Key lessons

They were also exposed to various ways English lessons could be made interesting outside the conventional classroom. Most importantly, the activities had enabled them to see the significance of having clear lesson plans especially lesson objectives and procedures, consider possible teaching and learning materials that are available outside the classroom, and execute their plans that integrate the four basic skills in language.



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
