EXAMINING FACTORS INFLUENCING INTENTION TO PARTICIPATE IN INCOME ZAKAT CONTRIBUTION AMONG CIVIL PERSONNEL IN JOHOR: A CASE STUDY OF MAIJ'S ZAKAT COLLECTION

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ABSTRACT

This study investigates the practice of zakat on income within Johor and specifically focuses on the income zakat payment intention and participation of civil personnel in Johor who are obligated to pay zakat on their income. The study aims to analyze the factors that influence their intention and participation of income zakat contribution from several factors such as Attitude, Knowledge, Government Initiative, Credibility and Transparency and explore effective approaches for enhancing their intention of zakat on income. The research employs both primary and secondary data sources. Primary data is collected through interviews with officials from the Majlis Agama Islam Johor (MAIJ) and online questionnaires to random sampling approach selection of participants from different departments and employment levels within the Johor Civil personnel in Johor Bahru, Muar and Pasir Gudang, while statistical data is derived from various documents such as reports and articles.

The findings reveal a notable improvement in zakat payment from 2023. Nevertheless, recommendations related to supervision, procedures, and cooperation are proposed to further enhance zakat payment, ensuring better support for the underprivileged recipients and optimizing zakat distribution. It's worth noting that this research was made possible through a research grant from UiTM.

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CHAPTER ONE INTRODUCTION

1.1Preamble

Chapter 1 elaborates on the study's focus on factors influencing the intention and participation in zakat on income contribution among Johor Civil personnel in Johor Bahru, Muar and Pasir Gudang. This chapter also addresses the problem statement, research objectives, research questions, scope of the study, and significance of the study. Additionally, it will provide an overview of the study's background, the industry context, and role of Majlis Agama Islam Negeri Johor (MAIJ) in the zakat management context.

1.2Background of the Study

Zakat organizations in Malaysia are acknowledged as Islamic entities that promote social equilibrium in Muslim societies (Ahmad *et al.*, 2015). Zakat institutions are responsible for administrating the zakat collection process and distributing it to those in need (Mahmood *et al*, 2021). Zakat is the one of five pillars of the Islamic faith, a mandatory type of "almsgiving", to which every Muslim is obligated to make contributions (Ab Rahman *et al.*, 2022). It stands as a positive instrument in Islam aimed at alleviating or eliminating poverty, while bolstering the economic standing of the *ummah* as a key Islamic financial tool (Khalil *et al*, 2020). Malaysia, where Muslims make up the majority the population, zakat collection holds substantial importance beyond tax income by contributing significantly to both national economic development and community welfare (Abdullah & Sapiei, 2018).

In Islam, the rich are expected to share their wealth with designated recipients or *asnaf*, as specified in the Quran, by paying zakat (Sadallah *et al.*, 2022).
