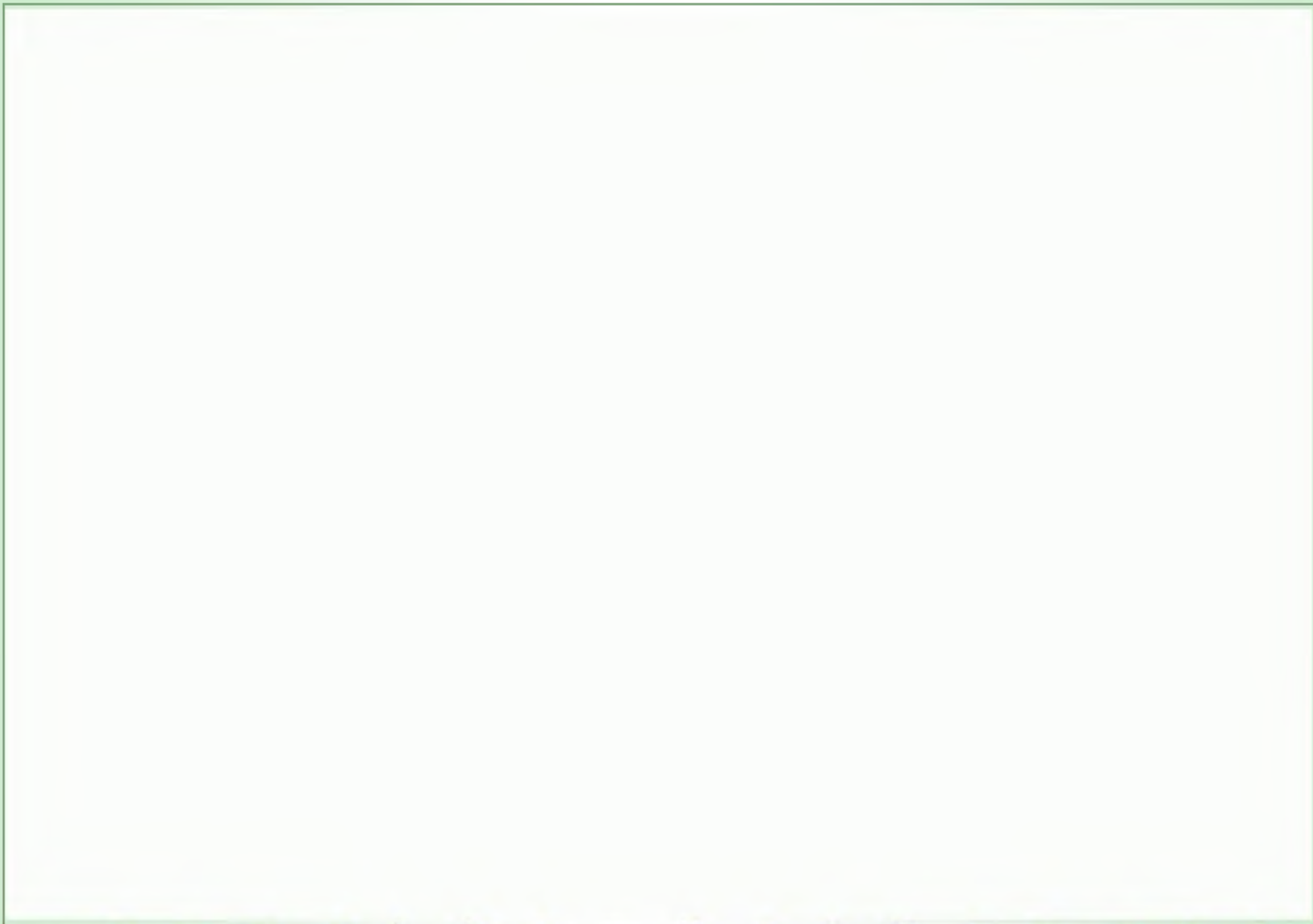

She was a multi-talented individual, held multiple roles during her lifetime - singer, actor, talent show judge and host (corporate events, television and radio).
