

meritus Professor Ir Dr Mohd Azraai Kassim is currently the new Vice Chancellor of Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) for a three year term effective February 2019 to February 2022. He was born in Perak on July 15, 1958, obtained his PhD in Environmental Engineering from the University of Newcastle Upon Tyne, United Kingdom; a Master of Science in Public Health Engineering and a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering, both from the University of Manchester Institute of Science and Technology (UMIST), United Kingdom.

Emeritus Professor Ir Dr Mohd Azraai Kassim began his career in 1983 as a lecturer in the Faculty of Civil Engineering at Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), and held several senior positions at the university, including Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic and Internationalisation, from 2009 to 2012) and Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research and Innovation, from 2012-2015).

Prior to his UiTM posting, Emeritus Professor Ir Dr Mohd Azraai Kassim was the managing director and CEO of UTMSPACE, a post he had been holding since 2015. Besides his stellar academic career, Mohd Azraai is a member of several professional bodies, including the Malaysian Society for Engineering & Technology (MySET); the International Water Association (IWA) United Kingdom; the Environmental Management and Research Association of Malaysia (ENSEARCH); the Environmental Professionals Register of Malaysia (EPRM); Registered Professional Engineer, Board of Engineers Malaysia (BEM); Registered Asean Chartered Professional Engineer (ACPE); and the Harvard Business School

UiTM thank you for the global perspectives and leadership that you brought to the university and wish you all the best wherever you are.

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
UITM TO BE PART OF

UNIVERSITAS CIVIC MODERNA

(now known as Better Futures)

KUALA-LUMPUR - Universitas Civic Moderna (UCM) is a long term strategic initiative in partnership established by its founding members, Liverpool John Moores University (LJMU), UK, Shanghai Normal University (SNU), China,







Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU), USA and Universiti Teknologi MARA (UITM), Malaysia. The consortium comprises universities that were established as civic institutions committed towards community responsibility and demonstrate a clear social responsibility agenda. UCM members are dedicated towards realising the vision, mission and objectives of the consortium. This is illustrated in the network's succinct statement of purpose:

"A partnership of modern civic universities pioneering ways to enhance student success and advance sustainable development through collaboration and shared practice in intercultural education"

UCM promotes global social responsibility by creating multilateral educational exchange and volunteering opportunities for students. It intends to develop a shared understanding of the common issues facing the sustainable management of modern civic universities with an ethos of community engagement and access in the new global age. The consortium also plans to broker applied research collaboration between academic staff which focus on tackling the challenges of the 21st century. In addition, this partnership seeks to enhance the stature and profile of its member institutions.



The establishment of this consortium could lead the way in mobilising global youths for the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), similar to the work done by World Merit, who work directly with the United Nations (UN) Office of Partnerships and the Office of the Youth Envoy. UCM may well be the first group of modern civic universities to embed the SDGs fully and subsequently hold a position of prestige with the UN. The SDGs have been adopted by all member states of the UN and many global corporations. It is hoped that these initiatives will significantly capture the imagination of young global citizens when used as a framework for activities.

In addition, through this network, the mobility of students and staff will be honed through activities that emphasise humanity and the spirit of volunteerism. This is carried out to enhance and strengthen sharing and exchanging information skill sets amongst partner universities.

UiTM and LJMU co-hosted the first Inaugural Meeting of UCM at Grand Hyatt, Kuala Lumpur from 29 April to 2 May 2018. The goals of the meeting were to define the commission and objectives of the consortium, to determine the modus operandi, to establish the membership criteria as well as consider how new members may be admitted and to outline the strategy for the first three (3) years of inception.

As a result of the meeting, several signature projects have been highlighted to include Summer School projects for students from all member institutions to take place on a rotational basis at founder institutions starting with SNU in April 2019. The next significant program will be led by UiTM on Global Volunteering project for students. This project, slated for July 2019, puts forth a volunteering opportunity for students to engage in several activities with orang asli communities in Belum Rainforest and Bukit Merah, Perak. World Merit project, which is scheduled for August 2019, will be led by LJMU with its objective of exposing students to the value of joining the UN activities. Other ongoing activities, led by SCSU, include student mobility engagement, a Collaborative Study for students from member institutions as well Professional Staff Work Shadow for staff undertaking either a one or twoweek stints shadowing similar counterparts at members institutions.

Kuala-Lumpur - The Tun Abdul Razak Chair was established in 1979 and named in honour of the second Prime Minister of Malaysia, Tun Abdul Razak Hussein. The Tun Abdul Razak Chair programme at Ohio University aims to introduce and raise awareness on Malaysian history, culture, economic, social and political life in the US as well as provide a platform for knowledge exchange on global issues in Malaysia. The Chair is the first of of its kind to be established at any American University, and is housed at Ohio University's Centre for International Studies. The endowed Chair is the only one of its kind in the US and was established with funds provided by the Malaysian government, Ohio University, and several private American and Malaysian corporations.


