

A STUDY ON THE PERFORMANCE OF
BUMIPUTRA FOODSTALLS, IN AND
AROUND THE CAMPUS OF TTM,
SHAH ALAM

NEEDS AND PROBLEMS

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A. INTRODUCTION

Presently, during the academic session of January - July 1985, the population of MARA Institute of Technology, Shah Alam stands at more than 12,000 students and is expected to increase further in the future.

The staff population stands at more than 3,000 staff. With such a population, it is always important to bear in mind the performance of the foodstalls in and around the campus in meeting their daily needs. This is particularly so for those residing in the hostels within the campus and the staff who constitute the regular customers of the foodstalls.

At present, the foodstalls can be found at Perindu, Kenanga, Seroja, Mamakteria and Jati. Comparatively, their performance are not ^{satisfactory} to meet the needs of the 10,672 students who reside in the hostels and the 3,440 staff. It is thought that, the location of the foodstalls, service rendered, conditions of the foodstalls, and the food and drinks offered are not to the satisfaction of the students and staff. Further, it is hope that the performance of the foodstalls should be improved with future increase in students population.
