<b>Course Description</b>	This course focuses on developing students' ability to write academic texts. It provides students with a structured method for paraphrasing, summarising and organising the content of written texts. This course also enhances students' critical thinking skills to synthesise and evaluate academic texts using a standardised reference/citation format.