The 10th Distinguished Tun Abdul Razak Lecture, held on 3 December 2018, and jointly organised by Ohio University (OU), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM), Yayasan Sime Darby (YSD), and Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) was supported by Fellina S.Y Muhammad Feisol. Present at the ceremony the Ministry of Education. The Lecture entitled "Synergy of Curiosity: From Acid to Art" was presented by Ohio University's esteemed faculty member, Professor John Sabraw of the College of Fine Arts. Sabraw is known for his artwork which broke new ground in the field of fine arts with the creation of paints from chemical compounds specially extracted in the process of remediating polluted streams in Ohio, USA. His paintings have appeared at the Contemporary Museum of Art, the Elmhurst Museum in Illinois and the Richard M. Ross Art Museum in Ohio.

Students present at the event were more than 1000 participants and performers, including the Tun Abdul Razak Chair Founder YABhg Tun Musa Hitam, President of Ohio University, Dr M Duane Nellis, then Vice Chancellor of UiTM, Emeritus Professor Dato' Dr Hassan Said, UiTM Professor of Education and the 14th Tun Abdul Razak Chair-Holder, Professor Dr Habibah Hj Ashari and other distinguished guests from Malaysia and the US.

In conjunction with the Lecture, a one-day workshop with Sabraw was conducted at UiTM. The workshop was attended by 40 young artists from UiTM, UPM and YSD who learned new methods and techniques of using colours derived from the scientific process of turning toxic chemicals into paint pigments created by Sabraw and Prof Guy Riefler, a Chemical Engineering professor who was also present. The workshop highlighted their initiative to use art as a vehicle to highlight environmental issues, and, in the process, help to remediate communities. These local artists produced remarkable art works as a result of the workshop, which were then exhibited and sold during the Lecture.

The organisers of the 10th Distinguished Tun Abdul Razak Lecture used this opportunity to highlight their social responsibility and contribution to the community. During the event, the National Autism Society of Malaysia (NASOM) was announced as the beneficiary of proceeds from the sale of the students' art work worth RM12,950.00. A mock check presentation ceremony was held at the Chancellery in UiTM. The then VC of UiTM Emeritus Professor Dato' Dr Hassan Said presented the check to NASOM Chairman, were representatives from all participating universities and the organising committee. The 10th Distinguished Tun Abdul Razak Lecture and related activities served to showcase the benefits of collaboration amongst universities.



FIRST Nano-Satellite in Space

Shah Alam, UiTM has created history by being the FIRST higher learning institution in the country to launch the nano-satellite, UiTMSAT-1 in space on 29 June 2018. It was built by two UiTM students in Japan from the Faculty of Electrical Engineering in collaboration with the Kyushu Institute of Technology under the Joint Global Multi-Nation (BIRDS-2) programme.

SHEFFIELD, UK - The AMRC (Advanced Manufacturing Research Centre) was established in 2001 as a collaboration between the University of Sheffield and aerospace giant Boeing, with support

from Yorkshire Forward and the European Regional Development Fund. The AMRC, with Boeing as part of the prestigious group, is a cluster of world-class centres for industryfocused research and development of technologies

used in high-value manufacturing sectors. The group has specialist expertise in machining, casting, welding, additive manufacturing, composites, designing for manufacturing, testing and training.

It has a global reputation for helping companies overcome manufacturing problems and has become a model for collaborative research involving universities, academics and industry, worldwide.

The group also includes the Nuclear AMRC, which helps UK companies win work in the civil nuclear sector and the AMRC Training Centre which provides training from apprenticeship through to doctorate and MBA level.

As part of the Internationalisation Agenda 2019, UiTM has strategically positioned itself to be among the best in advanced manufacturing research as led by the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering. A team of four delegates from UiTM visited Sheffield University in mid-April to follow up on an earlier visit by the Minister of Education Malaysia early this year.

The main objective of the visit was to initiate collaboration in advanced manufacturing with the AMRC and the Faculty of Engineering. The UiTM team was led by the Vice-Chancellor, Deputy Vice-Chancellor for Academic and International, Dean of Mechanical Engineering and the OIA Director. The two agreed outcomes revolve around research collaboration and a knowledge sharing seminar on the success story of the AMRC, University of Sheffield.







