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

Issue of Entry Level Salary: “TRUST THE GRADUATES AND GIVE THEM EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES”

I broadcasted live from the Melaka City campus for CTWR Ep.22 with the theme “Improving Graduate Entry Level Salary: A Necessary Solution”. For this session, my guest panellists were Mr Ahmad Khairuman Md Hasim, a senior lecturer from the Faculty of Hotel & Tourism Management and Mr Fahmi Samsudin, a lecturer from the Faculty of Art & Design.

Reports indicated that salaries in 2020 will drop sharply, but in 2022 it is expected to rise at a rate of 2.8 per cent. The fact is, it is still low. Data from the Department of Statistics Malaysia reported that fresh graduates would only receive a starting salary of between RM1,001 and RM1,500 in 2020. We have been in a situation of low graduate starting salaries for a long time.

My discussion with Mr Khairuman or his nickname Man explores the current situation of the industry and graduates by focusing on the field of tourism, while Mr Fahmi commented on the creative sector.

In an interview with some students, they responded, “Trust the graduates and give us equal opportunities/ service”. I agree with that view. A live poll during the broadcast

found 49% of respondents agreed with the starting salary of RM2,300.00 for a Diploma and RM3,500.00 for a First Degree. Meanwhile, only 3% of respondents agreed with the starting salary of RM1,500.00 for a Diploma and RM2,000.00 for a First Degree. Thank you to the 404 viewers who responded.

Starting salary gives an idea of the quality of education in our country. In this case, it requires all parties to play a vital role to drive and restore the country’s economy. The industry must be mindful of balancing human resources with business outcomes and responsibilities, especially for the young graduates. This is because the government has given various incentives in encouraging the development of the economic sector.

Finally, I would like to thank Dr. Yeoh Pei Ann and Ms Maryann Magdalina Linnis from the Faculty of Music. Thank you to Leitto Kahve and his Barista team led by Dr. Fahmi Abdul Rahim, Mr Zamzuri Ahmad Nazri, Ms Nur Khalisah Muhamed Zulkifli, and Mr Muhammad Asyraf Ramlan. My appreciation also goes to Puan Noor Ibtisam Abdul Karim, Head of School, Hotel & Tourism Management Faculty. They also helped make this program a success. - **RT**

DVC of ICAN and Director of INC Discussed the “Future of Work” at CTWR Ep.20



PROF SAZALI AND DATO' ZAKI SHARED THEIR THOUGHTS ON PRECISION HEALTH :

MyHEALTH Programme by UiTM Health Centre has Proven to have a Positive Impact

In the 19th Coffee Talk with Rozie (CTWR), I was delighted to have Prof. Dr. Ahmad Sazali Hamzah, Rector of UiTM Selangor branch (UCS), and Prof. Dato' Dr. Mohd Zaki Salleh, Director of Integrative Pharmacogenomics Institute (iPROMISE), as my guests to discuss the topic of 'Precision Health.'

Prof Sazali has more than 31 years' experience in teaching and research in organic chemistry.

His research interests are in the core area of organic chemistry, namely total synthesis of natural products, synthetic methodology and structural exploration of some bioactive molecules. Meanwhile a close friend and colleague, Prof. Dato' Dr Mohd Zaki Salleh, is a well-known figure in the fields of

genomics, proteomics, pharmacogenomics, metabolomics, and epigenomics, and has recorded ground breaking scientific achievements, including the completion of the Malay Whole Genome Sequences in Malaysia.

During the talk show, I related my experience when I voluntarily participated in Dato' Zaki's research and discovered that I was allergic to gluten (including bread) rather than seafood.

So, the importance of research in helping humans and the universe is undeniable. According to Prof. Sazali, "Research helps give UiTM global prominence and therefore, the cooperation from the Registrar, Bursar, and everyone is vital in order to facilitate, support and have an impact on this agenda".

In this episode, the talk show was accompanied by a mesmerizing duo, Encik Rizal Ezuan Zulkifly Tony (Senior Lecturer-Jazz/Modern Guitar) and Puan Amanina Alwani (Lecturer - Modern Piano & Vocal) from the Faculty of Music. In addition, I thanked Aina Fatini, Farah Sayama, Muiz Murad, Dr. Salfarina Ramli and PrintThink for giving their feedbacks during the live programme.

AN AUDIENCE WITH HIS MAJESTY SERI PADUKA BAGINDA YANG DI-PERTUAN AGONG



The hybrid event aimed to introduce the Al-Sultan Abdullah History and Civilization Research Centre, or AL-ASAR, whose name was inspired by Surah Al-Asr in the Quran. The surah highlights the importance of time, faith, and virtuous deeds besides advising each other with truth and patience.

Her Majesty Tunku Azizah hoped that the establishment of AL-ASAR could help complement the work of collecting historical and cultural artefacts of Malaysia, particularly Pahang, to be studied, explored, and understood. Her Majesty also said that everyone, including parents, plays a role in nurturing young people's interest in history, to be learned and emulated, in order to shape a better future.







