Global Goals:

UiTM at the Forefront in Green Initiative

his is how I started CTWR 2022 Episode 4. These words are apt because CTWR strives for a balance between relaxed but information-rich content. This episode was successfully broadcast live via UiTM's YouTube channel from the Tun Abdul Razak library (PTAR).

For this CTWR, I have invited two (2) panellists to speak on the topic of "Global Goals: UiTM at the Forefront in Green Initiative", namely Prof. Dato' Ir Ts. Dr Haji Mohd Fozi Ali , Vice-Chancellor, Universiti Teknologi MARA and Assoc. Prof. Datin Dr Arnis Asmat, Director of UiTM Green Centre (UGC).

In this episode, Prof. Dato' Fozi spoke about the role of the Office of Infrastructure & Infrastructure Development (PPII) in creating a green, sustainable campus ecosystem through the Green Initiative and Energy Saving for UITM, in line with the UITM 2025 Strategic Plan (GRU2025).

In total, PPII has designed six (6) initiatives for the period of 2020-2025. One of these is Campus Visibility and Sustainability, which focuses on improving infrastructure facilities, campus beautification, building upgrades and planned energy, water and waste management.

This long-term plan aims not only to increase financial savings and reduce UiTM's operating costs, but also to reduce its impact on the environment. For example, UiTM has an expenditure of about RM140 million on paying electricity bills every year. Through this Green Initiative and Energy Saving for UiTM, PPII has successfully achieved electricity cost savings of 10% through the UiTM Solar Farm Project (in Gambang and Pasir Gudang) and the Renewable Energy Photovoltaic Project for UiTM-owned campuses. This is indeed a very significant achievement for LITM.

In addition, the installation of the solar panel system, which became operational in May 2021, has successfully reduced UiTM's carbon footprint by 74,000 tonnes per year. These efforts also reduced some of UiTM's dependence on TNB power supply and will ultimately reduce carbon emissions into the air.

However, it is unlikely that these initiatives can achieve their goals without the awareness and support of all Keluarga UTM. Therefore, awareness of the importance of energy conservation needs to be promoted, starting with the Responsibility Centres (RC/PTJ), units, faculties and branch campuses to ensure that the goal of making UTM a carbon neutral university can be achieved.

Apart from this, Prof. Dato' Fozi also shared about some other energy saving initiatives that are currently being actively implemented by the PPII. These include the installation of photocells and timers in the corridor of the Engineering complex, switching the right tariff according to the profile of energy consumers (C1 Commercial tariff to C1 OPTR tariff), switching energy efficient appliances using existing service contracts, and installing motion sensors in the toilets of all UITM buildings. Moreover, the PPII also regularly monitors the use of the central airconditioning units and promotes Earth Hour at RC/PTJ level.

Next, Assoc. Prof. Datin Dr Arnis explained the efforts of the Green Centre or UGC, which was established under the PPII and is responsible for mobilising initiatives to green the university.

Overall, the UGC, which was established in October 2020, aims to support the sustainability agenda not only at the university and community level, but also globally. According to her, one of the roles of the UGC in general is to coordinate all activities, initiatives and innovations to create a holistic ecosystem for a green, sustainable UiTM campus. In addition, the UGC serves as a hub for collecting, analysing and reporting 'Big Data' on sustainability for various purposes, including university rankings at national and international levels.

Thanks to these initiatives, UiTM is very proud to be ranked 9th among higher education institutions in Malaysia in the UI Green Metric World University Rankings 2021 (UIGM 2021). UiTM's participation in 2021 has improved its position by 34 places compared to the previous year. Congratulations and well done Keluarga

Apart from that, the third participation of Universiti Teknologi MARA (UITM) in the Low Carbon City Challenge 2030 (LCC 2030 Challenge) made its own history when five LITM reports hylidiags was 5 Diamend Awards for 7 or

UITM zones/buildings won 5 Diamond Awards for Zone 1 UITM, Faculty of Computer and Mathematical Sciences (FSKM), Faculty of Architecture Planning and Surveying (FSPU), Tuanku Syed Sirajuddin Chancellery Building and Health Centre.

