CHAPTER 1

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Good governance is an indeterminate term used in development literature to describe how public organizations conduct public affairs and manage public resources in order to guarantee the realization of human rights. Governance describes "the process of decision-making and the process by which decisions are implemented (or not implemented)". The term governance can apply to corporate, international, national, local governance or to the interactions between other sectors of society. Good governance has long been a global topic of discussion and particularly in the field of development assistance to improve the performance. Indeed, good governance is essential to the development process. Poor governance is considered as one cause of all the shortcomings in our society. The major contributors affecting to financial institutions increasingly targeted aid and loans on the condition that change and ensure "good governance" was conducted in administrative management.

Therefore, the Ministry is making its effort to improve the socio-economic standard and social well-being of and to provide various assistance programmes and welfare aid services to the people, to ensure equal opportunity (for the poor, senior citizens, disabled, needy children), to eradicate social illnesses, and to reduce illiteracy, while working towards creating a harmonious and stable community. In order for the Ministry to fulfill the trust of these responsibilities, the State Welfare Department has been entrusted to carry out those responsibilities.