I had the opportunity to introduce the Washable Batik Face Mask produced by UiTM alumni and the community through the Social Entrepreneurship project which empowered two groups in diversifying their sources of income during the pandemic. Through the Knowledge Transfer Programme, Galeri Seni Tuanku Nur Zahirah (GESTURZ), UiTM collaborated with the Selangor Single Mothers Group (coordinated by the Women's Development Office of Selangor) and Alumni to produce a "Washable Batik Face Mask" featuring Malaysian batik heritage designs.

At the same time, UiTM also donated three laptops to new students of Foundation in Law who were selected based on their academic criteria and family economic background (B40). They also received RM700 cash assistance (from Zakat - Centre of Foundation Studies) and RM200 worth of data plan each from MoHE. Hopefully, the help received by Farah Syuhada Zahari, Intan Shaharah Shaharuddin, and Aiman Syafiq Ab Rashid can inspire them to excel in their studies.


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The Audience Experience Session Gathered Feedbacks on The.Global.Goals 2021

My first walkabout tour to the branch campuses started with a delicious Nasi Lemak breakfast specially prepared by the UiTM Hotel Penang. I congratulate the team on their many local as well as international innovation and invention achievements.

I was pleased to officiate the Micro-farm, a modern IoT & ANN enabled farm led by Ts Mohamed Syazwan Osman. It is collaborative venture involving Ir Ts Dr Samsul Setumin,



Ts Mohd Ikmal and Dr Mohd Subri Tahir together with the Seberang Jaya Community College and Tuanku Sultanah Bahiyah Polytechnic, Kulim. The farm is operated by Mildory Farm Enterprise – a company established by the students of UiTM-CPP and co-funded by the Department of Agriculture, Penang.

The UiTM-CPP Micro-farm is developed using the IoT technology and Artificial Neural Network (ANN) applied in agriculture. Among the crops grown are fig trees, lettuce in the cabin and aquaponics (tilapia and herbs). It is envisaged that Micro-farming will grow and establish UiTM-CPP as a smart agricultural incubation centre for UiTM-CPP students, industry and community as well as bringing an impact to UiTM and the nation. My walkabout to UiTM-CPP ended with a tree planting ceremony held near the UiTM-CPP Library (PTAR) and He & She Café. Earlier, I had gone to see the students who decided to stay on campus at residential colleges. Fatin Izzati and Isarah Putri Khairina were two of the many I met, including SN Husinbanu Zakaruddin who is responsible in facilitating the RTK-Antigen testing. - RT







In my responses to academic staff on appraisal and KPIs, I stated that "anything that gets measured, gets managed." Remember that research was already required the day you took




the position as an academician. To my dear beloved students, please focus on your academic performance while managing your time efficiently and remaining resilient in the face of uncertainty.

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


RESEARCH IS THE CORE FOCUS of *UiTM Selangor* Branch



On 22 October 2021 I paid a visit to the Rector's Office of the UiTM Selangor branch (UCS). UCS comprises 5 campuses (in Puncak Alam, Puncak Perdana, Sg. Buloh/Selayang and Dengkil), 12 faculties, 1 academic centre and 3 centres of excellence, 2 medical centres and 1 newly established teaching hospital. UCS, housing a total enrolment of 28,432 students and 3,937 employees, is primarily focused on research and development, and has received RM8,474,806.50 in grants in 2021, including Community Joint Research with MOSTI and Manjung Aquabest Hatchery, Optometric Research Based on Community Engagement Programmes, MESTECC Transdisciplinary and Translational Research, MakerLab, and more.

Then I adjourned the meeting for a tree planting activity where I was assisted by Encik Irwan Ismadi, a landscape Architect who briefed us on some basic facts about the plant and the soil. I made my last stop at Richiamo Coffee to meet and greet a group of students who were spending time at the cafe. I thanked members of the UCS team for sharing their latest progress and development with me.

1. What are some of UiTM's proud achievements so far?

We are very proud because in the 3rd quarter of this year, the achievement of KPI/PI (GRU2025) is 84% overall.

In particular, UiTM has earned the 105th place in the ranking of the best Asian universities (QS Asia University Rankings 2022), compared to 108th in 2021 and 158th in 2018.

In addition, in terms of academic visibility at the global level, UiTM has recorded a commendable increase of 80.3% in 2021, compared to 46.5% in 2020 (2021 QS Global Academic Surveys).

As a result, a study also found that the perception of academics in all Southeast Asian countries towards UiTM increased by 53.9% in 2021 (2021 QS Global Academic Surveys).

UiTM has also successfully obtained a 5-star rating in the Public University Data Collection System (MyMoheS).

Not to forget, UiTM has been recognised as the first higher education institution to adopt cashless financial transactions (through the Malaysian e-Payments Excellence Awards 2021, organised by PayNet).

In addition, thanks to everyone's continuous hard work, UiTM researchers have received grants under the Fundamental Research Grant Schemes (FRGS) Phase 1/2021 for 206 projects with a total amount of RM20,071,747.00.

We are also proud as UiTM research representatives and lecturers have achieved success at Malaysia Technology Expo 2021 (COVID-19 International Innovation Awards 2) with 4 Outstanding Innovation Awards, 4 Gold Awards, 6 Silver Awards and 6 Bronze Awards.