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HEIGHTEN the Visibility of UiTM in Global Education

he Asia-Pacific Association for International Education (APAIE) was established in Seoul, South Korea in 2004 by a Founding Committee consisting of thirteen university representatives from across the Asia Pacific region, and has since expanded to become a thriving association. APAIE aims to encourage greater cooperation between institutions, to enrich and support international programmes, activities and exchanges, and to promote the value of international education across the region and beyond. In doing so, APAIE devotes itself to the principles of mutual respect, diversity and collective progress. The Association also facilitates the exchange and mobility of students, staff and scholars, and the progression of academic



collaboration inter-regionally. APAIE also strives to promote best practice and policy in cooperation with various institutions and agencies, support benchmarking to advance institutions, and represent and promote the Asia-Pacific region's views on international education to the rest of the world.

The APAIE 2019 in Kuala Lumpur, the first-ever in this country, was held from 25 to 29 March 2019. The event was hosted by Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) and co-hosted by Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Universiti Malaya (UM), Management and Science University (MSU), Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP) and Universiti Tenaga Nasional (UTN) with the theme "Diversity and Inclusivity of Higher Education in the Asia Pacific". APAIE 2019, the largest academic non-medical conference in the country, brought together more than 2,500 delegates from 58 countries.

The conference was launched by Her Majesty Raja Zarith Sofiah binti AlMarhum Sultan Idris Shah Al Mutawakkil Alallahi Shah, the Permaisuri of Johor. In her keynote address, her Majesty reiterated that such conferences promote collaboration across the region and beyond. Also present were Deputy Education Minister Teo Nie Ching, Higher Education Department director-general Datin Paduka Dr Siti Hamisah Tapsir. UTM Vice-Chancellor Professor Datuk

The event brought together international education policy-makers, practitioners and experts from across the globe to the Asia Pacific region to network, improve professional skills and learn about new developments in international education. The growing attendance each year at the Conference reflects the burgeoning interest in the region and recognition of the Asia Pacific's important role in international education.

APAIE 2019 in Kuala Lumpur was attended by delegates from UiTM for the first time, led by the Vice Chancellor Prof. Ir. Dr Mohd Azraai Kassim and Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic and International), Prof Ts. Dr Haji Mohamad Kamal Haji Harun. They had the opportunity to gather and discuss diversity and inclusivity with professors and researchers, international relation officers and scholars from across the globe as well as exhibitors and delegates with wide-ranging experiences in international education. The conference also provided UiTM with a better understanding of the key issues impacting higher education in the Asia-Pacific, and especially those in the ASEAN countries.

Participation in APAIE 2019 provided UiTM with the opportunities to expand international networks and increase global visibility in line with Shift Eight Global Prominence of the Malaysia Education Blueprint 2015-2025 (Higher Education) and VC's New Year Special message 2019

to increase UiTM's global profile in Special Focus 4. With this participation, UiTM gained insights into higher education best practices from around the world which can be adopted and implemented at our beloved university. Increased collaborations with international institutions of higher learning will help UiTM conduct more research projects, increase student and staff mobility and secure international

The Faculty of Computer and Mathematical Sciences (FSKM) kicks off internationalization activities for the year 2019 through the core activity of expertise sharing. Dr Afdallyna Fathiyah Harun was invited by d.school Malaysia on 18th January 2019 to present how Design Thinking (DT) can be applied in a public service sector, particularly from the perspectives of the Ministry of Education Malaysia. The audience for this session were the representatives from the Japan Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications (Government Information Systems Planning Division, Administrative Management Bureau). At the session, Dr Afdallyna presented how she applied DT in her research work, explaining the DT process in Teaching and Learning (TnL) setting as well as showing products from the DT process comprising students' project prototypes, research output as well as ideation sessions that took place in UiTM's Smart Classroom.

Dr Azlin Ahmad shared her expertise in data analytics via The ASEAN Next 2019: Technology Driven for Community Happiness event platform from 18-22 March 2019. Hosted by the Ministry of Science and Technology (MOST), Thailand in collaboration with Hydro and Agro Informatics Institute (HAII), Dr Azlin was appointed as Key Opinion Leader for the 1st ASEAN Hydroinformatics Data Centre (AHC) which was held in conjunction with ASEAN Next 2019. Throughout the program, Dr Azlin provided her expertise and key insights on: ·

The faculty was also privileged to host four members of the National Institute of Technology, Ube College (NIT UBE) Japan for UiTM's ground visit on 13th of March 2019. The delegates were Dr Hideki Misawa, Dr Noki Nomoto, Mr Yosuke Hara and Ms Sumie Kobayashi who visited FSKM to discuss on further supervision collaboration potential following positive feedback from the previous batch of students who did their summer programme at the faculty in September 2018. The faculty was represented by Dr Norjansalika Janom (Head for Centre of Information Systems Studies), Dr Azlin Ahmad, Assoc. Prof. Dr Shuzlina Abr Rahman, Dr Azliza Mohd Ali and Pn Sofianita Mutalib. During the visit, the NIT UBE representatives were introduced to FSKM Big Data Lab, Advanced Analytics Engineering Centre (AAEC), Intelligent Information Systems Lab as well as teaching computer labs where all these facilities will serve as training centres for potential inbound students from NIT UBE.

