### **BACKGROUND**

Pejabat Jajahan Tumpat was established on 1 January 1949, in the Padang Mahkota area, located in front of the official residence of the District Officer. It was inaugurated under the leadership of the late Dato' Nik Hussein bin Nik Zainal (Dato' Kaya Setia) as the first District Officer.

Rapid development in the District of Tumpat at that time, concurrent with the growth of the Port and Railway Station which served as the vital transportation hubs on the East Coast, prompted the District Officer and state administration to relocate the Land and District Office of Tumpat to more comfortable premises (these buildings have since been demolished), and its site is now home to the Public Library, providing educational facilities and fostering learning among the local residents. Due to the significance and awareness that the District Office of Tumpat serves as the central hub for other departments within the district, once again in 1984, the Land and District Office of Tumpat was relocated to a new, more comfortable and modern building on a 1.09-hectare site facing Masjid Ismaili of Tumpat District, where it continues to be used until today.

The administration of Tumpat District is the smallest among districts in Kelantan, covering only 169.5 km<sup>2</sup>. However, Tumpat is exceptionally unique for its flat terrain and hundreds of river islands, making it highly suitable and promising as an international tourism area.