Kumpulan Inovatif dan Kreatif (KIK) ERA and i-Clique of Tun Abdul Razak Library (PTAR) UiTM have achieved a proud success and have been awarded the Par Excellence Award at the 46th International Convention on Quality Control Circles (ICQCC) 2021 in Hyderabad, India.

UiTM has also received a total of RM5.5 million through the Penjana Programme under the initiative of the Ministry of Higher Education-Career Advancement Program (KPT-CAP) which was presented by the Minister of Higher Education recently.

Congratulations and well done to all UiTM family.

These successes inspire us all and bring our efforts closer to realising the GRU2025 plan to elevate the name of the university to the global level.

2. What are your priorities since taking over as UiTM Vice-Chancellor?

In my first 100 days as Vice-Chancellor of this beloved university, I have adhered to the unchanged approach and planning that we previously developed together. The UiTM Strategic Plan 2025 (GRU2025) will be maintained, only the implementation strategy will be improved and the target will be redefined due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our plan also aims to maximise available opportunities and resources to restore the confidence of many parties inside and outside UiTM.

Moreover, I have expressed my desire to see this university open up more opportunities of higher education for Malay and Bumiputera youths to strengthen the socio-economic transformation of the society while achieving equitable distribution of wealth and income nationwide.

To specify, our enrollment target is 200,000 students across the UiTM system and we recently reached 189,000. We are still on track to reach our goal.

3. Do you think this success is also the result of current and previous leaders?

Yes, continuity in leadership is one of the most important pillars for the success of an institution. That is why I am very grateful to the 16 leaders who have preceded me, such as principals, directors, rectors and vice-chancellors.

Their commitment and vision have successfully elevated the skills and performance of many Bumiputera to a level comparable to professionals from around the world.

4. What are some of the challenges that you have experienced in reaching GRU2025 in post COVID-19?

The pandemic presented a bit of a challenge for me as Vice-Chancellor of the largest university in the country.

In this post COVID-19 world, I believe that in order to move forward, we need to do a little 'realignment' in our efforts to achieve the existing goals, where we need to 'reset, recover and restore' to ensure sustainability of the more realistic and meaningful UiTM2025 Strategic Plan.

Plus, this 'realignment' should also include efforts to improve and restore the reputation of UiTM in the eyes of the university's stakeholders.

"The Art of Changing How People See You" must serve as a guide. Trust, confidence and acceptance of stakeholders must therefore be built, nurtured and shaped from within.

For that reason, during these 100 days, I made an effort to give my full attention to the members of Keluarga UiTM to help

hone their talents and prepare reforms to advance any initiative or strategic action plan (SAP) that has been developed.

Thus, since March of this year, I have received visits and signed many agreements with nearly 500 parties to emphasise the strength of the initiative and its sustainability.

This initiative needs to be looked at holistically so that it can be utilised by all UiTM members, while increasing the competency of staff, students and alumni across the country and ultimately enhancing its global reputation.

5. What specific activities were carried out as part of the 100-day mission of the VC to achieve GRU2025?

Since helming the university's leadership, I have introduced several special programmes, including the continuation of the Coffee Talk with Rozie Series, in which I myself have moderated discussion sessions with stakeholders on topics relevant to lecturers, students, alumni, and the university.

The programme so far has reached its 23rd episode. This programme began when I was still at the Deputy Vice-Chancellor Office (Academic and International).

Apart from this, I have also started an initiative dubbed the 'Walkabout' where I have met with the Heads of the Responsibility Centers (PTJ) and staff involved to hear the pulse of Keluarga UiTM and what can be done to nurture and build the spirit and inner strength of each PTJ. I chose these two initiatives because we need the best communication plan and channels for these purposes. Personally, I believe that internal talents and skills must be well mobilised in order to create a willingness to implement the initiatives that involve external parties.

Essentially, internal talents and strengths are the key to external strengths which can then be translated into performance achievements (KPIs) and quality of work. I have explained that GRU2025 is a plan that we have developed together.

6. What are your expectations in the next 100 days and beyond?

I would like to once again express my appreciation and gratitude to the entire Keluarga UiTM who have worked hard over the years with complete dedication, discipline, commitment and success.

As a big family with more than 18,000 staff (academic and administrative) and 189,000 local and global students, I call upon each of us to be a 'support group' for others by offering support and assistance to those in need so that we can both achieve the dream of making UiTM known to the international community by 2025. In shaa Allah.

Housing 17,389 students nationwide, FS KM is equipped with facilities like the Big Data Lab, High Performance Computing Lab, Cisco Academy Lab, Digital Forensic Lab, Security Operation Centre, and Global Learning Space. During her five-year tenure at INQKA, she managed all the quality initiatives of the university, including institutional accreditation, programme accreditation, quality excellence model, quality management systems, Innovation @ Work, and the University Ranking Project. She was responsible for driving UiTM rankings initiatives to achieve global prominence.

Roziah is a Professor of Statistics at the Faculty of Computer Sciences and Mathematics. Her area of teaching and research include Statistical Modelling, Measurement in Quality, Data Envelopment Analysis on Departmental Efficiency, University Impact Study, Structural Equation Modelling, Customer Satisfaction Modelling, and Survey Design, Learner Success Model, Values Survey, Online CPI, and University Impact Study.



