



Halmost a year in Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), this institution has my heart. I am eager to understand this gargantuan institution, and will continue to delve into UiTM's history, legacy, passion and aspirations. UiTM is unique, and I want it to remain so—an institution imbued with academic excellence led by a highly collaborative and driven community.

UiTM is the epitome of a great university because of its unique pioneering spirit. What truly separates UiTM from its peers is the willingness of its various communities to work together as one, to achieve a shared mission. I admire the collegiality that distinguishes UiTM. This dynamism, which fosters innovation, groundbreaking research, and transformative education is because the staff and students are always committed to providing the best, unifying us in whatever we do. Proud of its distinction, UiTM is also poised for growth and continued advancement. The university community understand that the challenges and opportunities facing us are too complex to be handled alone, and they are fully committed to cooperating among diverse partners to achieve progress. I am deeply drawn to UiTM's purpose, principles and values, and am honoured to join this community to face the challenges ahead.

UiTM, with its wealth of talents as a comprehensive university, is consistently ranked as the "university of choice" for many. UiTM offers great opportunities for its communities to excel. This is leveraged through our transdisciplinary approach and many active collaborations. Fostering diversity and inclusion is absolutely essential to an academic community. Thus, UiTM must become effective partners for global development. Only through the proliferation of networks between like-minded alliances can transformation occur at the scale that is required to advance our global knowledge and presence. We must open our eyes to this imminent future and transform our thinking to see UiTM as valuable idea generators with vast influence and the technical and intellectual know-how to manifest technologies and concepts that can change lives. Change is not easy. We must work together to build what we need, not simply replicate what has existed before, and I welcome UiTM community's ideas and feedback on the role of UiTM in advancing global development. At the recent QS Asia-Pacific Professional leaders (APPLE) 2019 Conference in Fukuoka, Japan in November 2019, we are proud to receive the Bronze Award for the Most Creative Corporate Institution Video. I also feel very privileged to be part of the 840 international observers invited to Uzbekistan to observe their parliamentary elections on 22 December 2019.

Today, we need to strategically work together to increase our global presence; we need to consider the interactive spaces, education mobility, and the growing dependency on technology. The academics faces many challenges. Understanding the millennial students and their learning preferences is one of these major challenges. The millennial generation have different characteristics. Using a broad range of traditional and technological approaches appears to improve the experience and increase the success rate of the millennial students. Students must be prepared to face the changing world, to be able to use their existing skills and quickly learn new ones to be active and relevant members of society. Academics and students alike must be imbued with 21st Century skills of being socially and digitally competent and must possess a high level of interpersonal and communicative competence. To have these, the curriculum is built to be both industry and community relevant, with future-driven content offered through multidisciplinary programmes and electives.

UiTM has actively embarked on IR 4.0 related initiatives for the past three years, starting from a campus-wide awareness campaign drive in 2016. It has 13 Data Analytics Labs on various campuses for data camp training programmes open to students from all faculties, as well as 21 Smart Classrooms that support the design and implementation of Active, Relevant, Interactive and Fun (ARIF) learning. Early this year, we launched the Pioneering University Framework of UiTM putting forth the provision of High End TVET programmes where UiTM will introduce emerging technology competencies in the diploma, degree and professional programmes such as Enabling Technologies for Industry 4.0 Revolution as stipulated by the National Policy on Industry 4.0 (Industry4WRD). Such learning materials are provided online for easy access and to encourage collaboration amongst a diverse group of learners. Currently, more than 500 Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) have been developed in UiTM. By 2021, it is expected that there will be a proliferation of MOOCs and microlearning courses that will allow students to have a learning buffet, with a cornucopia of courses taken out of interest or for further certification in related fields. UiTM has also drawn up an initiative branded as Education 5.0@UiTM that responds to IR 4.0 while emphasising the humanistic part of education. Education 5.0 is defined as a learning-centric ecosystem that is sustainable, balanced and principled, driven by values, powered by intellect, and afforded by new, ubiquitous technologies.

Industries have become more cautious and selective in choosing their workers. Companies typically want employees who are workplace ready. Though the competencies and skills required in the industry may not be formally taught on campus, the new work-force must be willing to learn and adapt. UiTM responds to this by nurturing highly-adaptive and responsive human resource. This is done through the cultivation of a new culture, change of mindsets, as well as constant reflection. To this end, UiTM signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with 14 industry partners on 5 December 2019. Numerous initiatives were developed, including research cooperation, information sharing and the drafting of policies on strategy and programme. The symbiotic relationship with external parties is nurtured as the community and industry impact the development UiTM. Rapid global and technological changes requires that UiTM be adaptable and versatile, whilst holding true to its core vision and mission.

To transform UiTM into a high-performing university requires having high-performing leaders, staff and students. For instance, internationalisation has enhanced UiTM's global visibility. This phenomenon is experienced through the students' and faculty members' mobility programmes and research collaboration. To achieve this, it is important to maintain sustainable international cooperation through international networking, partnerships, and strategic alliances. UiTM has recently sought collaborations with 9 educational institutions in Guizhou province, China. The various fields and areas of specialisation offered by UiTM had drawn the interest of these Chinese educational institutions. This opened up opportunities for wider sharing of knowledge, particularly for UiTM, in the fields of big data and artificial intelligence. To commemorate this relationship, the Chinese Ambassador to Malaysia, H.E. Bai Tian, presented a mock cheque worth RM410,000 to UiTM at the China Cultural Day to celebrate the 45th anniversary of diplomatic relations between China and Malaysia. The donation will cover the costs of special equipment and smart meeting rooms to be built at UiTM.

To further enhance our global presence, my team and I went to Tanzania in October to sign MoUs with Sumait University, Zanzibar, Tanzania and the Asian African Legal Consultative Organization (AALCO) focusing on the areas of staff and student mobility, internship placement, and sabbatical. I am also very proud to share that UiTM recently achieved a significant milestone in its achievement after being named as one of the 35 partner institutions listed in the "Lancet Countdown: Tracking Progress on Health and Climate Change 2019", a report published annually in The Lancet. It joins the ranks of leading academic institutions and United Nations agencies, namely University College London and the World Health Organisation. I commend the proactive international collaboration that UiTM has made to address climate change. With better understanding of the status and impact of climate change on health from international experts, UiTM hopes to boost trans-disciplinary research activities which can mitigate the current trend and create awareness of this very real environmental crisis.

I take this opportunity to express my heartfelt appreciation and gratitude to the Yang di-Pertuan Agong Al-Sultan Abdullah Ri'ayatuddin Al-Mustafa Billah Shah for bestowing upon me the Darjah Panglima Jasa Negara (PJN) in conjunction with his official birthday on 9 September 2019. I am extremely honoured and humbled to receive this prestigious recognition.

We have great challenges and great opportunities ahead, and with the hard work and commitment of the UiTM community, we will continue to be a distinguished university of choice for many!

# International Observer @ Uzbekistan Parliamentary Elections



# As a decade comes to an end


ne is struck by how fast ten years have gone.
What Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) has achieved in the last decade, its impact in the coming decades, but most importantly, how we as the largest educational institution in Malaysia has prepared ourselves for the onset of a new decade, a decade riddled with the one constant – change! Changes in the world, changes in the workforce, technology, academics, students, but most importantly changes in one's mindset and attitude.

UiTM leaves this decade heavily invested in Education 5.0@UiTM. Implemented in 2019 and expected to continue into the new decade, the fundamental principle here is learning for all parties involved, the university community, and our clients — the students. Powered by the heutagogical approach, education will be learner-focussed, learner-demonstrated and learner-driven. UiTM is striving for a seamless, personalised, and value-based learning to develop agile, creative, strong, principled, and progressive thinkers fitted with a global mindset. This is how we navigate the future.

Can we do it? The response is — Certainly! The rationale for this response is the vision the top management had and how it filtered down to the grassroots. In greeting the new millennium, UiTM offered the Flexible Learning

Programme (FLP), an online learning programme, to Malaysia, although the rest of the university still operated on a structured content with learner-centred activities. In other words, even though UiTM followed Education 3.0, pathways towards FLP were constructed. At the time FLP was being introduced, all faculties obtained ISO accreditation which succeeded in standardizing all procedures and documentations at the university. This quality movement has been very vigilant since then as we glided into 2010, stronger than ever.

UiTM went from structured content and learner centred activities (Education 3.0) to active, self-directed learners to Education 4.0, and now to Education 5.0 in a span of ten years. A tall order, indeed, and yet we are there. This is because a number of the principles of Education 5.0 had been introduced gradually into our curriculum from 2010 to 2019. Curriculum has been designed, adapted, and reviewed based on changes in the workforce requirement for the millennials. A curriculum review was carried out every 3 to 5 years so that the curriculum remains relevant. Auditors have shown up like clockwork every year to check academic and non-academic procedures and this ensured the smooth and efficient running of the institution.



