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DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE (DOA)

The Department of Agriculture (DOA) was established in 1905. The main task of the Department of Agriculture at that time is to implement agriculture policies that have been outlined by the government. Under the guidance of some of the Department of Agriculture has approved to accelerate the development and maintenance of land rights. This includes the concern with (1) The abolition of labour contracts (2) Specialize land to the indigenous community (3) Blocking the entry of the harmful enemies and (4) Provision of land less than 10 acres to the real farmers for the purposes of farming.

Agreement in the Federation of Malaysia (1974), in line with the establishment of the state governments, provision was also made for the establishment of the State Agriculture Department in every state. Department of Agriculture in each state are responsible for implementing the development program for the development of the smallholder sector.

At the beginning, the Department of Agriculture's efforts focused only on research of the crops, providing technical experts to the operators of farms, and development services for smallholders. Although the Department of Agriculture is responsible for developing the economic potential of all crops, the Department will also carry out important activities that develop the rubber industry. However, realizing the increasing demand of the rubber industry, the government felt the need to put this rubber research activities separately under one roof area. With that the Rubber Research Institute of Malaysia (RRIM) was established in 1926.

After the country's independence in 1957, the Department of agriculture has grown rapidly and strengthened. It is fully involved in research, providing extension services, marketing and development of farmers' organizations. However, with the establishment of the Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority - FAMA (1965), the Institute of Agricultural Research and Development - MARDI (1970) and Farmers Organisation Authority - LPP (1973), the Department of Agriculture was reorganized and focused on its role in providing extension services mainly to farmers.