For the second year of participation (2020), UiTM received 6 Diamond Recognition for Best Practices Between 5-25% for Tuanku Syed Sirajuddin Chancellery Building, Engineering Complex, Health Centre, Faculty of Architecture Planning and Surveying (FSPU), Faculty of Computer and Mathematical Sciences (FSKM) and Zone 1 UiTM. UiTM also received a Provisional Certificate (2018) and Diamond Rating recognition for Best Practices for the Tuanku Syed Sirajuddin Chancellery Building (2019).

I was intrigued by Assoc. Prof. Datin Dr Arnis' phrase: "Green is expensive". Without the efforts, support and backing of every member of Keluarga UiTM, it is not easy to create a culture that sustains life and the environment. Therefore, each RC/PTJ must take the initiative to optimise collaboration with internal strategic partners such as faculties and student associations as well as joint ventures with local institutions or agencies to achieve the targets set under SDG 17. Therefore, it should be reminded once again that awareness or "cakna" on the initiatives to achieve "net zero carbon emissions" for the sustainability of this beloved university needs to be further strengthened.

Global Goals: UiTM at the Forefront in Pioneering Quality Education

his episode was successfully broadcast live via the UiTM YouTube channel from the UiTM Tuanku Syed Sirajuddin Chancellery Building on 18 June 2022. CTWR 2022 Episode 6 also featured a musical performance by Encik Abdul Hamid Abdul Halim, a lecturer from the Faculty of Business and Management.

This time I invited two guest panellists to talk about "Global Goals: UiTM at the Forefront in Pioneering Quality Education", namely Prof. Datin Dr Suzana Sulaiman, Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic and International), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) and Encik Rasydan Mohd Hassan, President of Student Representative Council (MPP), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM).

In this episode, Prof. Datin Dr Suzana spoke about the efforts and methods UiTM uses to achieve quality education based on three elements: the quality of lecturers, the quality of teaching and learning processes and the quality of graduates. This quality of education is measured against UiTM's key initiatives so that lecturers can do their best to serve both internal and external stakeholders. Each stakeholder has different expectations of UiTM, such as whether the graduates it produces are well-rounded, meet industry requirements and conform to expected standards and norms.

Prof. Datin Dr Suzana and I also talked about the role of the Centre for Innovative Delivery & Learning Development (CIDL), whose mission is to drive innovation in teaching and learning, keeping pace with the latest technological developments. The CIDL provides a comprehensive

learning platform for students and adults through 18 types of services that utilise creative and innovative technologies. UiTM has also established a collaborative teaching framework where lecturers can introduce team-teaching methods with experts within and across disciplines, such as industry professionals, to provide quality education to Keluarga UiTM.

In summary, Prof. Datin Dr Suzana believes that the current thinking and unwillingness of academics and students to move away from traditional approaches to teaching and learning should be re-evaluated. In order to achieve the SDG4 goals, UiTM has introduced new perspectives and methods using the 5C strategy: Champion, Communication, Collaboration & Collective Effort, Culture, and Credit & Compensation. Efforts have also been made to implement collaborative teaching, experiential learning and a competency-based education landscape (HETVEC, EXCEL) while promoting ADAB, Amanah, ESI and I- DART.

In this episode, YDP MPP Encik Rasydan discussed the impact of quality education on students and the teaching methods UiTM uses in preparing graduates to meet industry demands. He explained that educational requirements change over time and that the university's curriculum must go through a process of "reset, recover and restore" to ensure that everyone receives a quality education. Students also need to be aware of what is required and what they need to do to make the most of the opportunities offered by the university.

Encik Rasydan and I also talked about extracurricular learning, which has a big impact on students. He said that the method of learning outside the classroom through collaborative activities sets UiTM students apart from other universities. For example, UiTM was the first university to volunteer during the flood disaster not long ago. Students need to be more ambitious and open by being of use to the betterment of the environment and the community. This in turn will bring the community, business and industry closer to the students and take the student experience to a whole new level.