The self-directed learner phase was very challenging for both instructors and students. It was trying for the instructors because students were unfamiliar with the concept of self-directed learning; they were used to being spoon-fed. We then had the issue of accessibility; students were unable to afford technology — computers, smartphones or WIFI. Over a ten-year span, however, technology became more affordable, exponentially spurring the use of the internet to gather information. A boon to Malaysians. Yet we faced another issue, the issue of the willingness to use technology to enhance the learning process. Instructors and students had to change their mindsets.

This is about the time when UiTM went from E-learning to blended learning and MOOC. The Ministry of Higher Education selected UiTM to develop over a hundred MOOC titles. Every faculty came up with at least 4 MOOC titles. Today UiTM has come up with an impressive number of titles. We then entered the phase when MOOC titles were sent to internal and national competitions; many a gold, silver and bronze medals were won. These competitions increased the creativity of instructors to use technology to enhance teaching and learning. This continues and is yet another indicator that we are ready for Education 5.0. Blended learning or "class without walls" has also been implemented for the past few semesters. i-Learn, as the university's official technological platform for technology, leads instructors in courses to enhance digital instruction by providing amazing technical support to all academic staff, especially to the digital migrants.

Globalisation of education for a sustainable future is an important international agenda. This, however, is not a new concept for UiTM. Our trans-border education

dates back to our inception in 1956 when RIDA and MARA College (our former names) offered the external professional courses by established international bodies, such as the London Chamber of Commerce, the Australian Chartered Secretaryship, the Australian Society of Accountants, and the British Institute of Management. We extended these international partnerships when we collaborated with Ohio University to offer the BBA programmes in the late 1960s through the 90s. UiTM is proud to claim the title of Pioneer of International Education in Malaysia.

Globalisation of education changes the fundamental conditions of an education system. We understand and have been addressing issues, trends, challenges, and the impact on education policies that globalisation can create in education. In this decade UiTM has moved by leaps and bounds to establish linkages with countries like China, USA, UK, Canada, Germany and Indonesia, to name a few. These linkages resulted in numerous events, the most recent being the China Cultural Day held in UiTM in December, 2019 and the inaugural Ambassadorial Lecture in October, 2019.

It has been a busy decade for UiTM. We are ready for Education 5.0, we have introduced openness in education, we have worked on our curriculum tirelessly, and auditors have kept us on our academic toes. i-Learn is there for technical support and we have been assertive about practicing globalisation of education. What this really means is that UiTM is ready to take on the new year, in fact, UiTM welcomes the new decade. We are eager to face the challenges the future has in store for us.

# FBM, UiTM walks away again with the GIFA Award

aculty of Business and Management (FBM) Universiti
Teknologi MARA (UiTM), Malaysia once again emerged
top for the Best Islamic Finance Qualification for its
Bachelor of Business Administration, BBA (Hons) Islamic
Banking programme, two consecutive years in a row. The award
by the Global Islamic Finance Awards (GIFA) was first awarded
to FBM in 2018 in Sarajevo, Bosnia Herzegovina. This year's
GIFA ceremony was held in Cape Town, South Africa, and FBM
emerged as a winner again.

GIFA is a global recognition which rewards the efforts made by FBM in providing talented human capital for the Islamic Finance industry, both locally and globally. Since 1999, FBM has been the pioneer for Islamic finance with its home-grown degree programme, BBA (Hons) Islamic Banking. The 3-year degree programme is designed to produce trained professionals in the Islamic banking and finance sector and offers fundamental courses such as 'understanding business' and higher level codes which teaches students to comprehend Islamic jurisprudence and apply the rules and regulations of the Al—Quran and Al—Sunnah to Islamic banking and financial theories and practices.

The success of this academic programme is based on UiTM's five important pillars of Education 5.0 which are: Coherent and Relevant Curriculum, Innovative Delivery and Assessment, Meaningful Learning Experience, Transformative Learning Environment and Inspiring Educators.

Graduates from this programme enjoy a wide range of job opportunities. They could either work as middle managers or executives in the banking and financial institutions as well as institutions dealing with insurance and property. FBM boasts a strong alumni of over 5,500 who work in the banking and finance sectors, in the ministries, government agencies, and private companies. FBM's graduate employability stands at a high of 80% which shows the ability of FBM graduates to find jobs or create jobs after acquiring their degrees.

Award



rof. Dr. Normah Omar, the Director of the Accounting Research Institute (ARI), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) was the proud recipient of the "GIFA Lifetime Achievement Award" at the 9th Global Islamic Finance Awards ceremony held in Cape Town, South Africa on 16th September 2019. The award is presented to an exceptional leader for their lifetime contribution to Islamic banking and finance.

The Chair of the awards selection committee, Prof. Dr. Humayon Dar, described the award as a celebration of Prof. Normah's achievements and contributions towards the development and expansion of the Islamic finance industry. Prof. Dar congratulated Normah for the significant strides she has made in thought leadership and in the implementation of world-class initiatives in the area of Islamic finance.

Normah is a pioneer researcher in Islamic Financial Criminology, and her passion for research in the area has contributed significantly in realising national aspirations to make Malaysia an Islamic financial hub. Under her leadership, the Accounting Research Institute (ARI) was awarded the status of Higher Institution Centre of Excellence (HICoE) by the Ministry of Higher Education Malaysia in 2010, and the centre continues to prioritise Islamic Finance in its high priority research agenda.

In 2017, Normah became the first woman elected by the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission to sit on the "Anti-Corruption Certification Programme". In addition to holding various positions at the national level, she has also pursued her passion in elevating the status of women entrepreneurs through the development of new Islamic finance products. She continues to mentor dozens of academics, and her advice is highly sought by influential thought leaders.

Normah is no stranger to awards. In 2016, she was named Game Changer of the Year by ACQ London; in 2017, she was recipient of both the Global Good Governance award for excellence in higher education in Dubai and the Advocacy of Islamic Financial Criminology award in Kazakhstan. Normah is indeed a shining example for women and has rightfully earned a place in the list of 10 most influential women in Islamic finance. In accepting the GIFA Lifetime Achievement Award, Normah expressed her thanks to the awards selection committee, and the top management of UiTM for the support shown to her over the years. She also expressed her gratitude to the Ministry of Education for its support of ARI as a Higher Institution Centre of Excellence.



Health and Climate Change is a multidisciplinary, international collaboration of 35 academic and United Nations' (UN) institutions around the world. Each year, the Lancet Countdown publishes its annual report in the most influential medical journal, The Lancet, providing updates to indicators of the present-day health effects of climate change, and the world's response. The report provides an assessment on the health effects of climate change, developments in the implementation of the 2016 Paris Agreement, and the health implications of these actions. It draws on the expertise of climate scientists, ecologists, mathematicians, economists, social and political scientists and doctors.

Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) was given the honour to launch this year's report, which was held at UiTM Puncak Alam on December, 12, 2019. The KL Launch event was officiated by the Vice Chancellor of UiTM, Emeritus Prof. Datuk Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim, and gathered more than 800 people including university students, researchers and scholars as well as members of the press. Also present were senior management members of UiTM.

This event marked a significant milestone to UiTM after being named as one of the 35 partner institutions listed in the "Lancet Countdown: Tracking Progress on Health and Climate Change 2019", a report published annually

in The Lancet. The report served as a global monitoring system on the links between climate change and health. The Lancet is one of the world's most prestigious general medical journal with an impact factor of 59.102. UiTM joined the ranks of leading academic institutions and United Nations agencies, namely University College London (UCL) and the World Health Organisation (WHO). This year's report featured UiTM's Faculty of Plantation and Agrotechnology, senior lecturer, Dr. Meisam Tabatabaei Pozveh as a lead collaborator in biofuel research. He presented the report with Dr. Nick Watts, the Executive Director of The Lancet Countdown and Assoc. Prof. Maxwell Boykoff, from the University of Colorado, Boulder, USA. The report outlined 41 indicators across 5 domains: climate change impacts; exposures and vulnerability; adaptation, planning and resilience for health; mitigation actions and health co-benefits; economics and finance, as well as public and political engagement.

The event emphasized the challenges faced concerning the growing impact of climate change on public health. UiTM is taking proactive roles to address climate change by giving its utmost attention to global warming issues. This event also provides opportunities for participants to formulate plans that can mitigate the current trend, create awareness and boost adaptation to face the environmental crises.

### UiTM at QS-APPLE 2019 Fukuoka, Japan

As education continues to reach global heights, QS Ranking is dedicated to helping universities worldwide achieve excellence in higher education and global recognition by organising innovative conferences, exhibitions, seminars and specials; as well as extensive publications in content and distribution.