My Walkabout Tour DISCOVERED MORE THAN JUST FUTURE READY TALENT



The Faculty of Architecture, Planning, and Surveying (FSPU) was founded in 1967 as the School of Applied Arts, with just 60 students in the initial batch. It now has 14,801 students in Shah Alam, Puncak Alam, Seri Iskandar, Arau, and Kota Samarahan. In 2020, its Graduate Employability was at 85.3 percent, and it was ranked in the Top 200 by QS World University Rankings by Subject. All programmes at FSPU are accredited by both local and international professional bodies.

My tour of the FSPU in Shah Alam was extended to the FSPU in Puncak Alam, where I visited studios and labs such as the Durian Dome lab, which is an artificial sky simulator that can reproduce any type of sky in a different context of a region, and the Wind Tunnel Testing lab, which allows students to predict wind loads over buildings and other structures using physical models. And lastly, to the 3D system modelling lab. The lab is equipped with CNC milling machine and laser cutter that allows students to produce precise quality models. Dr Nik Farhanah Nik Azhari and Encik Muhamad Jadir Ilias guided me on the walkabout tour, explaining each lab facility and technology accessible at the faculty.

Then, on October 27, 2021, I attended a walkabout tour to the Faculty of Business and Management (FBM). It surprised me because they were all dressed in the same hue as myself. The colour of the day was green. The walkabout tour starts with a presentation, and I was told that 75% of the personnel is female. I counselled them to strike a balance between job and family life. As a lecturer, you must be able to control your emotions and treat your students professionally. We should all respect one another.

In the recent QS World University Rankings by Subject 2021, FBM continues to perform well in three leading subjects: Accounting and Finance, Business Management Studies, Economics and Econometrics.

Meanwhile, I am excited to return to this faculty since they have plans to have Maybank, Chatime, and He & She on campus as part of their retail programme collaborations.

I continued my tour to the Faculty of Accountancy, which is located close to the FBM. The faculty includes 66 PhD holders and 8 Professors, with a total of 44 lecturers teaching accounting programmes to 3,766 students in the Selangor branch. In 2020, the graduate employment rate remained excellent at 90.6 percent, ranking fourth in Malaysia for Accounting and Finance. Faculty

of Accountancy is highly renowned for its students' outstanding achievement as the ACCA world's top prize recipients.

I told the faculty members that we should not limit ourselves to being the greatest on our own territory. The faculty must discover and nurture young academics so that they may co-write and participate in research with recognised partners. I urged them to collaborate with librarians to improve the quality of their research articles. Choose the top 30 talents to focus on writing in the Q1 and Q2 journals.

In every faculty I've visited thus far, staff and students have expressed grave concerns about the safety and conduciveness of the amenities, including internet access. I want the Infrastructure and Infostructure officials to undertake preventative maintenance and service improvement on a regular basis, rather than waiting for complaints.

From the Best World's Top 200 Architecture & Built Environment by Subject, good performance in leading subjects in Business and Management, to the home of #1 ACCA world-prize, my walkabout tour discovered more than just future ready talent. - RT

I also welcomed recommendations from AP Dr Ramesh Nair and look forward to receiving his presentation.

I attended a PTAR hybrid presentation and was excited to see a coming new feature of the library on professors' and researchers' profiles. My visit continued with a visit to the Faculty of Art & Design.

As a leading institution for art and design studies, I think that the faculty should do more to enhance its ranking and effectively connect with its alumni by writing and publishing works about them. Concurrently, it should also organise 5S programmes and endeavour to make the work/learning space safer and more conducive.

Lastly, let's be kind to ourselves and to everyone around us. May Allah continue to bestow upon us His guidance and keep us on a straight path. The Faculty of Information Management offers programmes at UiTM Selangor, Kedah, Kelantan, Sarawak, Johor, and Negeri Sembilan, with accreditation from the MBOT, iSchool, and IASL. With a total enrolment of 2,329, the faculty is a forerunner in Information Studies, attracting foreign students to pursue studies and international partners to cooperate with the faculty through a variety of reciprocal activities.



FROM LAKAR WANITA TO iCEPS



I am looking forward to reading your research papers on such creative works that should contribute to our pursuit of increased quality research in the field of creative arts.

My walkabout tour continued with the Department of Human Resource Management (JPSM), of the Registrar's Office. This time, I was able to take a closer look at the workspace and get to know more closely each of the staff at the department. During the session, I thanked the Registrar for his prompt action on the proposed initiative in matters of academic staff promotion.

Walking from the top floor to the ground, I next visited RMC, using a shortcut to reach from one section to another starting from the JPSM to the Bangunan Wawasan. The briefing was delivered by the Director and attended by the staff who worked from the office. 

IoT Transforming the Future of Agriculture

To date, the Faculty of Plantation and Agrotechnology, or FPA, has produced over 15,000 graduates. FPA, which is located on the Jasin campus, offers 17 academic programmes ranging from undergraduate to postgraduate studies. Notably, FPA has collaborated with top agro-tech companies to provide a BTech degree (2U1.5i)- Bachelor of Smart Crop Production Technology.

