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ABSTRACT

Chemical and biological studies were carried out on *Garcinia Eugenifolia* (Clusiaceae). The chemical investigation covered xanthones, flavonoids, benzophenones and terpenes. These compounds were isolated using common chromatographic techniques and were identified using spectroscopic experiments such as NMR, MS, IR and UV.

Garcinia Eugenifolia (twigs) afforded one xanthone, 5,9-dihydroxy-8-methoxy-2,2-dimethyl-7-(3-methylbut-2-enyl)pyrano[3,2-b]xanthen-6(2H)-one **(86)** and one triterpenoid, sitosterol **(87)**. Meanwhile, studies on the leaves of *Garcinia Eugenifolia* provided another triterpenoid, friedelin **(88)**.

Cytotoxic tests were carried out using HL-60 cell line. The crude hexane and ethyl acetate extracts of *Garcinia Eugenifolia* showed strong cytotoxic towards the HeLa cell line with IC₅₀ 1.9 μg/ml and 2.5 μg/ml respectively. The methanol extracts of *Garcinia Eugenifolia* showed good cytotoxic activity with IC₅₀ values of 9 μg/ml.

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

1.1 General Introduction