QS-APPLE 2019, co-organised with Kyushu University, convened in Fukuoka, Japan on November 26 to 28, 2019. The conference and exhibition under the theme of Industrial Revolution 4.0 and Ageing Societies: The Changing Roles of Universities in the Asia-Pacific, gathered 669 academics from 247 institutions in 38 countries. 79 papers were presented during the plenary and parallel sessions and 70 exhibitors had the opportunity to showcase their universities at the QS Hub-Exhibition.

Delegates from the Universiti of Teknologi MARA (UiTM) comprised the Vice Chancellor, Emeritus Prof. Datuk Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim, Head of Nano Sci-Tech, Institute of Science (IOS), Prof. Ir. Dr. Mohamad Rusop Mahmood, Assistant Vice Chancellor for the Institute for Quality and Knowledge Development (INQKA), Prof. Dr. Roziah Mohd Janor and Director, Office of International Affairs (OIA), Dr. Hajah Zainab Haji Mohd Noor, .

During the convention, scholars around Asia Pacific debated on various issues in education and university management. Some of the topics include student mobility, global employability, challenges of internationalisation, Industrial Revolution 4.0, University branding, business incubation, and the impact of international projects on the quality of teaching, learning and assessment.

QS evaluated a total of 557 universities from 17 Asian countries to determine the rankings of Asian Universities for 2020. The results announced at the QS-APPLE 2019 conference positioned UiTM at 119th spot. This was a tremendous improvement for UiTM, moving up 18 places to 119th from 137th the previous year. The rankings were measured in 11 indicators which saw UiTM improving its position in 5 dimensions. The employer's reputation remains UiTM's strongest position at 53rd in Asia. This proves that UiTM graduates still hold a place in the heart of employers in Malaysia. The international research network is the university's second major strength, which ranks at 68th in Asia. Meanwhile, academic reputation improved to 90th place compared to 97th last year. In addition, student mobility indicator showed an increase of 132 steps to be at 141st spot this year. The improvement in these 5 indicators was a result of the synergised efforts of UiTM staff, students, and management in developing, aligning and implementing strategies and initiatives towards achieving high performing university status. 2019 was a windfall year, whereby simultaneously, UiTM also bagged the bronze award for the Most Creative Corporate Institution Video category.

The convention helped build UiTM networking space with universities throughout Asia Pacific and strengthened existing networks. Participants gained valuable insights and shared their knowledge through the innovative and engaging conference activities. # UiTM's Faculty of Education Professor becomes a leader in Instructional Technology in Asia

Prof. Dr. Hajah Nor Aziah Haji Alias, from the Faculty of Education, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), bagged the Gold Award for the EdTech Leadership in Asia for Tertiary Education category at the EduTECH Asia Awards 2019. The award places Aziah as a leader in the use of instructional technology in Asia.

EduTECH Asia 2019, Asia's largest education conference and exhibition, was held at Suntec Singapore from 4th-6th November 2019. EdTech Leadership in Asia for Tertiary Education is one of the 16 award categories which saw 8 finalists from across Asia competing for either gold, silver and bronze awards.

Aziah attributed her win to her 20-year effort of advocating the use of technology to support effective instructional activities. An alumna of the University of Southern Queensland, Australia, she was fascinated with the online mode of learning during her university days. Surfing the Internet was altogether a new experience back then. She discovered that technology offered enormous opportunities for educators to rethink and reshape their instructional approaches and activities.

Her overarching teaching philosophy is 'All man [sic] can and will learn' and believes strongly that "the integration of technology can enhance the way learners approach their learning". She also feels that technology is most beneficial when it helps to instigate change in learners. Not only does technology enhance teachers' pedagogy and instructional activities, it also transforms learners' perspectives towards learning.

Technology continuously shapes and reshapes learning contexts and the manner in which learners engage in learning. However, she is quick to warn that one has to

be cautious with the use of technology, reminding that technology is only useful when it serves a higher purpose.

Aziah's research area is Information Communication Technology (ICT) for Development, focussing on how technology can cater to the learning needs of specific learning groups such as adult learners, senior citizens, learners with special needs, and marginalised learners in remote areas.

On bridging technology to education, Aziah is optimistic that technology will help solve many issues and challenges in education, particularly those concerning access and equity. Much can be accomplished if one is open to new ways of doing things.



he LOVE and passion for solar cars have brought 2 young mechanical engineering undergraduates from Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) together for Bridgestone World Solar Challenge in Australia from Oct 13 to 20, 2019.

With 9 of their peers, Muhamamad Syazwan Johari and Muhammad Adli Zaid are third-generation members of EcoPhoton Solar Racing Team, a student-run project in UiTM. Team leader Syazwan, 23, said EcoPhoton is a team of brave and energetic students, who are willing to chase their dreams. He said at the moment, the solar car project was the biggest student project with a cumulative budget of RM1.3 million since 2015.

Reminiscing about the birth of EcoPhoton, he said the team was founded in 2014 by their senior, Azwan Abdullah, with the aim of making UiTM a leading university in solar vehicle technology in Malaysia. Syazwan said raising funds during that time was nearly impossible because not many Malaysians were willing to invest in green technology. "Nevertheless, Azwan and his first-generation team worked hard and were able to participate in the 2015 Bridgestone World Solar Challenge with their first car named Stingray. The second-generation team, led by Ungku Muhammad Zulhilmi, incorporated more technological improvements in their car, which was named Tuah. The car featured a wireless monitoring system that allowed real-time data collection," said Syazwan, who also took part in the challenge last year.

As EcoPhoton is gearing up for another year of excitement, Syazwan is busy leading his team in developing their latest car named Tigris. He also helps in getting sponsorships, while making sure that targets and guidelines are implemented.

The Bridgestone World Solar Challenge is a renowned race. For over 30 years, the Bridgestone World Solar Challenge has welcomed the greatest minds from around the world to Australia to push the limits of technological innovation and travel the outback in a vehicle powered only by the energy of the sun.

Traversing 3,000km from Darwin to Adelaide, teams comprised of tertiary and secondary students from over 30 countries. These students and their support team have achieved greatness by engineering and building a vehicle with their own hands and powering it across some of the world's most challenging landscape. In 2017, the Bridgestone World Solar Challenge celebrated its 30th Anniversary. The 2019 competition marked the 15th journey from the Top End to Adelaide.



Syazwan said the participating teams needed to travel 3,000 km from Darwin to Adelaide in 5 days, and the cars must not be powered by anything other than the sun. "The race is all about compiling a great strategy by taking into account things like the wind speed, sunlight intensity, road slopes, car speed, air density and even the traffic. All this data is useful to create a race strategy that allows us to reduce journey time without using too much energy. A cruising speed of 70kph is usually the best as it requires little energy from the sun, but still allows our car to catch up with other teams," he added. A non-technical leader Adli, 22, believed their team represented the university in terms of its latest application of solar technology in the automotive sector. "That is the reason why the mechanical engineering students, under the supervision of lecturers, entered the race, which is to embrace the importance of solar technology," he said.

Adli oversees the progress of his team and keeps track of the productivity of the non-technical department. Syazwan said if he were to list down everything that he learned, it would surely be a long list. He said he had gained a lot of knowledge that he would not get in the classroom, including soft skills. "For example, in the classroom, you will not be taught how incoming wind speed may affect the power consumption of the solar vehicle. But in this team, I've learned a lot about it and could even produce a near-perfect simulation strategy for the race. As for the team members, the best they can get is experience. There is no other student project that can match the level of teamwork we have in fabricating the car and racing it in Australia." Adli said from the management perspective, this challenge did not only require technical skills and knowledge. "It also needed great problem-solving and critical-thinking skills. Building my team is one of my visions," he added.

Syazwan, who idolises Elon Musk for his creative and innovate ideas, especially in electric vehicles, said when he first joined EcoPhoton, he, was not sure whether he could make his team's solar car work. "I had these crazy ideas on how I could fix the wiring, electronic circuits, install signal lights, horns and batteries. During that moment, I knew I wanted to be part of the team and pushed myself to my limit." He added that the best thing he learned in the race was to use something "simple and usable".

In the continuous effort to make Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) visible on the international stage, Dr. Hajah Zainab Haji Mohd Noor, the Director of Office of International Affairs (OIA), UiTM was selected to attend the MyUKHECEP 2019 programme in London, England from 30th September to 4th October 2019. MyUKHECEP2019 is a strategic collaboration of higher education between Malaysia and United Kingdom. The 5-day intensive programme had the following objectives:

To further strengthen higher education bilateral cooperation between Malaysia and the United Kingdom especially on academic and research collaborations by connecting Malaysian universities with UK institutions and relevant agencies.