Summing up, Encik Rasydan said that in order to maintain quality education, it is necessary to determine whether the university's curriculum is still relevant, and furthermore, to provide facilities and services that meet the requirements of IR 4.0 and Education 5.0.

I also hope that Keluarga UiTM, especially all UiTM lecturers and students, have a better understanding of the quality of education that UiTM provides and the methods used to ensure that these efforts remain relevant to the needs of industry and employers.

Global Goals: UiTM at the Forefront in Ensuring Food Security

Prof. Ts. Dr Mohd Rasdi Zaini, the Rector of Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), Melaka Branch and Prof. Ts. Dr Asmah Awal, the Deputy Rector (Research and Innovation), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), Selangor Branch

In this episode, Assoc. Prof. Dr Rasdi talked about the importance of food safety and explains how it encompasses various aspects, including the guarantee of food produced from the farm to the consumer's dining table. It covers the process of producing and manufacturing agricultural products, packaging, marketing, and storing

A food crisis can occur when the country is unable to supply itself with staple foods such as rice, wheat, and grains, and it ultimately has a major impact on the sharp rise in prices. The country spent, the country spent RM55.5 billion on food imports in 2020 alone, compared to the country's exports of RM33.8 billion. The increase in imports has increased by 24.9% compared to 2019 due to the pandemic.

The Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (FAO) has outlined four indicators to ensure that a country's food security is at a safe level. First, is the availability of food. Second, is the purchasing power of consumers. Third, is the convenience or access to food. Fourth, is the convenience or access to a supply of

Based on these indicators, UiTM has developed several initiatives to assist the country in ensuring the sustainability of food security. For example, the Faculty of Plantation and Agrotechnology (FPA) has increased the number of programmes offered from three to 17 to meet industry demand for semi-professional labour and increase national productivity. FPA also intends to offer micro credentials to upskill and retrain farmers and herders in the face of future challenges such as lack of jobs and food. It is also able to meet industry needs in the areas of production, policy, and research.

In addition, the UiTM initiative also includes the development of 1000 acres of unused land around the branch campuses for teaching and learning, rese commercialisation. Food yields are also constantly monitored and audited at the farm level, not only on the basis of productivity but also to ensure clean and guaranteed healthy and safe food yields through the basic principles of good agricultural practices.

Given the challenges and problems we face today, we note that there are several aspects that can be improved to further increase the level of food security in the country. For example, the need to focus on developing young talent. The younger

generation today is a little less interested in getting into agriculture and plantation farming. However, they are very interested in gadgets and technology applications. Therefore, Keluarga UiTM can take advantage of this opportunity by using technology to attract students through the digitisation of agriculture, such as smart technology, urban agriculture and precision farming

In addition, research and development must become more aggressive and proactive to ensure national food security in line with the UiTM 2025 Plan. Each of us has our role to play,

be it as an educator. a stakeholder or a government agency, to achieve the government's aspirations of ensuring a continuous supply of food and not relying too much on imported food.

Prof. Ts. Dr Asmah Awal spoke on quality research and innovation to ensure safety and supply of adequate and nutritious food throughout the year.

According to the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) standard, food must be sufficient, safe, nutritious and ensure that a person can actively participate in daily activities. This means that Global Goal 2: Zero Hunger is a state where the food consumed has an impact on a person's physicality and improves life performance. In the context of Malaysia, we are fortunate that food security in the country currently ranks second in Asia after Singapore. In other words, we have no problems with the adequacy of food.

