This subject will address the practical and legal problems confronted by property developers and the procedures they are expected to be conversant with, in order to ensure smooth running of the project, and to avoid or minimise litigation. Among the topics to be covered include details of planning law, building plan and its functions, procedures to be followed and the duties of the relevant parties in construction works and upon completion of building works.