- Academic collaborations Establishment of jointly-awarded/dual degree programmes, sharedmodules/curriculum, appointment of external examiner and supervisory committee, international conferences, mobility of students and staff (Go International, Erasmus + ) and other forms of academic collaborations;
- Research collaborations Research projects under the Newton-Ungku Omar Fund and UK Research and Innovation (UKRI), joint funding applications for the Horizon 2020 and other global scale research programmes, commercialisation of research/ innovations and development of start-ups; and other forms of research and innovation collaborations;

This programme also serves as a platform to enhance the exchange of information and best practices in the internationalisation of higher education in both countries.

### **UiTM** Collaborates with AALCO

o strengthen UiTM's role internationally, a working visit to Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania was made in October 2019. It explored collaboration with the assistance of the Asian-African Legal Consultative Organization (AALCO). The AALCO, as the only intergovernmental organisation representing Asia and Africa, has directed most of its activities to complement the work of the United Nations in several areas especially the International Law Commission and the Sixth Committee of the UN General Assembly. The UiTM's delegation consist of the Vice Chancellor, the Deputy Vice Chancellor of Industry Community Alumni and Networking (ICAN), the CEO of Institute of Continuing Education and Professional Studies (iCEPS), the Director of the Office of International Affairs (OIA) and the Director of Community Network Centre.

The delegates were invited to attend the 58th Annual Session of AALCO which took place at the Julius Nyerere Convention Centre in Dar Es Salaam from 21 to 25 October 2019. The conference was attended by representatives from 25 Member States of AALCO and 13 Non-Member States and International Organisations as observer delegations. This was the third time that the United Republic of Tanzania hosted the Annual Session of AALCO.

During the conference, Member States and observer delegations deliberated on organisational and substantive matters which included the Report of the Secretary General on the Work of AALCO, 2020 budget, and the Report on the Work of AALCO's Regional Arbitration Centres where resolutions were adopted along with the adoption of the Chairman's Report of the Fourth Meeting of the Open-Ended Working Group on International Law in Cyber-space.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was also sealed between AALCO and UiTM during the first general meeting of the Annual Session. UiTM was represented by its Vice Chancellor, Emeritus Prof. Datuk Ir. Dr. Mohamad Azraai Kassim while AALCO was represented by the Secretary General of AALCO, H.E. Prof. Dr. Kennedy Gastorn. The MoU looks into academic collaborations, mobility programme for UiTM students for practical or industrial training, and opportunities for faculty members to carry out attachments in International Law. This partnership makes UiTM the only public higher education institution in Malaysia to explore international relations with African countries.

UiTM delegation led by UiTM's Vice Chancellor was in Tanzania for a working visit from 18 to 27 October 2019. "El-yurt umidi" Foundation for training specialists abroad and the dialogue with compatriots under the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan was established by the Decree of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan in September 25, 2018. Currently, the foundation acts as the Agency for the Development of Public service under the office of the President of the Republic. In compliance with the decree of the President, as of January 4, 2019, the Foundation, in cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Uzbekistan and diplomatic missions abroad, has been cooperating with leading higher education institutions and scientific research centres around the world. Since its inception, the Foundation has reached agreements with a number of international organisations, and continues negotiations.

Foundation Director Mr. A. Bekmuradov welcomed delegates from Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) on December 23, 2019, at the Foundation. The Vice-Chancelllor, Emeritus Prof. Datuk Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim was accompanied by a few senior officers. Bekmuradov underlined that Malaysian universities such as UiTM, have been instrumental in contributing to the development of Uzbek-Malaysian ties in higher education and science. # UiTM and Silk Road International University of Tourism

### SARAJEVO HALAL FAIR 2019

The Sarajevo Halal Fair (SHF) 2019 took place at the Skenderija Center in the capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina on September 26-28. The fair was attended by more than 10,000 visitors, with 108 exhibitors from 36 countries. The fair is an international halal industry exhibition that brings together representatives from all sectors of the halal industry supply chain, including private companies, public listed corporations, accreditation bodies, government officials, and other halal market representatives.




Her Excellency's presence at the lecture could strengthen and extend further bilateral ties between Canada and Malaysia, particularly in engaging with UiTM in education and research.

# MOE Workshop for International Office 2019

The Office of International Affairs (OIA) of Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) was honoured to participate in the International Workshop for International Office 2019, held on 7 to 8 October 2019, at the Royale Chulan Hotel, Penang. The workshop was co-hosted by the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Malaysia and SEAMEO Rihed in collaboration with the ASEAN International Mobility for Students (AIMS). Malaysian universities including UiTM, Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP), Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS), Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM), Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM) and Universiti Malaysia Terengganu (UMT) participated in the workshop.

Head of International Student Development (ISD), Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ing. Masria Mustafa, Head of International Cooperation, Training and Development (ICTD), Dr. Idaya Husna Mohd, Senior Assistant Registrar, Srieliana Hilmi and Executive Officer, Nurhidayah Elias from UiTM participated in the workshop, along with over 100 participants from more than 20 higher education institutions in Malaysia and Southeast Asia.

The workshop was held with the objectives of enhancing capacity building in managing the International Office, nurture intercultural competencies and international understanding, impart knowledge and experience on various best practices, introduce and share knowledge on issues in managing an International Office and enhance skills in organising international students' activities. During the 2-day workshop, three important topics relating to internationalisation namely, cultural immersion and student experience, governance and management, and networking and collaboration were deliberated on.

Prof. Dr. Rahmah Ahmad H. Osman, Director, Education Malaysia Division delivered the opening address and officially launched the International Workshop for International Office 2019. Rahmah highlighted on the importance of the internationalisation of higher education and emphasized that leaders of higher education institutions should define clearly their missions and operational goals. She also expressed her gratitude to



the workshop committee for their effort and hard work to make the event a success. Following that, keynote speakers from the universities shared their experiences and challenges on internationalisation. Prof. Dr. Abdul Latiff Ahmad (UKM), Dr. Mohd Hafizal Mohd Isa (USM), Mr. Shahinuddin Shariff, CEO of Education Malaysia Global Services (EMGS) and Mdm Sharon Gursham Kaur from INOCREST.

The active discussions resulted in the formulation and adoption of internationalisation strategies with concrete aims and measurable targets which can contribute to the success of the internationalisation objectives of each participating institution.

Masria Mustafa, Head of International Student Development (ISD), Office of International Affairs (OIA) led a delegation of University Teknologi MARA (UiTM) officials to the 13th Annual Review Meeting of Asian International Mobility for Students (AIMS) Programme in Bangkok from 11 to13 November 2019. The delegation included Dr. Rozzana Mohd Said, Coordinator Student Exchange (OIA) and 3 deans, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ahmad Mazli Muhammad, dean of the Academy of Language Studies (APB), Assoc. Prof. Dr. Siti Halijjah Shariff, dean of the Faculty of Business and Management and Assoc. Prof. Dr Nabilah Abdullah, Dean of the Faculty of Education. Nur Halimahtun Izzati Samsudin, one of two Malaysian AIMS Ambassadors to participate in a student forum session, joined them later.

The highlight of the annual meeting was the RIHED 60th Anniversary and AIMS 10th Anniversary Ceremony held on the first day of the meet. Delegates were presented with flags of SEAMEO countries, SEAMEO song and colours, video presentation on RIHED's history and development as well as a video of AIMS 10th Year Anniversary. This meeting also witnessed the launch of the new AIMS logo.

The delegates witnessed the signing ceremony of the new AIMS Letter of Intent by member countries, and introduced a new member country, Singapore. Later, a successful alumnus from Thailand shared his experience as an AIMS participant in Malaysia. The day ended with the announcement of winners of AIMS Student Speech Contest, in which Malaysia was represented by a student from UKM. The winner was a student from Thailand. The second day began with the Centre Director of SEAMEO RIHED, Dr Chantavit Sujatanond presenting a report of the 10-year journey of AIMS. Then came the presentation of results of a study on experiences and outcomes of students participating in AIMS programme followed by a presentation of reports on national achievement and future expectations of member countries. The plenary session with the topic, "Future of AIMS: What is the AIMS programme you wish to see?" was presented by Dr Sujatanond. It was followed by the "AIMS Café: Future of AIMS" in which participants shared ideas on how to make AIMS better and suggestions

on how to raise funds after cuts from the government.

Networking sessions by study fields and country were held after that. The day ended with AIMS Night, a cocktail dinner event filled with fun and laughter, accompanied by live band performances from Kasetsart University.

