Teaching methodology includes lectures, seminars, practical sessions and journal club. The course assessment methods include written examination, viva voce as well as continuous assessment. Continuous assessment will be evaluated thorough out the year in the form of semester tests, projects, assignments, critical appraisals and seminars.
