On September 4, 2024, I had the opportunity to participate in the Bengkel Penyediaan Kertas Kerja Geran Acara Untuk Projek Pelancongan, Seni dan Budaya organized by the Research Management Unit (RMU), UiTM Sarawak. As one of the four lecturers from the School of Information Science (PPSM), UiTM Sarawak Branch, this experience was invaluable, especially in our efforts to prepare a proposal to apply for a grant from the Ministry of Culture, Tourism, and Performance (MCTP) Sarawak.

The workshop was held in the Bilik Sarjana at UiTM Samarahan Campus and involved 12 groups from various faculties and units within UiTM Sarawak. Before the official workshop, we attended a preparation briefing on 29th August 2024. I truly appreciated her approach to providing honest and constructive feedback, which significantly helped us refine our ideas and improve our draft proposal. Our PPSM team, consisting of Dr. Hajah Imilia Ibrahim, Zainon Haji Bibi, Muhammad Khairul Duan, and myself, completed a proposal titled "Speak Up Go Global." This project is designed to involve international undergraduate students



from both local and overseas universities, with a focus on cultural interaction and global communication. Throughout the preparation process, I felt a strong sense of collaboration and openness within our team. We shared ideas, supported each other, and pushed ourselves to ensure that the proposal was not only complete but also highly appealing to potential grant providers.

This experience was significant to me because it highlighted the importance of crafting high-quality proposals to secure funding support. I was also inspired by the enthusiasm and dedication of colleagues from other faculties who participated in the workshop. Each group brought unique ideas and a clear vision to support tourism, arts, and culture in Sarawak.
