The station aims to provide technology transfer of new clones and agronomic practices through exhibitions, training and R&D to smallholders, private agencies and the government. Park Guiding IN NATIONAL PARKS USING THEMATIC INTERPRETATION FOR CONSERVATION - The Chief Minister's Outstanding Park Guiding Award

The strategic roles of thematic interpretation in visitor management of national parks and in the context of tourism as a positive force for conservation and sustainable development are widely acknowledged as a necessary centerpiece of conservation and sustainable tourism. The approach is known to have the potential to influence visitors' beliefs and actions toward the natural and cultural resources, and because of its importance in positively shaping both the nature and quality of visitor experiences. In an effort to enhance the quality of park guiding services, Sarawak, since 2007 (through Section 7 and 8 of the state National Parks and Nature Reserves Regulations 1999) has developed and implemented a Park guiding Training and Licensing System, with thematic interpretation being adopted as a standard approach for delivering the park guiding services in Sarawak national parks. The Controller of National Parks and Nature Reserves appointed Sarawak Forestry Corporation as a training provider who then assigned University of Technology MARA as a training consultant to deliver the two-week intensive skill-based Park Guide Training Programme called "Certificate in Park Guiding Training Course". The training programme contained modules that include (i) theoretical knowledge on tourism and ecotourism, (ii) totally protected areas management system, (iii) national parks and nature reserves as tourism products (concept of tropical rainforests, economical and ecological values of plants, wildlife and geological landforms), (iv) risk management and (v) principle of thematic interpretation.

The Chief Minister's Outstanding Park Guiding Award 2014/2015 from the Sarawak Forestry Corporation launched by Chief Minister Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri Adenan Satem in December 2014, was to recognize outstanding performances and contributions to the development of forestry, wildlife conservation, sustainable ecotourism and protect the attributes of Totally Protected Areas. Associate Professor Dr. Margaret Chan and her postgraduate student pursuing the Doctor of Business Administration, Victor Luna Amin from the Sarawak Forestry Corporation were among others from the tourism industry and the park personnel who were tasked to assess the nominated candidates. Two trips were made to the Mulu National Park in Miri and the Bako National Park in Kuching respectively. The winner Azhar Nor Mostapha Nor was announced during the corporation's 12th anniversary dinner on 6th November, 2015.