There are other internationalisation efforts carried out by the faculty with many more planned throughout this year. This comprise activities such as research collaboration, student mobility programmes, and academic visits. 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THE KINSHIP of UiTM-Ohio University

hio University's love affair with Malaysia began at a most unlikely place. It started in Lagos, Nigeria, 1968, when two Education professors from Ohio University (henceforth OHIO) met with the then High Commissioner from Malaysia to Nigeria and Ghana, the late His Highness Tunku Jaafar Ibni Almarhum Tuanku Abdul Rahman at a cocktail party. The two professors were in Nigeria to assist in the development of the higher education sector of the newly-independent nation. Interested in their mission, the Tunku then invited the gentlemen to Malaysia to assist the also newly-independent nation in the same area. Thus began OHIO's relationship with Malaysia. After several meetings and negotiations OHIO started the BBA (Bachelor in Business Administration) at ITM in the early 70s. Several years and several hundred graduates later, OHIO established the MBA programmes, initially with ITM, then with Tenaga Nasional and the Sarawak Government. Other programmes were added to the list, Accountancy, Communication Studies and Counselling.

This was the beginning of joint programs between ITM and OHIO. Whilst most of these programmes were home-grown, ITM also began sending its lecturers and administrative staff to pursue graduate degrees at Ohio University, thanks in large part to Tan Sri Arshad Ayub, popularly known as the Father of

In the late seventies, talks began about establishing an endowed chair at Ohio University. Subsequently, the Tun Abdul Razak Chair on Malaysia and Southeast Asian Studies was established in 1981. Named in honour of the second Prime Minister of Malaysia, it is a unique and extraordinary venture in higher education. It was also the first chair to be established by a foreign government at a North

American university. The first chair-holder was Prof Dr Syed Muhammad Naguib Al-Attas who began his tenure in 1981. Since then, there have been 15 chair-holders, with Prof Dr Habibah Ashari becoming the first professor from UiTM to hold the distinguished chair, and only the second woman appointed in its 38-year existence.

The OHIO UiTM connection experienced a hiatus in the mid 90s to late 2000s as UiTM had achieved university status in 1999 and was carving its own path as a university. Then Professor Salleh Din, the 13th chair-holder, (also a former ITM lecturer) brought OHIO representatives to UiTM to begin talks on joint activities. When Professor Habibah became the chair-holder in 2011, she worked

to strengthen this relationship and an MOU was signed between OHIO and UiTM to establish and conduct joint academic activities. The 9th Distinguished Tun Abdul Razak Lecture, which featured the late His Excellency Dr. Surin Pitsuwan (former Secretary General of ASEAN) as its Distinguished Speaker was jointly organised by OHIO and UiTM in 2013. And recently, in December 2018, UiTM and other new partners were also heavily involved in the organisation and execution of the 10th Distinguished Tun Abdul Razak Lecture held at the Sime Darby Convention Centre.

Other academic activities, such as online teacher certification and online MBA programmes, staff and student exchanges and internships, are being discussed currently, specifically with the Faculty of Education and the Arshad Ayub Graduate Business School (AAGBS).

An exciting event to look forward to in November 2020, collaboratively organised by the Faculty of Education, UiTM and the College of Education, Ohio University, is the 10th International Conference on University Learning and Teaching (InCULT 2020) to be held at the Malaysian Embassy, in Washington DC, USA.

IMS stands for ASEAN International Mobility for Students, an exchange program initiated in 2009, and today AIMS is proud to collaborate with the governments of eight countries Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand, Vietnam, Philippines, Japan, Brunei and Korea.

UiTM, under the AIMS Programme, offers four types of programmes which are Food Science and Technology, Tourism Management and International Business, and a new fourth programme Language an Culture. All courses are taught in English, making it accessible and suitable for international students to come to UiTM and at the same time, having our home student go abroad to other Asian universities.

Among the regular universities that have participated under the AIMS Programme both for inbound and outbound students are Kangwon National University in Korea,

Tsukuba University in Japan, Mae Fah Luang University in Thailand, and Universitas Pendidikan Indonesia and Bogor Agricultural University, the latter two in Indonesia.

Through the collaboration of these eight countries under the establishment of AIMS Programme, more and more students not only are able to experience studying abroad, but are also exposed to different cultures, people, language and a whole new outlook on life. In addition, students under AIMS Programme are provided with some beneficial advantages such as fee waiver for tuition and accommodation, extra pocket money for self-expenses and other few interesting and exciting offers.
