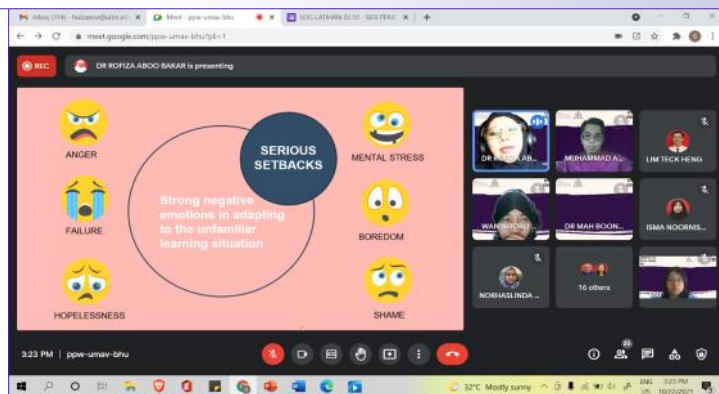

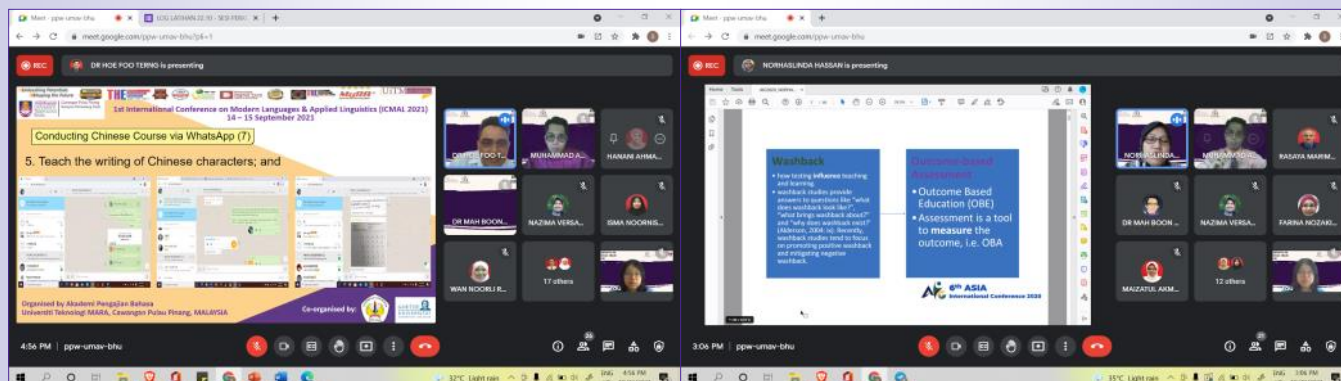
## APB & Webitors Sharing Session 2021

APB and Webitors - the first Special Interest Group of APB have organised the 2021 sharing session virtually on the 22nd and 29th of October from 3 pm to 5 pm. The 2021 sharing session was held in two different sessions. The first session focused on the sharing of papers presented by APB members at any conference before. The second session was presented by Webitors members to share the insights related to educational technology. The objective of this sharing session is to create a platform for APB members to share their thoughts, research ideas and new knowledge. Thirteen APB members took part in this sharing session and a total of seventeen papers were presented.



On the 22nd of October, the session started with two papers shared by Dr. Rofiza Aboo Bakar entitled “Discovering a Muslim Scholar’s Speech Skills through Digital Storytelling: A Qualitative Content Analysis” and “Re-visiting Engineering Students’ Affective Components to Online Learning during Covid-19: A Narrative Review”. Then Lim Teck Heng continued the session by sharing his idea on an easier way to record students’ attendance. Next, a video presentation was shared by Nazima Versay Kudus regarding self-improvement in family and career. Wan Noorli Razali took the floor and shared a paper entitled “The Perception of Students of UiTM, Cawangan Pulau Pinang Towards the Use of Salutations in WhatsApp Conversations”. The session was continued with the sharing by Seng Hui Zanne regarding the reconstruction of stereotyped identities. Hanani Ahmad Zubir took her turn to share two papers entitled “Delving into Multiracial Community in Scorpion Orchid” and “This is not a Hoax!: A Thematic Analysis Investigating a Muslim Scholar’s Advice about Covid-19 Pandemic through Digital Storytelling”. The last presentation on the 22nd of October was the sharing of Associate Professor Dr. Hoe Foo Teng regarding the use of WhatsApp in Teaching Mandarin during the Covid-19 Pandemic.



On the 29th of October, the first presentation was the sharing of two papers by Dr. Haslinda Hassan which focused on the outcome-based assessment, entitled “Test Consequences and Classroom Practices: An Outcome-based Assessment Experience in Malaysia” and “Washback on Learning: The Experience of Outcome-based Assessment in a Higher Learning Institution in Malaysia”. Next, Rasaya Marimuthu took his turn and shared his paper “Social Presence In Online Language Learning: How Students Perceive Their Roles”. Then, the second session started with the presentations concentrated on the sharing of educational technology by Webitors members. Marni Jamil and Seng Hui Zanne shared some video creating and editing tools to facilitate the preparation of lesson materials. Suzana Ab. Rahim shared her idea on improving EET Speaking via WeCSI-enabled Web Portal. Lastly, Associate Professor Dr. Mah Boon Yih shared his presentation entitled “Self-access English Language Enrichment Hub (SELEH): The OER Booster for Your Class Team in Microsoft Teams”. This sharing session is a meaningful platform for APB members to exchange research ideas and new knowledge.