Equipped with modern facilities and cutting-edge technology for teaching and learning as well as research, FPA is utilising IoT for modern farming, including autonomous tractors for precision farming. Its digital plantation that is linked with the SDGs has made the faculty a centre of reference in the field of plantation management and agrotechnology.

The faculty has 3,749 in enrolment and its primary areas of specialisation include plantation management, crop protection, agricultural business, agricultural biotechnology, soil science, agricultural & biological engineering technology and more.



Among the initiatives that have contributed to the university's income generation are Pineapple MD2, Chilis Fertigation, Kelulut Honey, and others. The faculty has also worked with international partners such as the University of Arkansas in the United States, Nagoya University in Japan, Procter & Gamble (P&G), The University of Queensland in Australia, and Bayers Co.

FPA now has more than RM3.4 million in research funds, and its academicians have been selected as ministerial policy advisors and visiting scientists abroad. Listening to their presentation during my walkabout tour of this faculty was inspiring, and I commend their unwavering dedication in attending this event.



The faculty must prepare for the future, particularly in terms of food security, by strengthening its research and innovation capabilities. At the same time, remain up to date on your field of expertise and practise good time management, since this indicates your degree of discipline.

Thank you for sharing your concerns during the Q&A, Mr Mohd Khusyairi, Ms Azma, Ms Zaiton, and Ms Samiha. Despite the imbalance plantation personnel, you have handled it successfully; nonetheless, please proceed with your applications and get ratio standards from peer industries, particularly government organisations involved in the agro business.

Following the presentation session, I had the opportunity to see the agrotech plantation, which spans 100 acres. To everyone in Keluarga UiTM at FPA, thank you for your kindness and enthusiasm. - RT

I continued my walkabout tour to the Faculty of Dentistry after the Faculty of Medicine. I was brought to Amethyst, a boutique dental specialist clinic. The atmosphere was very calming and welcoming, and the décor was the work of AP Dr Nik Mazuan, as he has been known to have the special touch.

During the walkabout, I met Dr. Shawal Mohamad, who showed me the activity at Oral Surgery 5, and then I met 2 final year students, Zurain and Afwan, who had just completed extraction clinical sessions. I went on to the Citrine Clinic, where I met Mohd Hafiz and his friend Nur Syazwani, and observed outpatients being managed by Year Four students.

I had the pleasure of seeing children attending oral health education sessions handled by students, and an opportunity to meet with participants from MoH attending a dental workshop, of which one of them was En. Hidir.

Next, I went to the Dental Simulation Lab, where students in Year Three were practising endodontics. There I spoke with Anis Nadhirah about her dental project, which required her to report her work via IDERMS - an online platform jointly developed by the faculty and the Info-structure department. I really appreciate the faculty's initiative to make the evaluation paperless and digital. Finally, I went to the Odontologica Gallery, which exhibits dental history of the world and some dental instruments.

The faculty now offers one bachelor's degree, three master's degree, and eleven PhD programmes, with five additional programmes set to begin soon. Its Doctor of Clinical Dentistry (Orthodontics) programme, as well as two other doctoral and two master's programmes, have received full accreditation from the MQA (Malaysian Qualifications Agency).

According to the dean, the faculty is preparing to establish a partnership with Xi'an University China on reciprocal academic exchanges. Creating a balanced work and life, the faculty recognises academics, administrative personnel, and students' accomplishments through a variety of platforms. In addition, the faculty has taken the initiative to award research funds to eligible lecturers in order to encourage them to publish research papers on a regular basis. As a result, I urge the lecturers to provide more significant data in the future, as well as to go through the appropriate channel (e.g UTV) to commercialise their research products.



At the same time, I would like to reiterate that "research funds are for researchers," therefore the Bursar's office needs to facilitate this important agenda. In the meantime, top performing authors of the faculty must continue to collaborate with authors worldwide. Select, strategize, and then co-write with your MoU partners so that we may improve our ranking.

I understand that each faculty has its own unique approach to achieving visibility. Simply ensure that everything you publish is consistent with the university's vision and communication strategy. You have an excellent message to convey about your faculty: enhance your existing talent pool so that they may produce more fresh talents for us.

As I left the building, my thoughts were UiTM Faculty of Dentistry should be above and beyond the best. Until then, see you soon. - RT



The Faculty of Education (EDU) will be celebrating its 25th anniversary next year. An important fact I discovered during my walkabout tour to the faculty. The session was held in a hybrid mode and I was moved by the faculty's unique approach in preparing a creative space for this tour.

Housing 71 academics and 20 administrative staff, the faculty currently has 62 percent of its academics holding PhDs, while its TESL graduate employment rate is 100 percent. Aside from TESL, EDU provides a wide range of educational fields such as STEM, Physical and Health Education, Arts, Instructional Technology, and others. The EDU eco-systematic approach addresses the creation of a conducive learning environment that includes academic personnel, curriculum, facilities and resources, and student activities. For example, EDU has taken the initiative to finance 17 students to attend



the CIDL Asian programme as well as given incentives to enhance scholarly publication among academics.

