I was honoured to be given the opportunity to deliver intervention notes on WHO Traditional medicine strategy 2014-2023, Substandard & Falsified Medical Products, Strengthening Rehabilitation in Health Systems and Global Strategy for Infection Prevention & Control. Engaging in these discussions allowed for deepening understanding of complex health issues, hearing different viewpoints, and contributing to the development of evidence-based policies.

One significant highlight during the 76th WHA was witnessing Malaysia's draft resolution on behavioural sciences being accepted. Malaysia's resolution recognised the importance of incorporating behavioural sciences into public health strategies and interventions, acknowledging the significant impact that individual behaviours and societal factors have on health outcomes. The acceptance of Malaysia's draft resolution was a moment of pride and achievement for the country and a testament to the global recognition of the role of behavioral sciences in improving public health.
