Appointed as the Dean of the Akademi Pengajian Bahasa from 1st July 2022, Associate Professor Ts Dr Janudin Sardi is no stranger to putting on different hats when he steps into the office. He has worked in numerous portfolios that range from research to educational technology. He previously served the Institute of Leadership and Quality Management (iLQAM) and closely worked with his iLQAM team members whom he views to be like a tight-knit family. As he possesses a strong educational background in the Arabic language and is passionate in the intricacies of the language, he was exhilarated to be selected as the representative of UiTM to develop an e-Learning project for an Arabic course in 2002.



When asked about his fondest memories in APB, he enthusiastically mentioned that attending a meeting as a representative of the Arabic language unit on his first day of joining UiTM and being appointed as a coordinator for Kursus Kemahiran Bahasa (KKB) in APB as among the most memorable ones. 

priorities is to motivate lecturers to embark on research areas that have not been extensively explored such as language testing and evaluation. Lecturers' efforts to explore other areas will facilitate the attainment of APB's vision to reach the milestone of becoming a Centre of Excellence (CoE) through Research Interest Groups (RIGs).

He also encourages many lecturers to continue their studies and actively provides support for lecturers to complete their writings. Salina Sabri, an APB lecturer pursuing her doctorate in philosophy (PhD) in the Faculty of Languages and Linguistics (FLL), Universiti Malaya (UM), once asked him for advice on how she can reach the finishing line. As an alumni of FLL and a PhD student who graduated on time (GOT), he advised Salina to apply this principle: "*Allahummapaksa*" (loosely translated as forcing oneself to keep going). Although it may seem like a dad joke initially, this catchphrase has slowly infiltrated many conversations within APB's walls and is now used as a catchphrase by many.
