#### **ABSTRACT**

Students' spending habits today have become a major concern in our society in the face of rising bankruptcy cases and social issues among younger generations in Malaysia, frequently associated with their financial instability due to poor individual financial management. Nowadays students' spending habits is quite different from before, raising a doubt as to what could be the students' spending factors today. The purpose of this study is to identify factors affecting students' spending habits alongside to investigate their awareness on financial literacy and propose a set of guidelines in proper financial practices for them. The respondents of this research are students from Diploma Muamalat of Academy of Contemporary Islamic Studies (ACIS) in UiTM Puncak Alam, Selangor, the method used is a Quantitative Approach by survey through questionnaires which are adapted for this study.