GRU2025 is our shared aspiration, therefore I would encourage anyone who is applying Network Theory to strive towards it, and administrators must be involved with academics in carrying out the plan. At the same time, I encouraged 11 EDU academicians who were seconded to other departments within the system to use the chance to advance this faculty. Simultaneously, they should engage with the community, for example, by organising spiritual programmes with the surrounding Muslim community.

Metaphorically, life is like flying a kite, therefore having a well-aligned operational model is critical when speed and agility are

Discover More about Future UiTM: TROPICAL MEDICINE AND MEDICAL ILLUSTRATOR ARE JUST TWO OF MANY AREAS WE SHOULD ENHANCE FURTHER

On November 5, 2021, I went to the UiTM Sungai Buloh campus to complete my walkabout tour of the Faculty of Medicine.

The event held in a hybrid mode began with a presentation involving members of the faculty. In 2003, there were 20 students enrolled in the undergraduate programme; currently, there are 1,115 students. The MBBS programme has been awarded a five-year accreditation until 2023. Meanwhile, there are 342 academics and 133 administrative personnel housed at the faculty and to date it has a total of 2,095 alumni.

During the MCO, the faculty administered exams using the UFUTURE platform. With 16 postgraduate programmes already available, the faculty is preparing to launch three new programmes: Master of Emergency Medicine, Master of Rehabilitation Medicine, and Master of Anaesthesiology & Critical Care. Currently, UiTM is collaborating with the IJN (National Heart Institute) on a cardiothoracic post-graduate programme, the first of its kind in the country.



In the meantime, I would like to congratulate Afiiq Aiman Abd Ghapor, a Ph.D. candidate who represented the country at the recent 3MT Virtual Asia Pacific Championship with his thesis research. Afiiq previously earned first place in the Science & Technology category in the 2021 Malaysia Virtual 3MT and was named the National Grand Champion.

The Olympiad programme piqued my interest; therefore, I would advise other faculties to organise similar programmes to help young people discover their talents. The idea of having a medical illustrator and a medical education graphic designer appealed to me. I don't believe in generalising things because each department has its distinct demands. Please forward your proposal to my office, and the Registrar's Office must act on the criteria of new and future employment in order to reduce knowledge and technology gap. Meanwhile, as you have three separate campus sites to service, please resolve your time management scheduling.

I was impressed with Dr Heo Chong Chin as Director of IMMB (Institute of Medical Molecular Biotechnology) and the work, particularly on Tropical Medicine, done there. This is one of our areas of strength in research and innovation and I eagerly await future IMMB discoveries. We have researchers in UiTM specialising in Tropical diseases and this is so apt as our researches involve real cases of tropical diseases. Moreover, UiTM has innovative products related to tropical medicine such as control of mosquito population and detection of dengue, etc.

Similarly, please focus on programmes with high public impact and interest and forward the information to the communications department for media coverage. Also, collaborate closely with librarians to improve the impact of your publications and make use of the library's repository, particularly for health and medical studies.

I concluded my meeting at the Faculty of Medicine with a visit to the Med Museum. I wish to thank Dr Muhamad Yusuf and Dr Nurfareha for assisting and briefing me on the history of the Med Museum and the specimens on exhibit such as the respiratory, hepatobiliary, gastrointestinal, and reproductive systems, and how they were gathered. - RT

86% of FSPPP Alumni Serve as Diplomatic Administrative Officers (PTD) in the Country, While 14% Serve Abroad

The Faculty of Administrative Science and Policy Studies (FSPPP) offers 11 academic programmes from Diploma to PhD degrees. With 3,848 students, 50% of its 82 academic staff have PhD qualifications. Their core areas are Public Administration, Policy Studies, Political Science, Corporate Administration, International Relations & Diplomatic.

During the presentation by the Dean of the faculty, I provided feedback based on the SWOT analysis presented. I suggested that the faculty turn its existing weaknesses into strengths. I also recommend that the faculty's management



hire contract staff who focus on the management and operational work of the faculty's income generation activities. In addition, FSPPP needs to promote its activities, achievements, and expertise more actively through popular media channels. At the same time, it should continuously improve its research and publication performance.

FSPPP also has a dual executive master's programme through an MoA with Universitas Airlangga Indonesia. The faculty has 21 international students. 86% of FSPPP Alumni serve as Diplomatic Administrative Officers (PTD) in the country, while 14% of the alumni serve abroad. - RT



FSK now offers 43 academic programmes spanning from undergraduate to postgraduate courses, as well as an Advanced Diploma in Cardiac Nursing (a collaboration with UiTM Hospital). Today FSK has 2,157 students enrolled, with 43 percent of its lecturers possessing PhD degrees, with another 29 percent working on completing their PhDs. In this regard, I applaud the faculty's commitment to boost the number of academic personnel with PhDs.

As part of its academic activities, the faculty manages the Rehabilitation Centres comprising UiTM Vision Care (Optometry Clinic), Medical Imaging Lab, Physiotherapy Centre, Diet Care Centre, and Occupational Therapy Centre managed by 124 administrative staff, the majority of whom are Medical and Health officers.

My recommendation is that FSK embark on a personalised promotion exercise, identifying weaknesses and strengths so that you may coach and guide your future leaders. Provide them with KPIs that will motivate them to meet the goal.