AIMS student forum entitled Redefining Mobility in the Disruptive Era was held on the 3rd day of the meeting. Malaysia was represented by 2 students from UiTM and University of Malaya respectively. The students made suggestions and recommendations on how mobility should be conducted and how they can contribute towards the betterment of mobility programme in the era of technology and global awareness. A sharing session from other mobility schemes such as Erasmus, UMAP, Campus Asia, SHARE and Asian Foundation was held thereafter. Another crucial forum on the topic of "Employability: Students' Visions and the Future of Work" chaired by the Programme Director, Ms Punyanuch Pattanoi was also held. The meeting culminated with the closing ceremony and the announcement of the next venue for AIMS annual meeting which will be in the Philippines.

Masria and Rozzana made several networking visits to four offices: the International Office of Thammasart University, the Office of United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP). the Office of ASEAN University Network/Southeast Asia Engineering Education Development Network (AUN/SEED-Net) and the Chulalongkorn University Transport Institute. The visits encouraged more international partnerships and new collaborations with international agencies and universities in Thailand. It also provided new alternatives for international research funding and scholarships for academic stints at international level. More importantly, the visits addressed multiple strategic goals to shape UiTM's educational, programmatic, funding and overall international strategic decisions. Kudos to OIA for initiating the move.



## UiTM on making 4.0 the Erasmu Programme

rasmus+ is the European Union's (EU) programme to support education, training, youth and sports in ■ Europe. The aim of Erasmus+ is to contribute to the Europe 2020 strategy for growth, jobs, social equity and inclusion, and promote the aims of ET2020, the EU's strategic framework for education and training. Erasmus+ also aims to promote the sustainable development of its partners in the field of higher education, and contribute to achieving the objectives of the EU Youth Strategy. Specific issues addressed by the programme include: Reducing unemployment, especially among young people; Promoting adult learning, especially for new skills and skills required by the labour market; Encouraging young people to take part in European democracy; Supporting innovation, cooperation and reform; Reducing early school leaving; and Promoting cooperation and mobility with the EU's partner countries.

Its overall budget of €14.7 billion provides opportunities for over 4 million Europeans to study, train, and gain experience abroad. Set to last until 2020, Erasmus+ offers opportunities for students and a wide variety of individuals and organisations. In addition, € 1.68 billion is budgeted for funding actions with third countries (partner countries) through the EU's external action budget. This allows overall mobility opportunities of more than 4 million people in the world in various disciplines.

Malaysia is one of the partner countries to secure Erasmus+ research fund via 7 researchers at Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM). The Institute of Research Management and Innovation (IRMI) UiTM hosted the 3rd Meeting on MAKING4.0 for Kuala Lumpur and Sabah on December 2-3, 2019. The main agenda of the meeting was to update the Work Packages and the deliverables. The agenda included revisiting the status of the Memorandum of Agreement (MoA), checking Guideline of funding (EU and Malaysian Treasurer) (including VAT, Monthly Timesheets and Open tender procedures), Equipment Acquisition Plan, Reviewing Programme Learning Outcomes (PLO) proposed by CETEM and Code of Practice for Programme Accreditation (COPPA). Visits were made to LY Furniture Sdn Bhd in Muar, Wood Industry Skills Development Centre (WISDEC) in Kota Kinabalu, Politeknik Kota Kinabalu, World Trend Garden Furniture in Kota Kinabalu, and Sogoraya Sdn Bhd in Kota Kinabalu.

The research grant is funded by the Erasmus+ Programme – Cooperation for innovation and the exchange of good practices: Key Action 2 - Capacity building in the field of higher education (Erasmus+ KA2-CBHE). The Grant Agreement amount is EUR 947.450,00 and the allocation for the UiTM research group was EUR 101.991,00 a collaborative effort between the various higher learning institutions in Malaysia with their international partners such as Universidad Politécnica de Cartagena (UPCT), Spain, Warsaw University of Life Sciences (WULS), Poland, Karlsruhe Institute of Technology (KIT), Germany, and Asociación Empresarial Centro Tecnológico del Mueble y la Madera de la Región de Murcia, (CETEM), Spain. This group also collaborates with Malaysian partners namely Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM), and Malaysian Timber Industry Board (MTIB).

The UiTM research members are Assoc. Prof. Dr. Shahriman Zainal Abidin (Principal Investigator) and team members Prof. Dr. Azmi Ibrahim, Dr. Aruan Efendy Mohd Ghazali, Dr. Mohammad Azroll Ahmad, Dr. Shahril Anuar Bahari, and Mohd Shaleh Mujir. Their research is entitled Improving Malaysian HE Knowledge towards a Wood and Furniture Industry 4.0 – MAKING4.0.

In this particular research project, the team need to establish a European-Malaysian collaborative consortium with the objective of developing a Master's Degree programme for engineers of smart furniture factories. It will focus on the ICT skills needed to increase the competitiveness of the wood and furniture industry of Malaysia. Such research endeavours is proof of Malaysia's continued work in nurturing the research culture amongst young academics. It is hoped that this research excellence and collaborations will continue in order to enhance Malaysia's global scientific research commitments.

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# UiTM's Breakthrough to Redefining Neuro-Rehabilitation



hile gaming devices have and can be used as a treatment for stroke rehabilitation, the "off the shelf" games are not specific enough to focus on the rehabilitation goals such as cognitive improvement, balance and gait recovery and neglect post stroke as examples. Sometimes, therapy is limited due to various constraints such as affordability, human resources, and infrastructure, adding challenges in delivering the rehabilitation programme.

This became the driving force for UiTM's rehabilitation physician, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Fazah Akhtar Hanapiah, to design serious games with a specific function which are more virtual and moves away from the physical - the Medical Rehabilitation Virtual Reality (MRVR) platform. Fazah says that the serious games give patients the opportunity to fully immerse in a safe environment for recovery and training. For example, bimanual hand and balance training while carrying a cup on a tray can be challenging for an individual post stroke. Regaining the skills will require practice with carrying objects on trays. Patients prefer VR training as this eliminates the "fear factor" of spilling or breaking the cups and tray. They can also immerse the patients in an environment that is controllable with different levels of complexity, depending on the capability of the individual undergoing rehabilitation.

A medical doctor at the Faculty of Medicine UiTM and also a fellow at I-PPerForM (Institute of Pathology, Laboratory and Forensic Medicine), she wanted "to improve the outcome of patients with complex disability and see them get better". A good eco-system between R&D and deliverance to the required community is crucial for the sustainability of such projects. VR can address the gaps to deliver rehabilitation in an enriched environment with high fidelity.

This is one of the untapped areas of research in the world and UiTM is one of the pioneers with a comprehensive and multidisciplinary expert team comprising of medical doctors, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, clinical psychologists, computer scientists and VR experts from the industry (Motiofixo Sdn Bhd).

Fazah's breakthrough of this MRVR incorporated VR technology to gamify rehabilitation medicine and create a platform that encourages patients to fully engage in therapy be it hospital/community-based, or home-based. VR is one of the ways in which treatment can be brought to the doorstep, thus bringing technology to the person in need.

In a recent video that featured her team and a stroke patient in a rural setting in Malaysia, the innovation with the high-powered technology, combined with the human spirit provided by the family and friends aided a 57-year old stroke victim's recovery. They conducted a pilot study using VR by engaging the patient into weekly immersive rehabilitation, comprising of cognitive stimulation in an enriched multisensory environment, challenging him in multiple scenarios for dual cognitive tasks, setting up dexterity training for physical upper limb function and lower limb function (walking and balancing trays, transferring eggs into a basket from a chicken coop etc).

According to Fazah, "the reason for trying virtual reality was due to my passion in research with rehabilitation technology and also I wanted to do something impactful and meaningful for my patients and their families." This MRVR (Medical Rehabilitation VR) programme is currently in the research prototype stage in collaboration with Faculty of Computer and Mathematical Sciences, Faculty of Health Sciences in UiTM and a private Creative and Multimedia agency Motiofixo Sdn. Bhd.

### Prestigious Diamond Award Research on "Humidity Sensor Based on Novel Nickel Oxide Nanocarnation"



The team took home the most prestigious Diamond Award and also the Bank Islam Malaysia Berhad (BIMB) Grand Award and the Gold Award

Tr. Ts. Dr. Mohamad Hafiz Mamat and his team from the Faculty of Electrical Engineering, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), Malaysia bagged the most prestigious Diamond Award at the 2019 Invention, Innovation and Design Exposition held in Shah Alam, Malaysia. During the Exposition, held from 10 to 15 September 2019, the team did not only take home the most prestigious Diamond Award but also the Bank Islam Malaysia Berhad (BIMB) Grand Award and the Gold Award. The project entitled 'Humidity Sensor based on Novel Nickel Oxide Nanocarnation-like Structure Synthesized via Low-Temperature Immersion Approach', proposed a highly-sensitive humidity sensor, with long-term stability, using facile sol-gel spin coating and low temperature immersion approach.

