYCLED MATERIALS



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On 23 June 2026, students of diploma microbiology semester four at UiTM Negeri Sembilan Branch, successfully presented their genetically modified organism (GMO) model as part of their continuous assessment for general molecular biology course. The students worked in groups to design and construct the representations of various GMOs using recycled and reusable materials. The activity aimed to enhance students' understanding of genetic modification concepts while encouraging innovation and sustainable practices. Students recently demonstrated their creativity, scientific understanding, and environmental awareness. The presentation contained an abundance of material which clearly related to the main model project. The team worked well together to achieve the objectives. Each team member contributed in a valuable way to the project. This project also indicated a high level of mutual respect and collaboration.

Plastic? No Way!: Encouraging a Plastic-Free Campus Culture



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As part of BIOWAVE: The Sustainability Movement, BIOSMARTEAM launched the Plastic? No Way! campaign on 13 June 2026 to encourage the UiTM Kuala Pilah community to reduce the use of single-use plastics. The initiative highlighted how simple lifestyle changes can contribute to protecting the environment while promoting more sustainable habits on campus.

Throughout the campaign, educational posters, infographics and awareness materials were displayed to share practical information on reducing plastic waste. Students, staff and cafeteria vendors were also encouraged to support the initiative by using reusable food containers, tumblers and shopping bags instead of disposable plastic packaging.

The campaign served as a reminder that sustainability begins with everyday choices. By adopting reusable alternatives and reducing unnecessary plastic consumption, members of the campus community took a small but meaningful step towards creating a cleaner and more environmentally responsible university.

TRASH TO CASH (T2C) & 3R (REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE)



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The Trash to Cash (T2C) & 3R (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) program was conducted as a series of sustainability initiatives on 3 February, 11 May, 26 May, 6 June, and 20 June 2026. The activities were implemented through collaborations involving various stakeholders, including the Facilities Management Division (BPF), SWCorp, SWM Environment, the Student Representative Committee (JPK), the Biology Student Association (BIOSMARTEAM), and the local community, with different partners participating in different program sessions. The programme aimed to promote the practice of the 3Rs, encourage waste segregation at source, and enhance environmental sustainability awareness. Across the five programme series, a total of 2,120.00 kg of recyclable materials was collected, generating RM1,356.77 in revenue. The initiative successfully reduced waste, encouraged active participation from the campus community and local residents, and strengthened the university's commitment to a greener and more sustainable campus.