I don't believe in generalising things. You need to employ a personalise method in carrying out this promotion exercise. Good profile implies that you will be able to grow in your job. Meanwhile,

I foresee ILD as a driving force in the success of FUTURE UiTM apart from providing the greatest hospitality to all stakeholders, regardless of rank or position.

At the same time, I'm delighted to hear from the employees during the Q&A. Please send your proposal on the rotational staff deployment and work shift scheme, as well as the curation sharing session, to my office.



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



At the Sustainability Pavilion of Expo 2020 Dubai, I joined in a conversation on Future Digital Education with the DG of Higher Education Malaysia, Dato' Prof. Dr. Husaini Omar, and two other panellists, Dato' Prof. Ts. Dr. Mohd Ekhwan Hj. Toriman, VC of UKM and AP Ir. Dr. Rosdiazli Ibrahim, Dean, Centre for Graduate Studies, UTP.


The session took place on the 13th of December 2021 in hybrid mode at 10:00 a.m. live from Dubai, and at 2:00 p.m. via MoHE's Facebook page live stream.

The seminar was focused on the transformation of higher education in the post COVID-19 pandemic era with digitalisation as an enabler of education in the future. The panellists deliberated on the changes required in the university ecosystem and the mindset of educators and students in order to overcome the challenges of the post pandemic environment. To add to this, the panellists agreed on a number of issues such as the migration from traditional systems to digitalisation in all aspects of university processes. They also acknowledged that flexibility of curriculum and teaching and learning delivery should be a part of the solution in the new norm. Other pertinent issues discussed included the university community's

preparedness for digitalisation, methods of maintaining quality, as well as ensuring positive outcome from digital education.

I believe that apart from the issues mentioned above, UiTM has managed to digitalise 2,500 of our courses and delivered digital T&L to 180 thousand students in the past 4 semesters, which means that student pathway in UiTM is almost fully digitalised. We have managed to mitigate issues of mental health by establishing Virtual Buddies and tele-counselling and dealing with poor internet access by bringing those affected back on campus. If UiTM wants to prepare our graduates for the future, personalised education is the way forward and for this, we have our home grown LMS (Learning Management System) i.e. UFUTURE, which also facilitates micro-credential qualifications for the upskilling and reskilling of our staff and students. Preparation of students for the future also requires them to move from dependency to independency, and I am proud to claim that UiTM is the first university to conduct a PhD viva voce online.

My message to the international audience is - UiTM will be sure to provide the best digital experience when you enrol and be part of #KeluargaUiTM. - RT

Coffee Talk with Rozie Episode 23 is a special edition because it falls on the 100th Day of my tenure as the Vice-Chancellor of UiTM. In this episode I reflected on the following: Mission Dubai, Building Keluarga UiTM, Leadership and Personalisation, Future UiTM and Rozie Times. As the 6th Vice-Chancellor I vow to continue with the plan that has already been put into place by the former VC, YBhg. Prof. Emeritus Datuk Ir. Dr. Mohd Azraai Kassim and other preceding UiTM leaders to whom I am certainly indebted. Strategic Action Plans for GRU2025 will be my priority.

Mission Dubai

Transmitting live from Expo 2020 Dubai with the theme "Connecting Minds and Creating the Future", I had a one-stop access to 192 countries at the Expo and it represents a befitting closure to the 100 days. UiTM's participation in this expo is in line with our aspiration to become a Globally Renowned University in 2025. Our objective is to promote UiTM to the world under the coordination of the Ministry of Higher Education Malaysia.

Building Keluarga UiTM

My main focus for UiTM is the people - building Keluarga UiTM. We are ranked 9th in Malaysia, 150th on the Green Metric, and 105th in AUR. We received the ePayment Excellence Award, and at MTE2021 COVID-19 International Innovation Awards II, we won 4 outstanding innovation awards, 4 gold awards, 6 silver awards and 6 bronze awards, while KIK Era dan i-Clique saw our library (PTAR) receiving the Par Excellence Award at the 64th International Convention on QCC 2021. We have acquired a 5 Star MyMOHES rating, and our research grant totalled RM40,911,729.00 in Q3. Recently our researchers won 19 gold, 4 silver, 1 bronze and 3 special awards at ITEX 2021. UiTM International Academic Presence is recorded at 80.3% for 2021 QS Global Academic Surveys. None of these achievements are possible without the dedication and loyalty of Warga UiTM from all across the system - from academics (lecturers and students alike) to administrative and support staff all over the country - Keluarga UiTM.

My second major concern then is communication - connecting with Keluarga UiTM. I tackled this by embarking on a walkabout tour to all 59 faculties, PTJs and campuses within my first 100 days as VC. Through the walkabout I engaged with 11,133 Warga UiTM, which constitutes 60% of the total number of staff, and Student Representative Councils from 8 branch campuses. I also continued with the Coffee Talk with Rozie series, of which 8 episodes have reached more than 12 thousand viewers.

Leadership and Personalisation

As leaders, we need to understand our stakeholders and decisions must be made based on facts. Communicating decisions clearly to the people is key.

