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1.3 INTRODUCTION TO SAMARAHAN PLANTATION



Samarahan Plantations Sendirian Berhad is also known as Samarahan Estate is officially as a Private Limited Company on 15 January 1964. The company has established a lot of their history that develop themselves. The oil palm panting to effort their productive those make their own profit increase to Sarawak economy.

Before they established the Samarahan Plantation Limited at the same location, the Samarahan Rubber estate also cultivates planting the rubber at the same place. This because in the year 1961 they have to export their rubber planting to Kuching has increase in the amount \$83.3 million. The rubber planting is majority cultivated by Mr Shosuke (Japanese) since before the inhabiting Japanese on the year 1910.

However, due to the decreases of the rubber prices, bring into being Samarahan Rubber estate cannot to survive and eventually sold to the private owner of the Company Samarahan Limited or Company Samarahan Plantation Sdn. Bhd. that still exist now. Consequently, the establishment of the company Samarahan Plantation is one of the most important economic assets to economic development in Kuching.

1.4 First History before the Establishment

Before the established of the company Samarahan Plantation SdnBhd in 1964, the company has been owned by Japanese. They are Mr Shosuke (1911) and Mr Koreyoshi (1929). They are opened their own estate are named Nissa Shokai that are known as a Samarahan Rubber Estate at Kampung Senyawan (Seniawan), Samarahan. In the fact, the Japanese people are proving the important role of the history before the establishment of Samarahan Plantations Sdn Bhd.

1.5 History after establishment

After the Japanese giving up on 1945, Samarahan Rubber Estate has been taken away by Sarawak Government. Since it has taken away, Samarahan Rubber Estate also has change to Sarawak Rubber Fund Board. On the conference Julai 1953, are agreed by Sarawak Rubber Fund Committee that Samarahan Estate heritage Japanese with the area of 3,433 acres will be owned by Sarawak Rubber Fund Board (Sarawak Government). All the business is to recovery the rubber industry.
