#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

# 1.1 Background of Study

Tourism industry had become extremely important to the industry around the world. In fact, tourism industry becomes a second largest and fastest growing industry in our country. In order to diversify the economy and gain more income, Malaysia government has pushed to increase tourism in Malaysia.
