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ABSTRACT

This project paper was carried out to find the relationship between inflation and macroeconomic variable (government spending, import, income and unemployment) from developed countries. This study was using panel data from 20 selected developed countries for the period 2008 until 2017 (10 years) only. The data was collected from The World Bank.