As for the Global Food Security Index (GFSI), Malaysia is currently ranked 39th. The GFSI takes into account issues of food affordability, availability, quality and safety, as well as natural resources and resilience in 113 countries. I agree that this is also a good indicator. I also agree that food research needs to be refined in the future

In terms of food research, innovation and commercialisation, UiTM is a university that produces many plantation graduates and is nationally and internationally renowned. This includes collaboration with the Indian Institute of Plantations Management (IIPM) in India under a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). UiTM is also well positioned for research in agricultural commodities, cash crops and future crops. Thus, we are contributing not only in the present but also in the future in the field of crops and

I also very much agree with the words of Prof. Ts. Dr Asmah that we are all agriculturists and that food related research must be in line with the Dasar Agromakanan Negara 2021-2030 (DAN 2.0). DAN 2.0 was enacted as an effort by the government to ensure food security by transforming the country's food system

According to Prof. Ts. Dr Asmah Awal, UiTM Selangor Branch has been commissioned as a research-oriented campus and appointed as a consultant to the Lembaga Pertubuhan Peladang Malaysia in the Eleventh Malaysia Plan 2016-2020. Because of this reputation, UiTM has received many invitations from various parties to conduct joint

research with the industry on modern agriculture. Recently, studies have begun between the industry and our own Attaur-Rahman Institute for Natural Products (AuRIns).

Current research priorities include the study of Black Turmeric (Curcuma Caesia), which is also a crop of the future. UiTM will also research the Ketum plant or its scientific name, Mitragyna speciosa. I am happy to see that UiTM is making rapid progress in smart and modern agriculture. We also need to push seed-based research.

In relation to action, sustainability and formula to ensure food security and achieve GRU2025, Prof. Ts. Dr Asmah Awal stated that we need to be smart in selecting the crops of the future like Pokok Kabong (Arenga pinnata). Collaboration with other faculties, such as the Faculty of Business Management and the Faculty of Information Management, must also be strengthened to ensure that precision agriculture and precision health are among UiTM's priorities in the future.

Thus, in my opinion, food security is not only linked to basic nutrition, but also to economic stability and empowerment, long-term health and the environment.

UiTM in Championing Sustainable Cities & Communities

his episode was successfully broadcast live via UiTM's YouTube channel on 14 July 2022 from Dewan Resital Panca Sakti, Bangunan Pusat Kebudayaan, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM).

This time, I invited two panellists to talk about "Global Goals: UiTM in Championing Sustainable Cities and Communities", namely Prof. Ts. Dr Norazah Abd Rahman, Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research & Innovation), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM); and Prof. TPr. Dr Jamalunlaili Abdullah, Dean of the Faculty of Architecture, Planning and Surveying, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM).

CTWR 2022 Episode 7 also featured a musical performance by Kumpulan String Quartet, led by Encik Radzali Mustaffa from the Conservatory of Music, College of Creative Arts, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UTM). In this episode, Prof. Ts. Dr Norazah Abd Rahman shared the efforts and role of the TNCPI office to ensure the sustainability of research and innovation in relation to Sustainable Development Goal 11 at UiTM, especially to achieve GRU2025 status.

Prof. TPr. Dr Jamalunlaili Abdullah gave his views on the efforts and roles that need to be played to ensure that UITM achieves the Urban and Community Sustainability Agenda for Sustainable Development Goal 11.

Prof. Ts. Dr Norazah explained that her office is very committed to supporting the sustainability of research at UiTM based on 4 components namely People, Operation, Ecosystem, and Output.

The UiTM research group is also in a position to make a significant impact on the global community. For example, a UiTM research group has conducted research to improve the living standards of B40 to M40 families. UiTM also established the Institute for Biodiversity and Sustainable Development (IBSD) on the on 3 June 2020 as a driving force for sustainable development and will therefore highlight UITM's role in Global Goals 11.

Currently, UiTM is taking a leading role in supporting the Sustainable Development Goals in general and Sustainable Development Goal 11 in particular. A book titled 'The Global Goals' reports on UiTM's SDG activities from 2019 to 2021. In relation to Global Goal 11, UiTM

also has 102 research consultancy projects worth RM5 million, 268 research grants, and a total of 101 copyright protections.

SDGTriangle@UiTM was also established and UiTM members conducted research activities at 4 prominent locations, namely Taman Negara Pahang; Taman Negara Ledang, Johor, Royal Belum, Perak; and Pulau Tuba, Kedah. A total of RM2 million was allocated to UiTM researchers to conduct 116 research projects in support of SDG 11. Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Research @ Borneo was also established to support Global Goals 11 in various research activities in collaboration with other universities in the Borneo archipelago.

