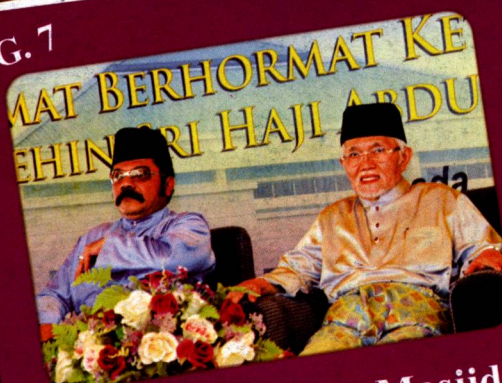

Lawatan Profesor Edie Rasmussen, Profesor Dan Pengarah Universiti British Columbia



Pada 13 Mac 2009 yang lalu, Fakulti Pengurusan Maklumat, UiTM Sarawak dengan kerjasama Persatuan Pengurusan Maklumat (INFORMS) telah mengadakan satu perjumpaan khas bersempena lawatan sulung akademik Profesor Edie Rasmussen daripada Universiti British Columbia, Kanada selaku Audit Luaran ke universiti ini. Perjumpaan khas ini adalah untuk memberi peluang kepada Profesor Edie Rasmussen berkongsi pengalaman, pengetahuan dan kemahiran beliau dalam bidang yang diceburi kepada para pensyarah dan para pelajar Fakulti Pengurusan Maklumat. Selain itu, Profesor Edie Rasmussen turut diiringi oleh pensyarah dan ahli jawatankuasa INFORMS melawat ke Perpustakaan dan Galeri Korporat.

Profesor Edie Rasmussen merupakan seorang Pensyarah dari Universiti British Columbia yang mengkhusus dalam bidang sains Pengurusan maklumat. Lawatan akademik beliau ke UiTM Sarawak ini merupakan lawatannya yang pertama dan beliau berasa gembira dengan sambutan yang diterima. Malah, perjumpaan ini telah mendapat kerjasama yang menggalakkan daripada para pensyarah, ahli jawatankuasa INFORMS dan 40 orang pelajar yang telah menerima Anugerah Dekan pada Oktober 2008 yang lepas serta pihak yang terlibat.

The seminar was organized by the semester 4 students, in fulfillment for the completion of their Organizing Events course. It was officiated by the Deputy Campus Director for Student Affairs, Associate Professor Dr. Hj. Fatimah Bujang.

The Course Lecturer/Advisor, Associate Professor Pauline Achan said that this course is very useful as students are not only trained to master the basics but lessons are also learned first-hand as they progress through the various stages of organizing an event. Those are lessons that no book can ever so eloquently describe for them to experience.

The seminar was attended by 100 students from the various faculties in UiTM Sarawak. The topics chosen are very relevant as students need to acquire other knowledge and skills apart from what is taught in the classrooms. Administrative office personnel are often required to organize events for their organization, as such it is pertinent that the would-be graduates from the Faculty of Office Management & Technology be aware of the correct protocol since any event will not be successfully organized if the correct protocol is not adhered to, whilst at the same time painting a negative picture of the organizers.
