DLMI, which started as "Project Big Blue" that mirrored its corporate color, is investing close to RM600 million (including RM60 million for site purchase) to construct a new dairy plant on 32.59 acres of land in Bandar Enstek (Kaur, 2023).

The company is a subsidiary of Royal FrieslandCampina, one of the world's largest dairy cooperatives based in the Netherlands. Dutch Lady Malaysia was originally incorporated in 1963 as Pacific Milk Industries (Malaya) Sdn Bhd before changing its name to Dutch Lady Milk Industries Berhad in 2000.

The company has been at the forefront of providing high-quality dairy products to the Malaysian market for decades.
