CHAPTER 2

LITERATURE REVIEW

2.1 Introduction

This chapter discussed on the study of the process of orientation programme held by higher institution. Among the issues derived from this chapter are the overview on orientation programme held by UiTM branch Samarahan Campus and approaches used to conduct effectively of orientation programme and factors that influenced the effectiveness and efficiency of orientation programme towards new students. From history, the first freshman orientation class is pioneered by Boston College in 1888 as stated by Gardner (1986) in Bigger, (2005). According to Gardner (1986), "Reed College (Portland, OR) became the first institution to schedule an orientation course for credit when, in 1911, they offered a course separated into men-only and women only sections that met 2 hours per week for the year". As now, we can see that most of education institution around the world had conducted the orientation session for welcoming the new students. However, the high demand and requirement nowadays acquired the higher institution to develop the modern form of orientation process that can fulfil the important needs of students.

Therefore, as said by Gardner (1986) in Bigger (2005) "the importance of programs that focus on the first few weeks of college. During this period, students feel increased personal independence and form the habits and relationship they will carry throughout their college careers". Besides that, Gardner (2001) also stated that students will make judgements about their faculty and their field of study during the first few weeks. Hence, he furthered suggested that a "number of actions can improve the freshman year including curriculum modifications, enhanced academic advisement, faculty (instead of graduate students) teaching freshman level courses, continuing orientation, learning environments, peer counselling and special freshman administrative units".

CHAPTER 3

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

3.1 Introduction
