## **RESEARCH METHODOLOGY**

#### 3.0 Introduction

This chapter present the researcher methodology used in the study. The study was to find out the usage of the prescribed Forms 1 - 3 English textbooks in English lesson in lower secondary school, SMK Tun Abdul Razak.

#### **3.1 Description of the study**

This study focuses on the teachers' opinion on the usage of the prescribed Forms 1 - 3 English textbooks to teach English in SMK Tun Abdul Razak.