The following week, the same industrious team won a Gold Award at the 2019 International Conference and Exposition on Inventions which is organised by Institutions of Higher Learning (PECIPTA), held at Universiti Tun Hussein Onn Malaysia. The gold medal for the project titled 'Ultra-Sensitive Humidity Sensor based on Coral Reed Surface inspired Heterogenous ZnO/SnO2 Nano-mixture Film' highlighted a low-cost, highly-sensitive humidity sensor which was developed using eco-friendly techniques.

PECIPTA is a bi-annual programme organised by the Ministry of Education, Malaysia and its partner institutions since 2001, to showcase innovative products and services from institutions of higher learning (IHL) in Malaysia, while IIDEX is an annual international exhibition and competition organised by UiTM to highlight inventions, innovations and designs produced by local and international researchers.



Entitled the Al Jazeera Ambassador Initiatives, MassComm students took a 3-day course on documentary filmmaking, investigative journalism, data journalism, TV reporting, and mobile journalism. These tailor-made courses were designed to simulate the demanding pressure of the work, giving attention to detail as well as meticulous fact finding. The endgame for this workshop is to prepare future content creators to adapt and adopt best practices in the media industry.

With IR 4.0 already making waves, classroom should be retro-fitted differently. The faculty initiative to engage with industry-players should be the benchmark for others. Long gone are the days of only chalk and board. Real events should be turned into case studies discussed and debated in class and students should be constantly vigilant to these. The UiTM x Al Jazeera week was a crucial turning-point for a positive industry-academia partnership.

In line with UiTM's international agenda, the Faculty of Communication and Media Studies (FCMS) has embarked on several internationalisation projects. Partnerships that are impactful for both faculty and university are sought. FCMS believes it is crucial to build strategic global partnerships with industry, communities, universities, and research institutes to do research or activities that can change and improve lives.

The successful execution of Al Jazeera X MassComm Week 2019 from 7 to11 October 2019 led to other collaborations. Various meetings, both online and offline, were held to develop a Master's in Business Administration (MBA) programme in Media Management. It is a work-in-progress between FCMS, Al Jazeera and the Arshad Ayub Graduate Business School (AAGBS) to develop a new post-graduate programme curriculum expected to attract media practitioners.

In the current media challenges facing the industry, working practitioners need to be equipped with multidisciplinary knowledge. The curriculum will focus on the new media challenges of the 21st century, for example, the dangers of citizen reporting which has taken over formal media reporting. The responsible use of technology, media operations, and quality



management of media facilities will be other elements of the programme. FCMS believes that this partnership with AAGBS and Al Jazeera will be an impactful partnership driven by strategic alliances and sustainable long-term relationship with a world-renowned industry player and a trusted education provider. A series of meetings were held between representatives from FCMS, AAGBS and the Curriculum Affairs Unit (UHEK) from August 2019 to discuss and work out all curricular and logistical issues for such a unique programme.

The most recent meeting was held in Doha, Qatar from 2-5 December 2019. Two representatives from UiTM's MBA programme team – Dr. Yuslinda Mat Yassin (FCMS) and Dr. Wahida Ahmad (AAGBS) were invited by Al Jazeera Media Institute (AJMI) to discuss matters further. The faculty hopes to see this programme come to fruition in September 2020. With partnerships come shared successes and risks, therefore good partnerships are about the alignment of core values and culture, a shared vision for the desired outcomes, an agreed-upon means to measure progress and a value proposition whose worth is greater than the sum of its parts. Therefore, this collaboration between MassComm, Al Jazeera and AAGBS can be classified as partnering for impact.




16265 kilometers! That was how far, friends and classmates, Amirah Syakirah Md. Hadzaid and Amalia Amirullah, now Seniors at the Faculty of Communication and Media Studies (FCMS) had to travel to unlock their next achievement in life – to become exchange students at the prestigious London School of Public Relations (LSPR) in Jakarta, Indonesia.

Both of them had been voicing out concerns as to how best they could optimise their experience in Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) besides going back and forth to classes and mulling over books and preparing for tests and exams. Out of curiosity, they went to meet the faculty's international liaison officer, Mr. Muhammad Fadhli Abdul Rahman to ask about any opportunities abroad, and the rest was history.

Dealing with the important paperwork was daunting enough, not to mention they needed the grades to even be considered. Both of them were very lucky to be part of the Public Relations programme (MC242) student body, the Institute of Public Relations Students' Association (IPRMSA) — Shah Alam chapter, the oldest student body at the faculty. Coupled by their commendable grades and active participation in the classroom, as well as ably assisted by Fadhli and the Office of International Affairs (OIA) UiTM, their outbound application went through.

Every day was a brand new experience for Amirah and Amalia. Accustomed to the ways back home, both of them had to recalibrate their cultural clock. The courses were also run differently at LSPR. The study plan at FCMS is straight-forward and very Public Relationscentric. At LPSR, participants have the freedom to choose the courses they are interested in outside of the credit transfers. From LSPR's point of view, the study of Public Relations should not be limited to the fundamentals, but to include the study of policies and law, regulatory processes, climate change, and the creative arts. It took Amirah and Amalia a few days to acclimatise to the new milieu. They first realised that whilst Indonesia and Malaysia can be considered as sister countries, just like the US and Canada, and have similarities, there are enough differences to make adapting quite a job.

Studying abroad required that they push limits. They were dragged out of their comfort zone every day. They got acquainted with the politics of learning, living, and life. Once they caught the rhythm of things, life as exchange students got better. Similar to the course structure for assignments back in FCMS, a good majority of their assignments were also industry-based. Going on visits to PR agencies and making mock presentations in class to doing edits and write-ups were part of their lives at LPSR. Amalia and Amirah were both very grateful for the opportunities bestowed upon them. They enjoyed the whole experience immensely.

Poreign Direct Investment Arbitration Moot (FDI Moot) is an annual moot competition organised throughout the world. This prestigious competition is a premier international investor-state arbitration moot which is a well-known and much awaited event every year. Universities from various countries have been participating in this competition since it was established in 2008.

There are two stages involved within 6 months of the competition which are the Regional and Global Rounds.

Teams from various universities first compete in their respective regions and the winning teams would be eligible to participate and compete in the Global Rounds.

Faculty of Law, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) was represented by Muhammad Amir Haikal Mohamad Adnan as the Team Captain, Nur Fatihah Mohamed Azahari, Amirah Nabihan and Sarah Azahar. These students succeeded in the Regional Rounds which were held in Seoul, South Korea from the 20 to 23 August, 2019. With this win, they secured a place in the Global Rounds which was held on 7 to 9 November 2019 in Miami, Florida, U.S.A. They were trained by the Faculty of Law's Moot coach, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Irwin Ooi Ui Joo, Dr. Shahrizal Mohd Zin and an alumnus of the Faculty of Law, Sarilnezam Salleh. The team was later joined by another student, Nur Fathin Amira Binti Sapawi. The team was divided into two parties; namely the Claimant and the Respondent, which will be represented by two mooters respectively. The team was also required to submit Memorials for both the Claimant and the Respondent prior to the oral hearing as their written submissions.

After 2 days of preliminary hearings, the team had the privilege of going against four law schools from Germany, Brazil, Kenya and Miami. The team emerged as the 11th ranked team among 54 teams, from 31 different countries. The team had also successfully secured the 9th place for the Claimant Memorials, with 2 of the mooters, Amirah Nabihan and Sarah Azahar securing their spots in the Top 50 of Best Advocates.

In this arbitration moot competition, a hypothetical problem (moot problem) involving an investor-state dispute was created by the assigned committee which contains the facts, disputes and grounds to be argued before a Tribunal. The dispute would focus on a situation where a State has violated its obligation under the Bilateral Investment Treaty (BIT) causing an investor or investors to suffer losses.

Participating teams send their representatives to each round as counsels for the Claimant or Respondent. The issues that were presented and mooted before the Tribunal pertain to the Jurisdiction of the Tribunal to hear the case and the Merits of the case which are normally concerned with expropriation and the right of the investors to fair and equitable treatment. The FDI Moot is a great platform that offers a unique forum where future lawyers come together not only to discover emerging talents, but also contribute to the development of investment arbitration as a whole. Mooters would have the opportunity to meet and learn from diverse groups of people and expand their legal knowledge particularly in international investment law.

# UiTM Computing goes Global with Birmingham, UK

he Faculty of Computer & Mathematical Sciences (UiTMComputing), extended its academic collaboration through a strategic partnership with the University of Birmingham, United Kingdom for the Bachelor of Computer Science Degree Programme. A Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) for a three-year period was signed by Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic and International), Prof. Ts. Dr. Mohamad Kamal Harun and University of Birmingham, Computer Science degree coordinator, Dr. Ian Kenny on 5 September 2019.