UiTM researchers also participated in the Kajian Indeks Keselamatan Sempadan Negara (IKSN) and Kajian Indeks Keselamatan Kebangsaan (IKK) linked to SDG 11.

This is one of the indicators of UITM's success in supporting the sustainable development agenda in the community. It is therefore not surprising that UITM was recently listed among the top 101 - 200 institutions in the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings 2022.

I also hope that all UiTM staff will support the '1 Staff with 1 Publication as Corresponding Author' plan. We hope to reach the target of 3,800 journal publications and 4,700 conference proceedings this year.

Through these various achievements and initiatives, I am confident that the TNCPI office will continue to contribute to the sustainable development agenda for cities and communities in Malaysia.

Prof. TPr. Dr. Jamalunlaili Abdullah said that the sustainability of cities and communities is a state where a high level of social, economic, and physical development is achieved and sustainable for the next generation. I agree with Prof. TPr. Dr. Jamalunlaili Abdullah that a sustainable city must ensure the safety of its residents in the event of disasters as declared by the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat). UN-Habitat is mandated by the United Nations to promote socially and environmentally sustainable cities and communities with the aim of creating adequate housing for all.

I also agree that people need to be made aware that urban planning, urban sustainability, and community



sustainability require public participation. A sense of belonging and ownership is essential for the development of a harmonious community.

I am also pleased that the Faculty of Architecture, Planning and Surveying has ensured that its teaching and learning programme covers the urban sustainability component, whether it is "design-based" or "non-design-based".

In addition, all academic programmes in the Faculty of Architecture, Planning and Surveying are accredited by various professional organisations, such as the Board of Architects Malaysia and the Board of Town Planners, among others. The faculty was also recognised by UiTM Technoventure as the faculty that achieved the highest consultancy value in UiTM in 2021.

I hope that the Faculty will continue to be the driving force in the implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 11 in this country, especially with regard to sustainable building and master plan design, construction projects that include waste reduction and cost reduction as well as the circular economy aspect, the maintenance of sustainable buildings, affordable housing and much more. I also believe that the faculty's plan to collaborate with other stakeholders in the field of agriculture and the smart city will make UiTM widely known.

Well done to both invited panellists and everyone at UiTM. n 4 July, we learned about the flash floods in Lembangan Sungai Kupang and Sungai Tiak in Baling, Kedah. According to a statement by the Prime Minister on 5 July, this disaster claimed three lives (Al-Fatihah and deepest condolences to the victims) and affected a total of 1,490 people, including 112 heads of households (KIR). Three temporary evacuation centres (PPS) were opened, namely PPS SMK Jerai, PPS Surau An-Nur, and PPS SMK Agama Al-Khiriah

We knew that the victims of the Baling flash flood needed immediate help and support. Therefore, UiTM

Kedah Branch came as early as 5 July to mobilise its volunteers. Then on 7 July, we dispatched an additional team of volunteers from four campuses, namely Shah Alam, Penang, Kedah, and Perlis, for two days as part of the KPT Prihatin - UiTM Post-Flood Relief Mission We hope to help the residents affected by the flash flood through the clean-up work involving UiTM staff and volunteers.

This flood tragedy showed me the real situation and the challenges faced by the victims in Baling. Life is full of ups and downs, and our hardships can sometimes feel endless There are several passages

in the Qur'an where Allah talks about the different types of trial we have

to go through, but He also gives us a package of help to get through these tough times. Nothing happens except by the will of Allah. Despite all they have been through, I can see that the people of Baling can accept these trials and difficulties with a "life goes on" spirit. As a lesson from this, I would like the UiTM Council of Professors to be aware of its role beyond the boundaries of academia and research.

We should be prepared at all levels for the challenges we might face because we are responsible to the religion.



oncology medicine, geriatrics, forensic medicine, mental health, rehabilitation, and dialysis. These will surely drive this hospital toward becoming a "Premier Teaching Hospital."

