Taman Tamadun Islam (TTI) is an Islamic civilisation park was built on Wan Man Island, Kuala Terengganu, in the north eastern part of Malaysia. This island which has an area of 33 hectares was previously uninhabited and filled with palm forest. This research has conducted to provide solutions to the theme park in line with the current technologies to revitalize the existing religious theme park of Taman Tamadun Islam by promoting cultural values and improve the economy of local community through smart landscape approach. # CHAPTER ONE INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Introduction

This research focuses on how to integrate smart landscape approach in the revitalizing the religious theme park to ensure the survival of the park and for it to become more ecologically sustainable. #### 1.2 Study background and context

The term "theme park" is believed came from amusement park and possibly mediaeval European fairs (Bao, 2016). In recent decades, scholarly interest in theme parks has grown significantly. A theme park can be defined as a recreational area that contains several elements and entertainment activities specifically based on certain themes that take the form of passive and active recreation. According to the local context, a theme park is a commercial recreation area that contains several entertainment and fantasy or educational, knowledge, culture, technology and so on (Garis Panduan Perancangan Pembangunan Taman Tema, 1999). The park's theme and concept can reflect their founder's personal values, as Walt Disney imagined Disneyland to be:

"A controlled society where everyone would live according to Disney doctrine, in a city free of dirt, slums and violence" (Sun & Uysal, 1994: 73)

There are several different types of theme parks, namely zoological park, water parks, linear parks, forest parks, parklet and so on. In Malaysia, various theme parks have been built with various theme such as Taman Tema Genting Highlands,