Selected students will study for 3 semesters at UiTM and 4 semesters at the University of Birmingham. They will also receive a scholarship (20%) of the total fees payable. Students who graduate from this programme will receive two bachelor's degrees, one from UiTM and one from the University of Birmingham.

Kamal added that the idea of creating such a collaboration came from the rapid growth in the digital world. "Therefore, we are taking the opportunity to form partnerships with foreign universities as a strategy to produce computer science graduates who are relevant to current and future technological needs," he said. The annual target is to have at least five students to study at Birmingham University, UK.

Dual programmes have been offered in UiTM since 2014 for degree, masters and PhD programmes. Other international dual programmes are with SRH Heidelberg University, Germany (Master Science International Business and Environmental Engineering), Hoschule Fur Technik Stuttgart University of Applied Sciences (Master of Arts in General Management), and University of National and World Economy (UNWE), Bulgaria (PhD in Economics). Kamal added that "these collaborations will enhance the quality of education and research at UiTM to global standards".



## Japan Internship Programme for Final Year Student

s. Nur Khalila Khairuddin, a Final Year student of Information Systems Management Programme (IM245), Faculty of Information Management, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), was a successful candidate out of 24,000 applicants from the OECD/DAC-listed countries and is one of seven selected candidates from Malaysia. The internship programme hosted by Far East Inc. Saitama Prefecture, was from 7 November to 17 December 2019.

According to Dr. Mohd Ridwan Seman, a senior lecturer from the Faculty of Information Management, and Khalila's Academic Advisor, the Japan Internship Programme is the first international internship programme participated by the FPM's student. The organiser of the programme is the Ministry of Economy, Trade, and Industry (METI), Government of Japan under the FY2019 Technical Cooperation and Emerging Market Development Programme. It is open to highly skilled foreign professionals who are currently not living in Japan and come from the OECD/DAC-listed countries except China. This programme provides the interns the opportunities to spend a full 3-month internship in selected SME host companies.

Khalila also received flight tickets, living allowances, accommodation and insurance coverage during the period. This programme offered a priceless working experience for Khalila and is instrumental in providing her with workplace skills and expertise in the Japanese culture.

# Khalila's primary responsibilities throughout the internship programme:

- 1. Formulate an internship plan through discussion with the Internship manager
- 2. Participate in pre-training, follow-up training, and wrap-up presentation
- 3. Engage in a full-time internship during the designated period
- 4. Assist in tasks required by the Programme Office (such as documentation, notification, and report) not only during the internship period but also during pre-and post-internship period
- 5. A recipient of Japanese government public funds is expected to behave and conduct oneself in a proper manner





# FiTA with International Dance Organization (IDO)

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signing between the Faculty of Film, Theatre and Animation (FiTA), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), with the International Dance Organization (IDO) was successfully held at the Dewan Agung Tuanku Canselor (DATC) on 25 October 2019.

The MoU between the FiTA and the IDO was signed by IDO President, Michael Wendt and the Dean of FiTA, Dato' Prof. Dr. A. Razak Mohaideen. The ceremony was also attended by UiTM Legal Advisor, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Haidar Dziyauddin.

IDO is an international organisation established in 1981 in Italy. The organisation promotes dance arts and represents 500,000 dancers worldwide. IDO actively organizes international festivals to provide exposure, workshops, and technical education for dance artists worldwide.

The Dean of FiTA said the involvement of foreign organisations such as IDO will help reinforce FiTA's new diploma programme – the Diploma in Dance and Drama Technology. He also hoped that the MoU would enhance the faculty and UiTM's reputation, and expand the marketability of FiTA graduates internationally.

FiTA was established in 1998 in line with the then current trend of creative industry development in Malaysia. To date, FiTA has 2591 students and offers 16 academic programmes under a work-based learning platform. This work-based learning is known as 2u1i (two years in university, one year in industry), a programme which aims to boost students' learning experience based on industry knowledge combined with classroom learning.

#### MoU between FiTA and IDO:

- 1. To provide professional development opportunities for academic staff and students;
- 2. To provide students and academic staff development with career opportunities in film, creative writing, theatre, art and animation management;
- 3. To encourage the involvement of both entities in research, professional consultations, and academic programme development;
- 4. To collaboratively organise academic activity, project, and/or conference based on mutual interests; and
- 5. To collaborate on any activity over time based on mutual agreement.





### Guangxi Normal University for the Nationalities (GXNUN), Guangxi, China and UiTM Kelantan

The Network has established Social Innovation Support Units in eight universities in Thailand, Myanmar, Malaysia and Cambodia with support from partner universities in Portugal, Spain and the UK.

The core objective of SEASIN is to create a new paradigm for knowledge exchange in universities and provide a platform for innovation, sustainability and social entrepreneurship. Increasingly, social innovation is being recognized as critical for sustainable human and social development, capable of addressing the major and interrelated challenges facing society. Across Asia, governments, corporations, social organisations and social investment firms demonstrate the extent to which the social innovation eco-system is growing.

Issues and challenges on social innovation was addressed at the 2nd SEASIN International Conference in Bangkok, Thailand on 8 to 9 October, 2019, with the theme Shaping Futures – New Ways for Universities to Make Change Happen. # UiTM Shines at ASEA— | UNINET

ASEAN-European Academic University Network

Programme

The South-East Asian University Network or better known as ASEA-UNINET was founded in 1994 by universities from Malaysia, Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and Vietnam. The consortium has a strong networking system with universities around the globe in Europe, America, China, Japan and Korea. Today, the consortium members consist of more than 80 universities from 18 different countries around the world. ASEA-UNINET functions as a key implementing agency of ASEAN in the Socio-cultural portfolio by conducting programmes and activities to encourage and promote higher education cooperation and development to enhance regional integration in achieving global standards. The current activities are categorised into five areas: Youth Mobility, Academic Collaboration, Standards, Mechanisms, Systems and Policies of Higher Education Collaboration, Courses and Programmes Development and Regional and Global Policy Platforms.

The ASEA-UNINET strategic focus built on those primacies identified by ASEAN member universities to facilitate regional cooperation to strengthen the existing network of cooperation among universities in ASEAN and beyond; promote collaborative study, research and educational programmes in the priority areas identified by ASEAN; promote cooperation and solidarity among scholars, academicians and researchers in the ASEAN Member States; and serve as the policy-oriented body in higher education in the ASEAN region. These priorities guided the ASEA-UNINET plan of work in four key areas: student and faculty exchanges, ASEAN studies, information networking, and collaborative research. Every year more than 100 bilateral and multilateral ASEA-UNINET research projects are conducted.



#### ASEA-UNINET Students Week

2019 marked the 2nd year of ASEA-UNINET Students Week which was held at the Universitas Indonesdia (Depok, Indonesia). The programme managed to gather 21 Bachelor, Master and PhD-students from seven ASEAN countries to participate in the programme. Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) had the opportunity to send 4 students abroad under the umbrella of ASEA-UNINET on 18 to 30 August 2019. The four (4) Master Degree students were from the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering and the Faculty of Chemical Engineering respectively, with 2 of the students receiving full sponsorships worth USD1,670 and the 2 other students receiving partial sponsorships worth USD 560 which enabled them to participate in the programme.

The programme was an academic mobility programme, designed to facilitate graduate students from ASEA-UNINET university members to participate in a short programme of two weeks and earn 3 credits (with 44 contact hours) upon completion of the programme.

This programme was specifically designed so that the participants not only benefit academically through in-class lectures (with multidisciplinary field of study approach) but also get the opportunity to have an internship or field study and given the exposure to Indonesian culture through the cultural engagement embedded in the programme. The theme of the programme, "Sustainable Development", along with ASEA-UNINET main goal, aims to encourage participants to have broader intellectual awareness on the importance of sustainability which is a global issue faced by modern society. The participants were involved in various instrumental activities that include lectures on Sustainable Development on Multidisciplinary Approaches; Indonesian Culture Courses: Indonesian Language, Batik Workshop, Traditional Dance and Music Workshop, Cultural Trip to Indonesia Miniature Park; Focus Group Discussion, and Presentation.





#### ASEA-UNINET International Community Outreach Programme

he creditable ASEA-UNINET programme has encouraged UiTM to send 5 lecturers from the Faculty of Applied Sciences and 2 students from the Faculty of Electrical Engineering to participate in the ASEA-UNINET International Community Outreach Programme. The programme from 16 to 21 December was hosted by the Universitas Airlangga (UNAIR), Surabaya and Diponegoro University in Semarang (UNDIP), Indonesia. The International Community Outreach Programme was a one-week programme designed to offer students and academic staff a once-in-a-lifetime experience that allowed them to explore and respond to the actual social problems of the community.

