 1. Intercultural Dialogue Through Design Collaboration 1.1) Architecture is seldom produced by the creative effort of only one individual. Most outstanding architectural creations of the world today are realised through design collaboration of several designers and architects working together with respectful understanding and within synergic relationship. 1.2) This course seeks to explore the potential of design collaboration of contemporary practice within a global context through intercultural dialogue. The experience of international collaboration fosters intercultural understanding along with culturally appropriate design responses. 1.3) The overall educational approach makes this a unique educational initiative in terms of its actively immersive and intercultural engagement within the diverse membership of studio teams comprising of up to six students. 1.4) The design calls for a collaborative response to a common architectural brief which is art/culturally related. It will be conducted over five to seven days of structured and intense studio sessions plus additional days for cultural immersion study. 1.5) The programme will involve site visits, cultural immersion study tour, strategic lectures/talks, group brainstorming sessions, diagramming issues, strategies and solutions. 1.6) The design outcomes culminates in a public exhibition and/or simple publication. 1.7) From working within and with another cultural setting, this course seeks to create intercultural awareness in the participants and the learning of relations with a foreign collaborators which are all intercultural engagement experience to end or simple publicatiors.
