# SAFAVID AND OTTOMAN QUR'AN LAYOUT DESIGN: A COLLECTION IN ISLAMIC ART MUSEUM MALAYSIA

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### **ABSTRACT**

There is an illumination which is usually placed in the Opening Chapter of the Al-Qur'an, before the Surah Al-Fatihah and Al-Bagarah. Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia was actually having few collections of Al-Qur'an from various countries includes Safavid and Ottoman artifacts. Therefore, there are many types of layout design in the Al-Qur'an that was used to refer to their origins that embedded with certain character. Comprehensive studies had been determined from the previous and current related study, which regards Islamic Art development. However, the specific analysis on how the layout designs in the Al-Qur'an from Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia was investigated as the main focus for this study. Thus, the purpose of this research is to determine the Safavid and Ottoman layout design that preserved at Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia, to select appropriate examples of Safavid and Ottoman layout design from the Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia collection and to analysis the preferred examples of the Safavid and Ottoman layout design. The methodology for this research begins with reviewing the related literature on Islamic arts, interviews session with curatorial at the Islamic Arts Museum and other related institutions. Then, field visit and observation were conducted at the Islamic Arts Museum exhibition hall to determine the potential layout design artifact and gathered the digital images from the collection department for the analysis process. Followed with, the tracing activity that was significantly supported to recognize the illumination of layout designs. The momentous outcome from this study was represented that the Safavid and Ottoman layout design was formed within the geometrical character. Significantly, the layout was formed with various types of motifs and colors from both illumination examples that had been analysis. To sum up, this study was discovered in how the Islamic Arts Museum Malaysia was preserving numerous types of artifacts from a different Islamic country. Moreover, potential studies for other artifacts at the Islamic Arts Museum need to be conducted. The valuable collection at this museum should share to communities through various platforms, and the collaboration research should cooperate within academician and researcher.

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
