

# *Camp of Administering Committee and Programme Handling* COACH 2025

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On Saturday, April 19, the Society of Pharmacy Students (SOPHYS) and Sekretariat Mahasiswa Fakultas Farmasi (SMF) successfully organised the Camp of Administering Committee and Programme Handling (COACH) 2025. This programme aimed to equip newly appointed SOPHYS and SMF committee members with essential leadership and problem-solving skills, while fostering teamwork and collaboration.

This programme was divided into four separate sessions, each of which was intended to accomplish a certain goal: to foster teamwork and connectivity, to inspire through prior leadership experiences, to provide insight into organisational responsibilities and to improve problem-solving skills among participants.



The first slot featured an ice-breaking session that helped participants form strong friendships, foster team spirit and promote unity among members through fun and interactive activities. This was followed by the second slot, **“Sharing Sessions With RxLeaders”**, in which two distinguished former SOPHYS leaders, Nur Shareena Maisarah Mohd Ghazali and Muhammad Syazwan Mazlan shared their leadership experience, challenges, and reflections as pharmacy student leaders.



In the third slot, participants were introduced to the specific roles involved in programme planning. They also learned how to prepare documentation for the Mesyuarat Kewangan, Aktiviti dan Pembangunan Pelajar (MeKAPP). This session aimed to ensure that future programmes are well-planned and carried out efficiently and in accordance with university requirements.

The fourth and final slot, titled “Strategic Decision-Making: Leveraging Organisational Wisdom for Better Outcomes” was delivered by Ms. Nordiana Ibrahim, Student Leadership Coordinator from the Institut Kepimpinan Pelajar (IKP). This session focused on improving problem-solving skills through scenario-based discussions and decision-making activities.

The COACH 2025 ended with a prize-giving ceremony in which hampers were awarded to the top three groups based on their performance in the first slot. Group 3 emerged as the grand winner, followed by Group 9 in second place and Group 1 finishing third.



Ultimately, COACH 2025 was a great success in achieving its aim of equipping newly appointed SOPHYS and SMF committee members with the necessary skills, knowledge, and mindset to confidently assume leadership roles. More than merely a training programme, it promoted a strong sense of teamwork and a better understanding of organisational duties.
