programme not only provides an opportunity for international students to volunteer, but it also promotes cultural immersion and tourism in the region, with a focus on the rich Batak Toba culture and the scenic beauty of Lake Toba.

The programme's major goal is to establish meaningful ties between international students and the local community while also helping to improve the village's tourism infrastructure and promote sustainable development practices. Volunteer work and cultural exchange events allow participants to learn about the Batak Toba people's traditions, customs, and way of life, enriching their awareness of Indonesian culture and heritage.

Management programme: Muhammad Adam Yahya, Muhammad Luqman Anwar, Sarah Najlaa Najmi Abdullah, Nur Aina Aqilla Mat Sani, and Nur Irdina Rashdi. Their participation demonstrates a dedication to intellectual and personal development through practical experience and cross-cultural interaction.

Throughout the two-week programme, participants engaged in a range of community service activities aimed at helping local inhabitants and encouraging sustainable tourism practices. These efforts encompassed, but were not limited to:

1. Tourism Promotion Campaigns: According to conversations with Indonesian tourism representatives, most visitors are unaware of Tuktuk Siadong Village's attractions and uniqueness. Hence, it is advisable to establish social media profiles on platforms like TikTok and Instagram to disseminate comprehensive information and solicit support for TukTok Siadong Village among social media users.



This will facilitate the acquisition of knowledge by travellers regarding the allure of Batak culture, a diverse array of delectable cuisines, accessible lodging and transportation options, noteworthy destinations worthy and exploration. As a result, UiTM Penang's students have compiled videos and information to share on their official Instagram.

- 2. Public Speaking Workshop: Participants were tasked with instructing SMK Simanindo on the subject of public speaking and its proper execution. It has been observed that while the students possess proficiency in the domains of hospitality and tourism, they lack the necessary skills to effectively represent Tuktuk as ambassadors. Following the lecture on Public Speaking, the students were organised into cohorts to construct a mind map, which they subsequently demonstrated in front of the class. Students can apply what they have learned in this manner.
- 3. Cultural Exchange Session: To promote cultural understanding, exchange and in tour and participants were involved interactive sessions in which they contributed

insights into their respective cultures while learning about the Batak people's traditions, music, dance, and cuisine. They maintain a steadfast adherence to tradition and place significant emphasis on it. The same holds true for the handicrafts they produce for financial gain.

4. Health Assessment Campaign: Participants assisted in conducting health assessments for the residents of Tuktuk Siadong Village during their visit to the Posyandu (Integrated Service Post). The participants promoted Posyandu local to residents by visiting their homes to inform them about and include them in the events organised by Posyandu. Posyandu will provide complimentary monthly health assessments for residents as an example. The health checkup aims to identify any potential diseases or infections in the community, with a focus on women and children, in order to minimise the risk of illness and enhance treatment outcomes.

The International Student Community Service Programme's influence extends beyond the visible results of volunteer efforts.
