Abstract

This research project is introducing the need for Malaysia to regulate one of the Assisted Reproduction Technology (ART) that had been used in several fertility practice; the sperm donation. Although the scale of this method of ART was not yet widely used, the rights of the parties involved were not given a proper safeguard.
