## **ABSTRACT**

This research discusses on the enforcement of gun control regulation in Malaysia, the focal point of this research is the prevention strategy is more important rather than enforcement of gun control regulation. By definition, enforcement means the act of compelling observance of or compliance with a law while prevention means the action of stopping something from happening.

## **CHAPTER 1**

### INTRODUCTION

### 1.0 BACKGROUND OF RESEARCH

The index crimes<sup>1</sup> in Malaysia have tremendously increased, in which as at September 2013, the statistics rose to 74.9%.<sup>2</sup> This number indicates that the levels of crime in Malaysia is unacceptably high.

Up to July 2013, there are 30 gunshot cases and some were shot dead since April 2013.<sup>3</sup> This number shows that 8 cases per month and approximately 2 cases per week.<sup>4</sup> This obviously shows that shot has gone viral in Malaysia. Among the high profiles cases were the incidents of shooting involving the former Director General of Customs, Datuk Shaharudin Ibrahim in Putrajaya on the 26<sup>th</sup> April 2013<sup>5</sup>, the death of founder of Arab Malaysia Bank, Hussain Ahmad Najadi in Kuala Lumpur on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2013,<sup>6</sup> and also the manager of the bank was shot to death in the evening after office hours, by the security guard, respectively.<sup>7</sup>