Tengku Permaisuri Norashikin will be a pro-chancellor for the period from 18 October, 2021 to 17 October, 2024.



t the 24th session of the 93rd UiTM Convocation, which took place on 28 June 2022, I expressed my appreciation and gratitude for the commitment and cooperation of 590 staff comprising various committees at UiTM Shah Alam. In view of the current rising cost of living, the YB Minister of Higher Education on July 4 decided to introduce a moratorium on rent payments to operators and food providers on the campuses of public higher learning institutions for six (6) months from July 2022.


Hence, yesterday I visited Dataran Cendekia and Menara SAAS to look at food prices and talk to students. Cafe owners in all 35 UiTM branches will be offered two alternatives:-

(a) Moratorium on the renting of the premises for (6) six months if they comply with the maximum rate of RM3.50 for each quality meal served to students; or

(b) Sale of meals at the maximum rate set by the UiTM but without the benefit of the moratorium. At the same time, I directed the Food Monitoring Committee to investigate and submit a plan for the introduction of an RM3.50 quality meal menu. Previously, the UiTM Standing Finance Committee had set a maximum price for each meal sold on campus, ranging from RM5.00 to RM6.50.

Meanwhile, UITM is very grateful for the announcement by the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) to continue with the initiative to provide free meal vouchers to B40 students in higher education institutions. Food@Campus Keluarga Malaysia 2.0 was funded by the Yayasan Kebajian Siswa Keluarga Malaysia (YKS) and provides packaged food to UITM students. In addition, UITM continues to receive support from industry partners and through its nationwide network of alumni.

I am concerned about this situation and hope that the measures taken will help underprivileged students to ensure that their learning sessions are not affected by the impact of rising prices of goods in Malaysia. This moratorium will also serve to reduce the operating and commodity costs of food premise operators on the UITM campuses. #uitmcares ~ RT

had the opportunity to watch the film "Mat Kilau: The Rise of a Hero", inspired by the story of the struggle of a Malay warrior, Mat Kilau, his father Tok Gajah and his comrades against British colonisation. This film was made possible by the Digital Content Fund (DKD), Malaysia's National Film Development Corporation (FINAS).

I would like to thank Tuan Haji Muhamad Nizam Nordin, Registrar of UiTM, for taking the initiative to organise this session with the UiTM Executive Council, UiTM Senior Management and Officers and the Student Representative Council on 17 July.

In a subsequent session, I invited staff from the Vice-Chancellor's Office and members of the VCOSP team to a special screening of this film on 23 July. The staff of the Vice-Chancellor's Office play an important role in ensuring the smooth running of my official duties as Vice-Chancellor and provide executive secretarial services to the management. The VCOSP team is composed of academics and administrative personnel from various departments and disciplines who help to drive numerous special projects and initiatives. It focuses on empowering Bumiputera through higher education, graduate employability, staff and student welfare, global presence, rankings, sustainability, OKU (persons with disabilities), counselling, application development, and collaboration in the areas of technology, creativity, heritage, and culture, all of which contribute to achieving our common goals towards GRU2025.

This is a little reflection for those of you reading this post. The film is peppered with dialogue about Malays and Islam, about unity and the conflicts that lead to disunity. "Mat Kilau: The Rise of a Hero" awakens our minds and touches our souls through the mocking conversations of the antagonists. It reminds us all of the instability of today. The scenes shown in this film evoked feelings of anger and remorse because the Malays were portrayed in the film as if they had never been united and therefore had become weak and wanted to tear each other down. But when (the Malays) unite, even a million guns become ineffective, because unity is the strongest weapon. Quoting Surah Al-A'raf 7:128 - Moses reassured his people, "Seek Allah's help and be patient." Indeed, the earth belongs to Allah alone. He grants it to whoever He chooses of His servants. The ultimate outcome belongs only to the righteous."

The essence of this film is thus revealed in conveying a message that evokes unity and 'tawbah' (repentance) through profound conversations, thus creating a balance between 'duniawi' (worldly existence) and 'ukhrawi' (afterlife).