The programme was attended by 23 participants comprising of 15 students and 8 academic staff and lecturers from Malaysia, Thailand, Japan, Tanzania, Japan, Ukraine, and Kyrgyzstan.

Adapted from Goal 14.7 of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Life Below Water, the participants helped to educate the coastal communities about increasing the economic benefits from the sustainable use of marine resources, especially clams, including through sustainable management of fisheries, aquaculture and tourism. The goal is to enable the community to process the clams into products with higher added value. Both academic staff and students were encouraged to discuss and reflect with the coastal communities and to gain experience in a diverse range of knowledge. Participants were involved in working session and community services in Surabaya, Sidoarjo and Pasuruan. They also had the opportunity to witness how the community members process mangrove fruit into processed drinks and turned shells into valuable products and seaweed commodities.

ASEA-UNINET programme such as these provide invaluable learning and research experience for both UiTM students and staff. This programme has broadened participants' intellectual capacity and created global awareness of significant issues and challenges at home and around the globe. The nature of the programme could develop UiTM students to be global citizens as envisioned by UiTM's Vice Chancellor and thus achieve the institution's global agenda.

## International Volunteer in Kazan, Russia

s. Dr. Judith Gisip, Coordinator for Summer Programmes at the Office of International Affairs (OIA) Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), was selected as an international volunteer to the 45th WorldSkills Competition which took place at Kazan Expo International Exhibition Centre from 22 to 27 August 2019. With the theme "Skills for the Future", the global event attracted 1,354 young professionals from 63 countries and regions who competed in 56 skills. Among the skills were cabinetmaking, fashion technology, cloud computing, mobile robotics, beauty therapy and automobile technology. The skills were grouped into 6 sectors: 1) Construction and Building Technology; 2) Creative Arts and Fashion; 3) Information and Communication Technology; 4) Manufacturing and Engineering Technology; 5) Social and Personal Services and 6) Transportation and Logistics. The Competition drew more than 200,000 visitors. It is a biennial event and has been successfully promoting skilled professional. education focusing on social and economic development

Judith, a senior lecturer from the Faculty of Applied Sciences, UiTM underwent a week of training prior to the event. The training covered the functional areas and venues that she was responsible for. Judith was among more than 3,500 volunteers, of which 65 were international volunteers representing 34 countries. The remaining volunteers came from Kazan and the Republic of Tatarstan as well as other regions in the Russian Federation. The volunteers assisted the organisers in staging the Competition which was the main international event of 2019. The experience that she had would last a lifetime. Her stint as a volunteer in Kazan has made her want to encourage volunteerism in UiTM. Volunteering at world competitions is a new and promising avenue in international mobility for UiTM students.



## Global Staff at Trakya University, Turkey

EVLANA Exchange Programme is a student and academic staff exchange programme between higher education institutions in Turkey and other countries. In this exchange programme, students may study abroad for 1 (minimum) or 2 (maximum) terms and academic staff may lecture abroad from 2 weeks (minimum) to 3 months (maximum). Hosted by Turkish higher education institutions, students and academic staff from any university which has signed a bilateral Mevlana Exchange Protocol can come to Turkey to study or teach. Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) is one beneficiary of this programme.

In November 2019, 3 academic staff from UiTM were accepted to the programme. As part of the exchange requirements, the lecturers taught and shared their expertise with students and staff at the institution based on their areas by giving seminars, and participating in panel discussions and conferences. The staff selected for the Mevlana Exchange Programme were Dr. Abdul Rahim Ridzuan from UiTM, Melaka, and Prof. Dr. Nursuriati Jamil and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Zaibunnisa Abdul Haiyee, from UiTM, Shah Alam. They taught at Trakya University from 9 to 29 November, 2019.

Rahim, from the Faculty of Business and Management focuses his research on Economics. During his stint, he collaborated with experts such as Prof. Dr. Ahmet Atakisi and Prof. Dr. Ayhan Aytac, who specialised in International Economics. He interacted with Degree, Masters and PhD students and joined their extended research network. Rahim plans to invite both professors to join the Research Interest Group (RIG) at UiTM. This experience had enabled him to promote UiTM and enhance his international visibility.

Rahim's invaluable experience at Trakya was echoed by Prof. Dr. Nursuriati Jamil, a professor from the Faculty of Computer and Mathematical Sciences. Nursuriati, whose research are in Signal and Image Processing and Multimedia Information Retrieval, also collaborated with many experts at Trakya: Assoc. Prof. Dr. Oghuzan Erdem & Dr. Sezer Ulukaya whose research is in gait analysis and speech processing of Parkinson disease; Dr. Selcuk Yazar, Dr. Deniz Taskin and Dr. Cem Taskin whose research is on autonomous vehicle and smart farming; and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Zulfiye Gul Ercan from the Autism Centre. Nursuriati enjoyed her seminars with postgraduates and fellow academicians, and discussions with research groups and making lab visits. They discussed research data, postgraduate co-supervision, co-authoring of journals, and participation in international grant applications. Nursuriati was extremely grateful for the experience she had in Turkey.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Zaibunnisa Abdul Haiyee from the Faculty of Applied Sciences taught and collaborated with experts such as Assoc. Prof. Dr. Aydan Ercan, at the Faculty of Health Sciences (Nutrition and Dietetic) and Prof. Dr. Ayse Zeynep, from the Faculty of Food Engineering. Her interactions with the professors have inspired her to invite them as visiting lecturers to UiTM. A programme like this helps to develop global networking for staff, and highlight academic programmes and research experts at UiTM. A planned and organised staff mobility programmes can internationalise the campus at home.














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

### Global Icon

Datuk Wan Nazri Wan Aria made history when he became part of the construction of the iconic monument in Mecca's Masjidil Haram, when he was working with a leading German company SL Rasch. Nazri, a graduate of Civil Engineering at UiTM in 2002, began working with a local company. At 25, he felt dissatisfied and wanted to challenge himself. He resigned and was determined to continue studying at the Master's level in Germany at his own expense.

He chose Germany because, in his opinion, that was the most important and most challenging place for an engineer in the world. Although initially not fluent in German, he forced himself to study immediately. Because all the lessons were in German, to him learning engineering was hard, learning at the graduate level was hard, learning German was hard, everything was hard! But Nazri persevered.

After achieving excellent results, a number of large companies, especially in automobiles, were eager to offer him jobs. He turned down the offers because he wanted to do Structural Engineering. He applied for a job at a SL Rasch company, a German company famous for structural engineering. At first, the company was not interested in hiring him because they did not believe in the ability of engineers not from Germany or Europe. To them, the Germans were the most knowledgeable in engineering and they already had a lot of German Engineers. Then the company won the tender to build the Royal Clock Tower in Mecca using a design created by Nazri. As a result, SL Rasch sent Nazmi as the chief consultant for the project to oversee its construction from A - Z.

Ironically, Arab engineers were also very skeptical of engineers from Asia too. But since Nazri graduated from a German university, he was highly respected. He was extremely good at what he did, and soon many big companies in Arabia wanted to lure him from his company.

He became a source of pride for Malaysia when it was reported that he helped design the upper level of the clock tower. He was the Chief Structural Engineer in charge of the construction of the structure. The tower was one of the most iconic monuments in Saudi Arabia and was one of the tallest buildings in the world in 2012. The structure of this building is considered to be one of the miracles of modern engineering.

Wan Nazri is an experienced Managing Director with a demonstrated history of work in the civil & structural engineering industry. Skilled in AutoCAD, Steel Structures, Bridge, Finite Element Analysis, STAAD, as well as Parametric design (Rhino n grasshopper), he has a strong business acumen especially in technical disciplines. Since 2013, Nazri has been MD and CEO of Gruppe Consultant dealing with Consulting Engineers & Project implementation services. His consulting services include Steel Structure Design (Static & Dynamic), Finite Element Analysis Practitioner, Forensic Engineering, Engineering design of RC works, Architect Engineering Practices (Master planning of urban/rural development as well as design conceptual), Engineering Procurement Construction & Commissioning of General Construction, Power Plant Construction, Port Development, Oil & Gas Plant Structures & Sugar Refinery, and Strategic Planning for Business Development

Among his list of achievements were as CEO-Gruppe Consultant in March 2014 – March 2018, a Fellow Principal of Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP) from Jul 2016 – Jul 2018, and the Structural Engineer for SLR GmbH from December 2007 – Nov 2012. He is now the Managing Director of WH Vector Sdn Bhd in Shah Alam.

He is currently looking for new talents in Malaysia to train them to work on the global stage. He does not look for experienced engineers, but is interested in bringing together young graduates with great potential. He is preparing young graduates to be world players just like himself. Nazri wants to give back to society; he is grateful for the opportunities afforded him by his boss at SL Rasch who opened the door for him, and now he is keen to open doors for others.
