1.1 INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this research is to evaluate the impact of APEC Liberalization Program on Ford Motor Company Malaysia (AMIM Holdings Sdn. Bhd.).

AMIM Holdings is a company, which assemble Ford cars. AMIM pays more for most parts than local manufacturer pays due to the higher rate of import duties.