This is one of the mandates I have maintained to this day, giving me the strength to empower the Burniputera through education. I believe that those who accompanied me to this screening feel the same. The aim of this event is to provide a platform for the staff and team members to motivate them to achieve the goals of the university. I believe that this film provides the understanding I described earlier, as well as a self-reflection on one's identity and the importance of moving oneself, family, organisation, race, religion and country forward to ensure economic, political and social sustainability.





This year I was very honored to receive an invitation from Cambridge IFA and Hawkamah Institute of Corporate Governance to attend the Global Good Governance 3G Awards 2022, which was also held in Dubai.

At this auspicious event Universiti Teknologi MARA (UITM) was announced as recepient of the 3G SDGs Championship for facilitating digitisation as a solution and an enabler to deliver quality education beyond the borders of nations. The event was held on 18th May 2022 at the Conrad Hotel, Dubai. The 3G Awards is a premier awards programme that highlights excellence in good governance and commitment to social welfare in 3 major streams; Government & Politics, Corporate Sector and Social Sector and Philanthropy. It celebrates individuals, governments, public and private institutions, and NGOs that demonstrate governance and sustainability as a strategic priority in their organisations.

"Keluarga UiTM! this is yet another world recognition of us!" Having been established in 1956 with the mission to provide quality education to the less privileged people in underserved communities in Malaysia, UiTM had changed the lives of many by producing a myriad of professionals to fill the workforce demand from engineers to designers, simultaneously reshaping the landscape of human capital in the industry and economic capabilities of communities that it serves

ast year, UiTM ranked 101-200 out of 1,117 institutions worldwide in the THE Impact Rankings. This year, UiTM remains at the same position of 101-200, achieving an excellent score of 82.8 despite the increased participation of 1,524 institutions from around the world. Out of the total 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), 10 goals were successfully listed where UiTM performed well. Among Malaysian public universities, UiTM ranks second only to USM.

This achievement is supported by UiTM's second report under the name THE.GLOBAL.GOALS 2021, the Environmental Sustainability Report and other significant evidence. It summarises sustainability initiatives, programmes and impacts that reflect Keluarga UiTM's research, innovation, academic and community work, as well as some that involve our national and global partners.

In summary, UiTM has made progress on SDGs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 17. At the same time, performance on SDGs 7, 9 and 17 has improved. UiTM's highest performance was on SDG 17, where it improved from 48th to 42nd in the world. This performance demonstrates the excellence of UiTM in its collective efforts to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals.

SDG17 reporting rates in the areas of research, publication and education increased compared to the previous year. The Poverty Eradication Programme increased its score for SDG1 from 68.7 to 81.2 due to the University for Society initiatives, while the score for the Women's Undergraduate

Education Programme remained progressive for SDG5 and the score for the Water Resources Reuse Programme increased from 41.6 to 100. The UITM research score for SDG8 increased from 60.5 to 73.5. Our university was also successfully listed for SDG9 this time, with a research score of 98.6. Finally, for SDG10, which focuses on reducing inequality, the score for action against discrimination increased from 61.7 to 75.0.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Keluarga UiTM for their contribution to this noble agenda. I would also like to thank the Institute of Biodiversity and Sustainable Development, UiTM Green Centre, Ranking Department, GESTURZ and the team of curators who worked on documenting the publication of THE.GLOBAL.GOALS 2021.

THE Impact Rankings measures institutional initiatives and impact in achieving the Global Sustainability Goals as set by the United Nations (UN). At UITM, sustainability activities and initiatives on and off campus are in line with the GRU2025 strategic plan, which has been aligned with national and global visions.

The aim of this initiative is to communicate the importance of planning, executing and evaluating results, as this is a never-ending responsibility. I therefore invite everyone here to visit THE.GLOBAL.GOALS 2021. We should learn from history so that we can move forward responsibly in the name of a better life, a sustainable world and a promising future for generations to come. $\sim\!RT$