Personalisation is crucial to the future of education because in order to have quality, we need to give the best to customers. Technology has made it possible for UiTM to fully activate T&L using ODL, rolling out to 186,000 students. We have now digitalised the pathway of students from the day they enter the university to the day they graduate. iCEPS has developed micro-credentials and a platform fortified with cloud computing capabilities serving 186,000 UiTM students, 13,116 academics, housing 5,738 courses with 615 MOOC, and 682,329 content uploads. Based on these numbers, we undoubtedly have the best to offer; all that remains is for us to boost our visibility, and then we will surely be a GRU.

Future UiTM

To deal with the lack of finance, we will focus on maintenance. We need to ensure that we care for our assets and maximize their use as we proceed with all the university's business of teaching and learning, and research. We should cultivate maintenance culture as this will lead to cost savings. Cultivate the culture of reading and involvement in the digitisation of the system that has been established in UiTM. Ensure that all Warga UiTM contribute and that there are no burnout issues. Successful researchers should be given full support, and efficient lecturers should not be over-used.

To be a globally renowned university, we need to first and foremost become visible, and build our reputation. The strengths that we already have need to be optimised, for the sake of continuous excellence. Areas of research and studies that have been our niche should be given further support. The people and faculties involved should be recognised and celebrated: researchers like Dr Heo Chong Chin, Director of IMMB research on Tropical Disease, ACCA student Hannah Mumtazah Ahmad Murshidi who placed first in Malaysia and second in the world for Strategic Business Reporting (SBR), three-time Olympian and final year Bachelor of Sports Science (Hons) student Khairulnizam Afendy, and Olympic debutant Junji Karimah Noor Jamali, a first-year Diploma in Sports Studies student, to name a few.



Empowering Community Through Social Enterprise

One example of our endeavour to empower the community is the made-in-UiTM washable Batik face mask project in collaboration with the alumni and single mothers around Selangor through the Knowledge Transfer Programme initiated by UiTM GESTURZ (Galeri Seni Tuanku Nur Zahirah). The mask features the national heritage of Malaysian Batik with the finest design inspired by local flora and fauna motifs. The Social Enterprise Project empower these 2 groups by diversifying their source of income especially during the pandemic.

In a walkabout program on 27 September 2021 at PPII, UiTM Green Centre shared its initiatives in upholding the university's efforts towards a Smart Campus by 2025. Among the efforts that piqued my interest were the UiTM campus solar project, Smart Meter for water consumption monitoring and power, and the 'One to One Tree' project aimed at creating a smart, safe, and sustainable campus in keeping with UiTM's GRU 2025 agenda.

Meanwhile, on 10 November 2021, during the audience experience session of The Global Goals 2021, the IBSD (Institute for Biodiversity and Sustainable Development) presented the university's sustainability initiatives, which demonstrated some changes and improvements in reporting quality compared to the first year's report.

At the same time as the audience experience session, more than 120 leaders met in Glasgow to attend the COP26 climate summit which is considered the 'last and best hope' for tackling the climate crisis and avoiding the threat of natural disasters globally.

Then, on a series of walkabout to the branch campuses, I took part in tree planting activities. One of the reasons was Joanna Mounce Stancil's article written in 2019. According to Joanna, who is attached to the USDA (US Department of Forestry), one huge tree may provide up to four people with oxygen every day. As a result, we should realize "the power of one tree" from now on.

I was at the Kuala Pilah campus on November 30, 2021, and one of the programmes was a visit to the Sustainable Forest Interpretation Centre. It covers 300 acres and is home to a variety of flora and fauna including the Pacific Swallow, Malayan Tapir, Black Panther, Connarus Semidecandrus, Trema Cannabina, and others. Dr. Salleh, En. Muhadirin, and his colleagues are every enthusiastic about this. They seem



to have a strong connection with nature, based on what I've seen. This reminds me of the 2019 UiTM Curated Ads Campaign's triumph in a competition organised by a world-renowned university rating body. The advertisements series transmitted ideas such as "reconnect with nature" and "education reconnects you with the universe" while bringing the theme "reconnect your world with UiTM" to life.

Meanwhile, I visited UiTM Solar Park 1 in Paya Besar on November 6, 2021, and UiTM Solar Park 2 in Pasir Gudang on November 28, 2021. I am hopeful that the efforts of UiTM Holdings, led by En. Muhammad Mubarak, Acting Chief Executive Officer, will assist to achieve goal #7 of the SDGs to ensure access to efficient, sustainable energy, as well as foster growth and help conserve the environment.

These are only some of the ongoing projects that Keluarga UiTM is involved in. This year, UiTM is placed 150th in the world out of 956 universities in the UI GreenMetric World University Rankings (UIGM). UiTM is ranked 9th out of 28 institutions in Malaysia, in its third year of participation. This accomplishment should be viewed as more than merely a ranking among the participating universities.

Keluarga UiTM must be consistent in our green efforts for the sake of future generations and the sustainability of our world. The ranking will serve as a framework for measuring and replicating the impact of programmes that eventually safeguard nature and humans for the greater good. Congratulations to all Keluarga UiTM members on receiving the UIGM recognition. May today's success motivate us to achieve the GRU2025. - RT
